east and north by the remaining part of the parish of Rickmansworth, from which the district is separated by a line commencing at the point where the boundary line of the parish of Harefield crosses the lane at Drayton-ford, and passing up the middle of that lane enters the road leading to Rickmansworth; it then turns westerly along the middle of that road as far as Long-lane; and then up the middle of that lane north westerly as far as the fence at the eastern corner of the property of R. E. Arden, Esq.; it then proceeds in a south westerly direction from that point along the south eastern fences of the property of the said R. E. Arden, Mr. William Putnam, and Feargus O'Cornor, Esq.; it then proceeds in a north westerly direction along the south western fence of the property of the said Feargus O'Connor, and of the south eastern and southern fences of the property of James Weld, Esq. and enters the road from Chalfont Saint Peter to Rickmansworth, and passes along the middle of that road in a southerly and westerly direction as far as the said parish of Chalfont Saint Peter, as such district is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink:

"That banus of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said church of Saint Thomas, at West Hyde aforesaid; and that all the fees arising therefrom should be reserved for, on account of, and paid to, the present Vicar of the said parish of Rickmansworth during his incumbency thereof, but upon his avoidance of the vicarage of the said parish, the said fees should belong and be paid to the Minister for the time being of the said church of Saint Thomas, at West Hyde aforesaid:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend George Lord Bishop of Rochester has been obtained thereto, as required by the before mentioned Act and section; in testimony whereof, the said George Lord Bishop of Rochester has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend" and render more effectual an Act, passed in "the last session of Parliament, for building, "and promoting the building, of additional "churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fourth day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, viz.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Cannock, in the county of Stafford, and within the diocese of Lichfield, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the church recently erected and consecrated at Great Wyrley, in the said parish, and called Saint Mark's Church, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more " effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Par-" liament, for building, and promoting the building. " of additional churches in populous parishes," as enlarged and extended by the twelfth section
