#### Buckingham-Palace, January 19, 1847.

THIS day Her Majesty, accompanied by His Royal Highness Prince Albert, proceeded in state from Buckingham-Palace to the House of Peers, where she arrived soon after two o'clock; and was received, on alighting from her state coach, by the Lord Chancellor, the Lord President of the Council, the Lord Privy Seal, Sir Augustus Clifford, Bart. C. B. Deputy Great Chamberlain (in the absence of Lord Willoughby D'Eresby), the Lord Steward of the Household, the Duke of Wellington, Garter King of Arms, and the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, and proceeded to the robing-room in the customary manner.

Her Majesty was there robed, and the procession moved into the House in the usual order;—the sword of state was borne by the Duke of Wellington, and the cap of maintenance by the Marquess of Winchester.

Her Majesty being seated on the Throne, and His Royal Highness Prince Albert on a Chair on the left side of the Cloth of Estate, the Great Officers of State and others standing on the right and left, James Pulman, Esq. Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a message from Her Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, Her Majesty was pleased to deliver the following most gracious Speech to both Houses of Parliament:

#### My Lords, and Gentlemen,

IT is with the deepest concern that upon your again assembling I have to call your attention to the dearth of provisions which prevails in Ireland and in parts of Scotland.

In Ireland especially the loss of the usual food of the people has been the cause of severe sufferings, of disease, and of greatly increased mortality among the poorer classes. Outrages have become more frequent, chiefly directed against property; and the transit of provisions has been rendered unsafe in some parts of the country.

With a view to mitigate these evils very large numbers of men have been employed, and received wages, in pursuance of an Act passed in the last session of Parliament. Some deviations from that Act, which have been authorized by the Lord Lieutenant in order to promote more useful employment, will, I trust, receive your sanction. Means have been taken to lessen the pressure of want in districts which are most remote from the ordinary sources of supply. Outrages have been repressed, as far as it was possible, by the military and police.

It is satisfactory to me to observe, that in many of the most distressed districts the patience and resignation of the people have been most exemplary.

The deficiency of the harvest in France and Germany, and other parts of Europe, has added to the difficulty of obtaining adequate supplies of provisions.

It will be your duty to consider what further measures are required to alleviate the existing distress. I recommend to you to take into your serious consideration whether, by increasing for a limited period the facilities for importing corn from foreign countries, and by the admission of sugar more freely into breweries and distilleries, the supply of food may be beneficially augmented.

I have likewise to direct your earnest consideration to the permanent condition of Ireland. You will perceive, in the absence of political excitement, an opportunity for taking a dispassionate survey of the social evils which afflict that part of the United Kingdom. Various measures will be laid before you, which, if adopted by Parliament, may tend to raise the great mass of people in comfort, to promote agriculture, and to lessen the pressure of that competition for land which has been the fruitful source of crime and misery.

The marriage of the Infanta Luisa Fernanda of Spain to the Duke of Montpensier has given rise to a correspondence between my Government and those of France and Spain.

The extinction of the Free State of Cracow has appeared to me to be so manifest a violation of the treaty of Vienna that I have commanded that a protest against that act should be delivered to the Courts of Vienna, Petersburg, and Berlin, which were parties to it. Copies of these several papers will be laid before you.

I entertain confident hopes that the hostilities in the river Plate which have so long interrupted commerce may soon be terminated, and my efforts, in conjunction with those of the King of the French, will be earnestly directed to that end.

My relations generally with Foreign Powers inspire me with the fullest confidence in the maintenance of peace.

#### Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

I have directed the estimates to be prepared with a view to provide for the efficiency of the public service with a due regard for economy.

#### My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I have ordered every requisite preparation to be made for putting into operation the Act of the last session of Parliament for the establishment of local courts for the recovery of small debts. It is my hope that the enforcement of civil rights in all parts of the country to which the Act relates may, by this measure, be materially facilitated.

I recommend to your attention measures which will be laid before you for improving the health of towns, an object the importance of which you will not fail to appreciate.

Deeply sensible of the blessings which, after a season of calamity, have been so often vouchsafed to this nation by a superintending Providence, I confide these important matters to your care, in a full conviction that your discussions will be guided by an impartial spirit, and in the hope that the present sufferings of my people may be lightened, and that their future condition may be improved, by your deliberative wisdom.

W HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An " Act to amend and render more effectual an Act " passed in the last session of Parliament, for " building, and promoting the building, of ad-" ditional churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Councip a representation, bearing date the twelfth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Wirksworth, in the county of Derby, and within the diocese of Lichfield, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should

be assigned to the consecrated church, called Trinity Church, situate at Middleton, in the said parish of Wirksworth, under or by virtue of the power or authority for that purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to amend and render more effectual an " Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, " for building, and promoting the building, of " additional churches in populous parishes," and that such district should consist of the north westernmost part of the said parish, and should be named, " The Chapelry District of Middleton,' and be bounded on the north, north east, and north by the parish of Bonsall and the parochial chapelry of Winster, in the parish of Youlgreave; on the west by the parish of Brassington; on the south west and south by the Cromford and High Peak Railway, as far as the road leading from Wirksworth to Cromford; and on the east by part of the parish of Wirksworth, from which the said chapelry district of Middleton is separated by proceeding westerly from the point where the before-mentioned railway crosses the road from Cromford to Wirksworth, at the junction of the cross road leading from the said road to Middleton, along which road it proceeds as far as a footpath leading from Wirksworth to Bonsall, up which footpath it proceeds northerly till it reaches the road leading from Cromford to Bonsall, then northwesterly along the middle of that road as far as the parish of Bonsall, as such district is more particularly delineated on the map or plan thereof hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink :

