Foreign-Office, November 16, 1846.

Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from Mr. Southern, Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Lisbon, a dispatch, inclosing a note addressed to him by Marshal Saldanha, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs of Her Most Faithful Majesty, announcing the establishment of an effective blockade of the river Douro, together with a copy of the decree declaring the said blockade.

Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires also transmits a note from Marshal Saldanha, announcing that positive instructions had been given to the ships of war establishing the blockade, to allow British ships of war to enter the port unmolested, and not to prevent the delivery, and reception there, of the mails conveying the correspondence, or the landing of passengers, or even the departure of British subjects who may wish to embark in the packets.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late

Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the reports of "the Commissioners appointed to consider the "state of the Established Church in England and "Wales, with reference to ccclesiastical duties "and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Eccelesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for determining the income of the Bishop of Saint Asaph.

"Whereas it is in the preamble to the said Act recited, that the Commissioners therein mentioned had presented to His late Majesty certain reports, containing amongst others the following recommendations, that is to say, that the sees of Saint Asaph and Bangor should be united, and that, in order to provide for the augmentation of the incomes of the smaller bishopricks such fixed annual sums be paid to the Commissioners, out of the revenues of the larger sees respectively as should upon due inquiry and consideration be determined on so as to leave as an average annual income to the Archbishop of Canterbury fifteen thousand pounds, to the Archbishop of York ten thousand pounds, to the Bishop of London ten thousand pounds, to the Bishop of Durham eight thousand pounds. to the Bishop of Winchester seven thousand pounds, to the Bishop of Ely five thousand five hundred pounds, to the Bishop of Saint Asaph and Bangor five thousand two hundred pounds, and to the Bishop of Worcester and Bath and Wells, respectively, five thousand pounds, and that out of the fund thus accruing fixed annual payments be made by the Commissioners in such

instances and to such amount as should be in like manner determined on, so that the average annual incomes of the other bishops respectively be not less than four thousand pounds, nor more than five thousand pounds:

"And whereas it is by the same Act, amongst other things, enacted, that we shall, from time to time, prepare and lay before your Majesty in Council such schemes as shall appear to us to be best adapted for carrying into effect the therein-before recited recommendations, and shall in such schemes recommend and propose such measures as may upon further inquiry, which we are thereby authorized to make, appear to us to be necessary for carrying such recommendations into full and perfect effect:

"And whereas the see of Saint Asaph became vacant on the thirteenth day of September now last past, and the provision for uniting the said two sees not having yet come into operation, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to nominate a bishop to succeed to the said vacant see, but his appointment thereto is not yet completed:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us, upon inquiry duly made by us, that the existing average annual income of the said see of Saint Asaph is six thousand pounds, and we are of opinion that the sum of four thousand two hundred pounds would be a suitable average annual income for a bishop of Saint Asaph:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that the bishop appointed to the said see, and his successors bishops of Saint Asaph, shall pay, or cause to be paid, to our credit into the Bank of England, to an account intituled " Account with the Ecclesiastical Commissioners " for England," the fixed annual sum of one thousand eight hundred pounds, by equal halfyearly payments, on the thirteenth day of March and the thirteenth day of September in every year, the first of such payments to be made on the thirteenth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and that upon any vacancy of the same see happening on any other day than one of such half-yearly days then the next half-yearly payment shall be apportioned and paid between and by the bishop making the vacancy, or his representatives, and the bishop succeeding to the said see.

And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act, or any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Saint Asaph.

HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to further amend the Church Building Acts," as enlarged and extended by the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " for the further amendment of the Church "Building Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-second day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, on the thirteenth day of September one thousand eight hundred and fortythree, your Majesty's said Commissioners, with the approbation of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Lord Bishop of London, made a representation to your Majesty in Council, that it appeared to them to be expedient and humbly praying, that a particular district, under the provisions of the sixtcenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more " effectual an Act, passed in the last session of " Parliament, for building, and promoting the " building, of additional churches in populous " parishes," should be assigned to the consecrated church, called Saint Paul's Church, situate in Wilton-place, in the parish of Saint George, Hanover-square, in the county of Middlesex, and within the diocese of London, and that such district should be named, " The Chapelry District of Saint Paul, Wilton-place," and consist of part of the said parish, and should be bounded as follows:

"On the north by Hyde-park, from Hydepark-corner to the point where it meets the parish of Chelsea; on the west and south by the said parish of Chelsea, as far as Commercial-place, along the middle of which the boundary proceeds easterly to the Commercial-road, and then in a northerly direction up the middle of that road, and crossing from the end thereof into the end of Avery-farmrow, up the middle of which it proceeds as far as Little Ebury-street; it then proceeds in a north westerly direction, along the middle of Little Ebury and Coleshill streets, until it enters the King's-road, along the middle of which it proceeds in a north easterly direction as far as Upper Eccleston-street; it then proceeds in a north westerly direction, up the middle of that street, until it enters Belgrave-square; and then crosses that square in a northerly direction to Halkinstreet; it then proceeds up the middle of that street in a north easterly direction until it enters Grosvenor-place, and then up the middle of Grosvenor-place to Hyde-park-corner, where the boundary commenced, as was shewn by the plan annexed to the said representation, and was thereon coloured blue:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that by an Order in Council, dated the second of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, your Majesty was graciously pleased, by and with the advice of your Privy Council, to approve of such district being assigned, and also to order that the same should be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that a description of the boundaries of such district was duly enrolled in your Majesty's High Court of Chancery, on the twenty-fifth day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-three:

" Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that, having taken into consideration the present circumstances of the said district, it appears to them to be expedient, that the boundaries thereof should be altered, under and by virtue of the provisions contained in the sixth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to "further amend the Church Building Acts," as enlarged and extended by the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your reign, intituled " An Act for the further amend-" ment of the Church Building Acts," and that the boundaries of such district should hereafter be as follow, that is to say:

" On the north by Hyde-park, from Hydepark-corner to the point where it meets the parish of Upper Chelsea; on the west and south by the said parish of Upper Chelsea and the river Thames; and on the east the boundary is formed by proceeding from the river Thames, in a northerly direction, up the middle of the Grosvenor Canal, as far as the Wooden-bridge; it then proceeds from the said Wooden-bridge, in a north westerly direction, along the middle of the road in front of Kemp's-row, as far as Avery-farm-row, up the middle of which it proceeds to Ebury-square, which it crosses to Little Ebury-street; it then proceeds in a north westerly direction along the middle of Little Ebury-street and Coleshill-street, until it enters the King's-road, along the middle of which it proceeds in a north easterly direction as far as Upper Eccleston-street; it then turns in a north westerly direction, up the middle of that street,

until it enters Belgrave-square, and then crosses that square, in a northerly direction, to Halkinstreet; it then proceeds up the middle of that street, in a north easterly direction, until it enters Grosvenor-place, and then up the middle of that place to Hyde-park-corner, where the boundary commenced, as the same district is more particularly delineated on the map or plan thereof hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured blue:

" That the consent of the said Charles-James Lord Bishop of London, as bishop of the diocese, and also as the patron, in right of his see, of the church of, the district parish of Saint Peter, Pimlico (within the ecclesiastical limits of which the said chapelry district of Saint Paul, Wilton-place, is situate, and which said district parish is a portion of and was divided off, under the provisions of the Church Building Acts, from the said parish of Saint George, Hanoversquare, by an Order of His late Majesty King William the Fourth in Council, bearing date the twenty-eighth of June one thousand eight eight hundred and thirty, and also the consent of the Reverend Thomas Fuller, as the incumbent of the said district parish of Saint Peter, Pimlico, have been severally obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section secondly hereinbefore referred to; in testimony whereof, the said Charles James Lord Bishop of London and Thomas Fuller have signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the boundaries of the said chapelry district, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Paddington, in the county of Middlesex, and within the diocese of London, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned, under and by virtue of the power for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to amend and render more effectual an " Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, " for building, and promoting the building, of " additional churches in populous parishes." to the consecrated church, called Trinity Church, situate in Bishop's-road, in the said parish of Paddington, and that such district should be called, " The Chapelry District of the Holy Trinity, Paddington," and be bounded as hereinafter mentioned:

"The chapelry district of the Holy Trinity, Paddington, commences at the south end of the Paddington Canal, at the point marked A on the map or plan hereinafter referred to, and proceeds in a north westerly direction, along the towing-path of the said canal, as far as the first brick-bridge over the said canal in the Harrow-road, and continues in the same direction, along the north east side of the said canal, to the bridge over the Regent's Canal; and from thence in a straight line in a north westerly direction, along

the centre of an intended road, to be called the Warwick-road, and continued on to the point marked B on the said map or plan where it meets the boundary line of the parishes of Paddington and Willesden; and from thence in a south westerly direction, along such boundary, to the point marked C on the said map; and from thence in a straight line in a south westerly direction to the Harrow-road, to the point marked D on the said map opposite the entrance of the Old Green-lane leading to Westbourne; it then proceeds southerly, and crossing the Grand Junction Canal, continues along the lane as far as the bridge over the Great Western Railway; and proceeds in a north westerly direction, on the north side of the said railway, as far as the district parish of Saint John, Notting-hill, to the point marked E on the said map; it then proceeds southerly, along the boundary which separates the parish of Paddington from the district parish of Saint John, Notting-hill, to the point marked F on the said map, and continues eastwardly and southerly, along the said boundary, to the intersection of Westbourne-grove-road at the point marked G on the said map, along the centre of which road it prooceds eastwardly until it intersects the Queen's-road (lately called Black Lion-lane) at the point marked H on the said map; it then proceeds southerly, along the centre of the said Queen's-road, till it intersects the road called Porchester-gardens at the point marked I on the said map, along the centre of which road it proceeds in an easterly direction, crossing Porchesterroad, to the point marked K on the said map, where it intersects the street called Charles-street, along the centre of which it proceeds north eastwardly, crossing Gloucester-road, Westbourneroad, and Eastbourne-terrace, and continues in the same straight line, across the ground belonging te the Great Western Railway Company, to the said point marked A on the said map at the south end of the Paddington Canal, where the district commenced, as the same is more particularly delineated on the said map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured red:

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, and churchings should be solemnized and performed in the said church called Trinity Church; and that the fees arising therefrom should be reserved for, on account of, and paid to, the present incumbent of

the said parish of Paddington, during his incumbency thereof; but upon the first avoidance of the said parish which shall occur, the said fees should be paid and belong to the incumbent for the time being of the said church called Trinity Church:

"That the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Lord Bishop of London has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Charles James Lord Bishop of London has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publiaction of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, and churchings, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
