Hamburgh, Ang. 31. The Letters from Leopel of the 9th Initiantotell us, that the Polith 4 rmy was marched from Guiniari towards the Ni fler: That it was faid their defign was to attack Miedzibos; and that the Crown General had been informed by fome Prifoners he took, that a great Body of Tartars commanded by their Cham, was marching to joyn with 12000 Turks, in order to make head against the Poles.