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said church, called Trinity Church, at Middleton aforesaid; and that all the fees to arise therefrom should be reserved for, on account of, and paid to the present Vicar of the said parish of Wirksworth during his incumbency of such parish, but that, upon his avoidance thereof, the said fees should belong to the Minister for the time being of the said church, at Middleton aforesaid:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend John Lord Bishop of Lichfield has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section herein-

before mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said John Lord Bishop of Lichfield has signed and sealed this present representation :

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

#### PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the provisions of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further amend-"ment of the church building Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of November one thousand eight hundred and fortysix, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration

all the circumstances of the parishes of Netherbury and Poorstock, otherwise Powerstock, in the county of Dorset, and within the diocese of Salisbury, it appears to them to be expedient to unite and consolidate certain contiguous parts of the said parishes of Netherbury and Poorstock, and to form the same into one consolidated chapelry for the consecrated church, called Christ Church, situate at Melplaish, in the said parish of Netherbury, for all ecclesiastical purposes, under the provisions of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further amendment of the church "building Acts;" and that such consolidated chapelry should be called, ' The Consolidated Chapelry of Melplaish,' and should consist of the easternmost part of the parish of Netherbury, and the north westernmost part of the parish of Powerstock, as also a detached portion of the latter parish marked No. 246 (a) on the tithe commutation map of the said parish, and which portion is entirely surrounded by the parish of North Poorton; and that such consolidated chapelry should be bounded on the north by the parishes of Beaminster, Mapperton, and North Poorton; on the north east by the said parish of North Poorton; and on the east by the remaining part of the parish of Powerstock, from which it is separated by proceeding from the said parish of North Poorton, in a south westerly direction, along the middle of the lane leading from North Poorton to Milton, as far as the southern angle of the field marked on the said tithe commutation map No. 289; thence northerly up the middle of the lane which separates the western side of that field from the easternmost angle of field No. 307, it then proceeds south westerly along the south easternmost sides of the said field No. 307, and field No. 311, it then turns northerly up the lane called Milton-lane, to the southern fence of field No. 310; thence westerly along the southern fence of that field as far as the boundary line which separates the parish of Netherbury from the parish of Powerstock, along which boundary it then proceeds southerly until it reaches the parish of Loders, and continuing along the boundary line which separates the latter parish from the said parish of Netherbury, until it reaches the parish of Bradpole; on the south, the consolidated

chapelry is bounded by the parishes of Bradpole and Loders, as far as the south westernmost corner of field No. 1047 on the tithe commutation map of the said parish of Netherbury; and on the west by the remaining part of such lastmentioned parish, from which it is separated by proceeding northwardly along the western sides of fields Nos. 1047 and 1046, to the southern fence of field No. 1049, along which fence it proceeds westerly to the western fence thereof; then northerly up the western fence of that field; and then easterly along the northern fence of No. 1044 to the stream; thence northwards, up that stream, to the north western angle of field No. 1066, and along the northern fence thereof, to the western fence of No. 1072, up which fence it proceeds as far as Ash-lane, up the middle of which lane it then proceeds northerly, as far as the stream leading from Marless to the river Brill; thence up that stream to the south easternmost angle of field No. 947, and along the western fence thereof to Marless-lane; then along the middle of that lane until it enters Weytown-lane; then up the middle of Weytown-lane as far as Oxbridge-lane; thence easterly, along the middle of Oxbridgelane, as far as the river Brill; then north westerly up that river, to the north western angle of the fence of field No. 570, and up that fence, north easterly, to the south western corner of field No. 571; thence north westerly, up the western fences of fields Nos. 571, 572, 573, and 574, to Abbot's Barn-lane, and along the middle of that lane eastwardly, into Netherbury Field-lane; then along the middle of that lane northerly, as far as Drury-lane; then easterly, along the middle of Drury-lane, to the western fence of field No. 103; then northerly and easterly, up the western and northern fences of fields Nos. 103 and 105, as far as the parish of Beaminster, as such consolidated chapelry is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink and green:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that it has been mutually agreed between the patrons of the parish churches of the said parishes of Netherbury and Poorstock, with the approbation of your Majesty's Commissioners, and also with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Bishop of Salisbury, within whose diocese the said two parishes are situate, that the right of presentation, nomination, and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to the said church, called Christ Church, and consolidated chapelry of Melplaish, should belong to, be in, and be exercised by the said Edward Bishop of Salisbury, and by his successors, Bishops of Salisbury for ever:

" That the consents of the said Edward Bishop of Salisbury, as bishop of the diocese, and of the Honourable and Reverend Frederick Pleydell Bouverie, Prebend or Incumbent of the prebendall stall of Netherbury in Ecclesia, within the cathedral church of Saint Mary the Virgin, at Salisbury, as patron (in right of his said prebendall stall) of the parish church of Netherbury aforesaid, and of the Dean and Chapter of the said cathedral church, as the patrons of the parish church of Poorstock aforesaid, have been severally obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section before mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Edward Bishop of Salisbury and Frederick Pleydell Bouverie have, respectively, signed and sealed this representation, and the said Dean and Chapter have caused their common or chapter seal to be hereunto affixed:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Hor Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed formation into one consolidated chapelry be accordingly made, and the agreement in respect to the right of presentation, nomination, and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to the said church and consolidated chapelry be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
