HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the provisions of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further amend-"ment of the church building Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twentieth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the several parishes of the said parish of Mackworth as far as the Old

Saint Werburgh, Saint Alkmund, and All Saints. situate in the town and county of the town of Derby, and within the diocese of Lichfield, it appears to them to be expedient to unite and consolidate certain contiguous parts of the said two first-mentioned parishes, and the whole of a certain detached portion of the last-mentioned parish, and to form the same into one consolidated chapelry to be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint John, situate in the said parish of Saint Werburgh, for all ecclesiastical purposes, under and by virtue of the power or authority contained in the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further amendment of the church "building Acts;" and that such consolidated chapelry should be called, "The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Derby," and be bounded as follows, that is to say:

"On the north by the liberty of Parley Abbey, in the said parish of Saint Alkmund, and part of the parish of Mackworth; on the west by part of the said parish of Mackworth; on the south by the remaining part of the said parish of Saint Werburgh, from which the said consolidated chapelry is separated by the Bramble Brook, from the said parish of Mackworth as far as the Old

Uttoxeter-road, at the point where that road [crosses the said brook, and from that point by a line drawn in a north easterly direction from the said Old Uttoxeter-road to the southern end of Larges-street, and from that street continued on to the southern end of Short-street, up the middle of Short-street; and on the east and north east the boundary is formed by proceeding in a north easterly direction to Agard-street, which street it crosses and continues north easterly in a straight line (westward of the Baptist Chapel) until it reaches the boundary line which divides the parishes of Saint Werburgh and All Saints; it then proceeds north westerly, north easterly, and again north westerly, along the said boundary line of the said two last-mentioned parishes, as far as Brook-street, along the middle of which street it proceeds north westerly to the detached portion of the parish of All Saints; it then proceeds north easterly, north westerly, and south westerly, along the boundary which separates such detached portion of All Saints' parish from the parish of Saint Alkmund, until it enters Upper Brookstreet, up the middle of which street it then proceeds north westerly to the end thereof; and from thence proceeds in a north easterly and north westerly direction, along the enclosure of the field called or known as 'the Nuns,' till it meets the boundary of the parishes of Saint Werburgh and Saint Alkmund, along which boundary it then proceeds westerly and northerly as far as the said liberty of Darley Abbey on the north, where the boundary commenced, as such proposed consolidated chapelry is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink, green, and yellow:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg further to represent, that it has been mutually agreed between the patrons of the parish churches of the said three parishes of Saint Werburgh, All Saints, and Saint Alkmund, with the approbation of your Majesty's said Commissioners, and also with the consent of the Right Reverend John Lord Bishop of Lichfield, within whose diocese the said three parishes are situate, that the right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to serve the said church and consolidated chapelry of Saint John, Derby, should belong to, and, when occasion may require, be exercised by the Vicar for the time

being of the said parish of Saint Werburgh, Derby:

" That the consents of the said John Lord Bishop of Lichfield, as bishop of the diocese, and of the Right Honourable Charles Christopher Baron Cottenham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and as such patron on behalf of your Majesty of the vicarage or parish church of Saint Werburgh aforesaid, the value of which vicarage is entered in your Majesty's book as being under twenty pounds per annum, and also the consents of the Reverend William Marsh, of Leamington, in the county of Warwick, Doctor in Divinity, the Reverend William Carus Wilson, of Castertonhall, in the county of Westmoreland, Clerk, the Reverend William Carus, of Trinity College, Cambridge, Clerk, the Reverend John Venn, of the city of Hereford, Clerk, and the Venerable George Hodson, Archdeacon of Stafford, as the several patrons, in trust, of the parish church of All Saints, Derby aforesaid, and of Jedediah Strutt, of Belper, in the said county of Derby, Esq. as patron of the vicarage or parish church of Saint Alkmund, Derby aforesaid, have been severally obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said John Lord Bishop of Lichfield. Charles Christopher Baron Cottenham, William Marsh, William Carus Wilson, William Carus, John Venn, George Hodson, and Jedediah Strutt have severally signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed formation into one consolidated chapelry be accordingly made, and the agreement, in respect to the right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to serve the said church and consolidated chapelry, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parishes of Sandbach and Warmingham, in the county and diocese of Chester, it appears to them to be expedient to unite certain contiguous parts of the said parishes, and to form the same into one consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, for the consecrated church of Saint Peter, situate at Elworth, otherwise Ettiley-heath, in the said parish of Sandbach, under the provisions of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the " further amendment of the church building Acts:" and that such consolidated chapelry should be named, "The Consolidated Chapelry of Elworth," and be bounded as follows, that is to say, the boundary of the said consolidated chapelry of Elworth commences at the Grand Trunk Canal, opposite to the road leading from Taylor's cottage, on the road leading from Sandbach to Middlewich, called Booth-lane, and following the eastern bank of the said canal till it reaches Stud-green-bridge; it then crosses the canal, and proceeds along the boundary of the townships of Tetton and Moston, till it meets a lane leading to the Crow Nestbridge; it then proceeds along the middle of the said lane till it reaches the canal; it then continues along the western side of the said canal till it reaches the boundary of Moston and Elton townships, which it follows in a south westerly direction till it reaches the road leading from Moston to

the Moss-bridge, up the middle of which road it proceeds two hundred and thirty-four yards, and crossing by the garden fence to the south of Barlow's cottage, it reaches a lane, up the middle of which it proceeds easterly, till it reaches a fence leading southerly along the back of Turner's premises; it then again turns easterly till it reaches the canal, which it follows on its western or towing path side till it reaches a footpath leading to Red-lane, which it follows, and proceeds along the middle of the said lane, till it reaches the garden fence of Thompson's cottage; proceeds then along the western side of Red-lane, so as to include all houses abutting thereon till it reaches the garden fences at the back of Wilson's cottage, which it follows till it again meets the Red-lane, down to the middle of which it proceeds, till it reaches the road leading to the Rookery-bridge from Elton ; it then follows the south side of the said road towards Elton, till it meets a watercourse, and then turning in a south easterly direction, it follows a fence, over which the Manchester and Birmingham Railway passes, till it meets the boundary of the townships of Sandbach and Elton; along which it then proceeds crossing the canal till it reaches the Sandey-road; up the middle of which it proceeds as far as the turnpike gate in the Sandbach and Middlewich-road; and from thence easterly along the middle of that road, as far as Rithin-lane footpath, which it follows till it reaches Cooksenorlane; along the middle of which lane it proceeds south easterly till it enters the road leading to Bradwall; it then proceeds northerly up the middle of the said road until it reaches the boundary line which separates the township of Sandbach from the township of Bradwall; along which boundary it then proceeds easterly and south easterly until it reaches the boundary line which separates the said township from the parish of Brereton; it then proceeds along that boundary line, in a northerly and north westerly direction till it meets the parish of Middlewich; and then continues westerly and south westerly along the boundary line, separating the township of Bradwall from the parish of Middlewich until it meets the boundary line separating the said township from the parish of Warmingham; along which boundary it then proceeds southerly until it comes to a point near a road leading from Dale Acre to Taylor's cottage; along the middle of which road it proceeds south westerly passing Taylor's cottage, to the point where the boundary of the said consolidated chapelry of Elworth commenced, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan thereof hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured yellow and green:
