'The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for "the spiritual care of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and "amend an Act for making better provision for "the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twelfth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

to say: "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend an Act "for making better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and

now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for altering the bounds of the districts of Pitsmoor and Wicker, in the county and diocese of York.

"Whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority provided in the first-recited Act, at any time or times within twelve months after the date of the licence of the minister first licensed to any separate district, constituted under the provisions of the same Act, to alter the bounds of such district, although any alteration be not required with a view to the constituting of another separate district; provided always, that the scheme for making any such alteration shall be subject to all the provisions relating to schemes for constituting separate districts under the said firstrecited Act; and that any portion of any such separate district, which by any such alteration as aforesaid shall become detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to, and form part of, the parish, chapelry, or district out of which such portion was taken, upon such separate district being originally constituted, or to and of any new district, as shall be determined by the like authority:

"And whereas the said districts of Pitsmoor and Wicker were duly constitued out of the chapelry of Attercliffe, in the parish of Sheffield, in the said county and diocese of York, under the provisions of the said first-recited Act, by a scheme prepared by us, and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the eighth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and since duly gazetted:

"And whereas it has since been represented to us, and appears to us to be expedient, that the bounds of such districts should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned :

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward Archbishop of York, testimony whereof he has signed and in sealed this scheme, that the imaginary line forming the boundary between the said districts of Pitsmoor and Wicker shall be altered as follows; that is to say, instead of extending along the whole length of Rock-street, as appears by the said scheme, such imaginary line shall only extend along the middle of such street to a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) opposite to the middle of Marcus-street, and thence towards the north west along the middle of such last-mentioned street, as far as Fox-street, and thence towards the south west along the middle of such last-mentioned street, as far as a certain street or road called Pye-bank, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such street or road, and of Bridge Houses, to the Iron Bridge over the river Dun.

"And we further recommend and propose, that the portion of the said district of Pitsmoor, which, by reason of such alteration as aforesaid, shall become detached and excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, belong to, and form part of, the said district of Wicker.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas due notice of the said scheme has been given in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.
