

the said parish of Paddington, during his incumbency thereof; but upon the first avoidance of the said parish which shall occur, the said fees should be paid and belong to the incumbent for the time being of the said church called Trinity Church :

“ That the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Lord Bishop of London has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Charles James Lord Bishop of London has signed and sealed this representation :

“ Your Majesty’s said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, and churchings, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
