The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for "the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twelfth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fortysix, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for authorizing the sale of certain property lately belonging to the prebend of Dinder, in the cathedral church of Wells.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that all the same and the like powers and rights of ownership, as are possessed and enjoyed respecting and over any lands, tenements, or other hereditaments whatsoever by any absolute owner thereof, shall be enjoyed by us with respect to and over all or any lands, tithes, rent charges, tenements, and other hereditaments vested in us under certain

Acts therein mentioned (being the Acts under which the property herein particularly mentioned is so vested in us), and may, subject to the provisions of the same Acts, and of the now reciting Act, be exercised by us by proper instruments, in writing, duly executed according to law; provided always, that none of such lands, tithes, tenements, and hereditaments as aforesaid be sold or conveyed except by the authority of a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying the same:

"And whereas the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, mentioned in the schedule hereunto annexed, lately formed a portion of the property and estates of the prebend of Dinder, in the said cathedral church of Wells, but are now vested in us by reason of the vacancy of the said prebend:

"And whereas we have made arrangements for the absolute sale of the same, subject, nevertheless, to the determination of certain leases thereof:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that we may be authorized to sell and duly to convey to the person or persons willing to purchase the same, or as he or they shall direct or appoint, for such sum or sums of money as may be agreed upon, all our estate and interest in the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments, or any part or parts thereof, according to the provisions of the said recited Act.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matter aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

### " SCHEDULE.

" All and singular the lands, tenements, and hereditaments lately belonging to the prebend of Dinder, in the cathedral church of Wells, except all tithes and commutations in lieu of tithes, if any, belonging to the said prebend."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette; pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Bath and Wells.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners YY for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better pro-"vision for the spiritual care of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend an Act for " making better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and " amend an Act for making better provision for the " spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for altering the bounds of the district of Gomersal, in the county of York, and diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority provided in the first-recited Act, at any time or times, within twelve months after the date of the portion of the said district which, by reason

the licence of the minister first licenced to any separate district, constituted under the provisions of the same Act, to alter the bounds of such district, although any alteration be not required with a view to the constituting of another separate district; provided always, that the scheme for making any such alteration shall be subject to all the provisions relating to schemes for constituting separate districts under the said first-recited Act, and that any portion of any such separate district which, by any such alteration as aforesaid, shall become detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the parish, chapelry, or district out of which such portion was taken, upon such separate district being originally constituted, or to and of any new district as shall be determined by the like authority:

" And whereas the said district of Gomersal was duly constituted out of the parish of Birstal, in the said county of York, and diocese of Ripon, under the provisions of the said first-recited Act, by a scheme prepared by us, and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of February last, and

since duly gazetted:
" And whereas the Reverend Edward Marston was duly licenced as the first minister of the said district on the twentieth day of September now

last past:

" And whereas it has since been represented to us, and appears to us to be expedient, that the bounds of such district should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, in testimony whereof he has signed and seeled this scheme, that the bounds of the said district of Gomersal shall be altered so as to exclude from such district all that part of the township of Gomersal, situate on the western side of an imaginary line, commencing at a point where the rivulet, which runs through the village of Spen, terminates in the stream which separates the said township of Gomersal from the township of Cleckheaton, and thence extending towards the north east along the bed of the said rivulet to the point (marked a on the map or plan here-unto annexed) where such rivulet first connects itself with the road in the village of Spen, and thence in a straight direction towards the north west to the centre of a certain boundary post (marked b as aforesaid) on the northern side of the Leeds and Elland turnpike road, and at a distance of four hundred and five yards, or thereabouts, from the crown and centre of Spenbridge, on the said turnpike road, and thence continuing in the same direction to the boundary between the said township of Gomersal and the township of Hunsworth; and that the said imaginary line shall henceforth form part of the boundary of the said district of Gomersal on the western side thereof.

" And we further recommend and propose, that

of the alteration hereinbefore recommended and proposed, shall become and be detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the

said parish of Birstal.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas due notice of the said scheme has been given in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.
