A PROCLAMA'TION.

HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the twelfth day of January next, We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said twelfth day of January next, to Tuesday the nineteenth day of January next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly: and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Tuesday the nineteenth day of January next, assemble and be holden for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Tuesday the nineteenth day of January next.

# PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act " for the more easy recovery of small debts and " demands in England," it is, among other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that the said Act be put in force in such county or counties as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, shall seem fit, and to divide the whole or part of any such county, including all counties of cities, and counties of towns, cities, boroughs, towns, ports, and places, liberties and franchisestherein contained or thereunto adjoining, into districts; and to order that the county court shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands, under the said Act, in each of such districts; and to declare by what name and in what towns and places the county court shall be holden in each district; and if it shall appear to Her Majesty that any part of any county, liberty, city, borough, or district may conveniently be declared within the jurisdiction of the county court of an adjoining county, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, to order that such part shall be taken to be within the jurisdiction of the county court holden for the purposes of the said

Act for such adjoining county in and for such district as Her Majesty shall order, in like manner as if it were part of such adjoining county:

And whereas by the said Act it is also enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that any court, holden for the recovery of small debts or demands within the provisions of any Act cited in either of the schedules annexed to the said Act, and marked (A) and (B) respectively, shall be holden as a county court, and to assign a district to every such court either greater or less than the district in which the court, holden under the provisions of any such Act, has jurisdiction, and to alter the place of holding any such court, or to order that any such court be abolished:

And whereas by the said Act it is also enacted, that any Order in Council, made for the purposes of the said Act, shall be published in the London Gazette, and notice of the intention of Her Majesty to take into consideration the propriety of making any such Order shall be published in the London Gazette one calendar month at least before any such Order shall be made; and whereas Her Majesty has been pleased this day to refer the consideration of the said Act, and of the Orders which it may be proper to make for the purposes thereof, to a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and to direct that the said Committee do report their opinion thereupon to Her Majesty:

Notice is hereby given, that, after the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the publication of this notice in the London Gazette, Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, will take into consideration the propriety of making Orders for the purposes of the said Act, and for putting the said Act in execution in every county throughout England and Wales.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session holden in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to

amend the law respecting the office of county "coroner," it is enacted, that when and as often as it shall seem expedient to the justices of any county that such county should be divided into two or more districts for the purposes of that Act, or that any alteration should be made of any division theretofore made under that Act. it should be lawful for the said justices, in general or quarter sessions assembled, to resolve that a petition should be presented to Her Majesty, praying that such division or alteration be made, and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such petition until notice thereof be given to the coroner or coroners of such county as thereinafter provided; and it is thereby further enacted, that the clerk of the peace should give notice of any such resolution to every coroner for such county. and of the time when the petition would be taken by the said justices into consideration, and the justices should confer with every such coroner who should attend the meeting of the justices for that purpose touching such petition, having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district, the number of the inhabitants, the nature of their employments, and such other circumstances as should appear to the justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of that Act, and such petition, with a description of the several proposed districts, and of the boundaries thereof, with the reasons upon which the petition is founded, should be certified to Her Majesty, under the hands and seals of two or more justices present when such petition should. be agreed to, and the clerk of the peace for such county should forthwith give or send a true copy. of such petition, certified under his hand, to every coroner for such county; and it is further. enacted, that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, if she should think fit, with the advice of Her Privy Council, after taking into consideration any such petition which might be presented to Her by any coroner of the same county concerning such proposed division or alteration, or whenever it should seem fit to Her Majesty. to direct the issue of a writ de coronatore eligendo, for the purpose of authorizing the election of an additional coroner above the number of those who had been theretofore customarily elected to such county, to order that such county should be divided into such and so many districts, for the

purposes of that Act, as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, should seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts, and to determine at what place within each district the court for the election of coroner for such district should be holden, as thereinafter provided, and every such Order should be published in the London Gazette; and whereas the justices of the peace of the county of Cumberland, assembled in general quarter sessions on the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, did resolve that a petition should be presented to Her Majesty, praying for such division or alteration as thereinafter mentioned, and did adjourn the further consideration thereof until their general quarter sessions to be holden, at Carlisle, on the first of July then next; due notice thereof having been given to the coroners of the said county, and two of the justices, attending such general quarter sessions, did thereby certify, under their hands and seals, that such petition was agreed to; and whereas the said justices have since presented their petition to Her Majesty, representing that, in and by an Act of Parliament, made and passed in the eighth year of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend " the law respecting the office of county coroner," it was enacted, that when and as often as it should seem expedient to the justices of any county that such county should be divided into two or more districts for the purposes of the said Act, it should be lawful for the said justices, in general or quarter sessions assembled, to resolve that a petition should be presented to Her Majesty, praying that such division should be made, and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such petition until notice thereof should be given to the coroners of such county, in the manner in the said Act provided; that the petitioners, in pursuance of the power given to them in and by the said Act, at their last Michaelmas quarter sessions, did resolve, that a petition should be presented to Her Majesty, praying that the said county of Cumberland should be divided into two districts for the purposes of the said Act, and did thereupon adjourn the further consideration of such petition to their general quarter sessions to be holden, at Carlisle, on the first day of July then next; that notice of such resolution, and of the time when the petition would be taken by the


