WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council

a scheme, bearing date the twelfth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words and figure following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for authorizing the sale of certain property lately belonging to the deanery of Wells.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that all the same and the like powers and rights of ownership, as are possessed and enjoyed respecting and over any lands, tenements or other hereditaments whatsoever by any absolute owner thereof, shall be enjoyed by us with respect to and over all or any lands, tithes, rent charges, tenements and other hereditaments vested in us under certain Acts therein mentioned (being the Acts under which the property herein particularly mentioned is so vested in us), and may, subject to the provisions of the same Acts and of the now reciting Act, be exercised by us by proper instruments, in writing, duly executed according to law; with a proviso, that none of such lands, tithes, tenements or other hereditaments as aforesaid be sold, transferred, or conveyed except by the authority of a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council ratifying the same:

"And whereas the tithe barn and premises, described in the schedule hereunto annexed, lately formed a portion of the property and estates of the said deanery of Wells, but are now vested in us by reason of the vacancy of the said deanery:

"And whereas we have made arrangements for the absolute sale of the said tithe barn and premises, subject, nevertheless, to the determination of a certain lease thereof:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that we may be authorized to sell and duly to convey to the person or persons willing to purchase the same, or as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such sum or sums of money as may be agreed upon, all our estate and interest

“ state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage,” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirteenth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say :

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled “ An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage,” have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for fixing a certain annual payment to be made to us by the Bishop of Salisbury.

“ Whereas it was by the said Act enacted, that in order to provide for the augmentation of the incomes of the smaller bishopricks, such fixed annual sums should be paid to us out of the revenues of the larger sees respectively as should, upon due inquiry and consideration, be determined on, so as to leave as an average annual income to the archbishops and bishops therein named the respective sums therein mentioned, and that, out of the fund thus accruing, fixed annual payments should be made by us, in such instances and to such amount as should be in like manner determined on, so that the average annual incomes of the other bishops, respectively, should be not less than four thousand pounds, nor more than five thousand pounds :

“ And whereas, soon after the passing of the said Act, we proceeded to consider the circumstances of the said see of Salisbury, and came to a determination that the average annual income of five thousand pounds would be suitable to the circumstances thereof; and having also considered the information then before us respecting the actual average annual income of the said see, we were then of opinion, that no alteration need be made in the revenues thereof :

"And whereas, in pursuance of a further provision of the said Act, we did, at the expiration of the first seven years, reckoning from the first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, obtain a new return of the revenues of the said see; and it appears upon such return, that in order to preserve as nearly as may be to the future Bishops thereof the amount of income aforesaid, the following fixed annual payment should be made to us out of such revenues:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that from and after the next avoidance of the said see of Salisbury, the Bishop succeeding thereto, and his successors, shall pay, or cause to be paid to our credit, into the Bank of England, to an account intituled, "Account with the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," by equal half-yearly payments, the fixed annual sum of one thousand eight hundred and fifty pounds; the first payment to be made at the end of six calendar months from the day of such avoidance, whether the same shall happen by death, translation or otherwise; and that whenever a vacancy of the said see shall thereafter happen on any other day than the half-yearly day of payment so calculated as aforesaid, then the next half-yearly payment shall be duly apportioned and paid between and by the Bishop making the vacancy, or his representatives, and the Bishop succeeding to the said see.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matter aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."
