Almighty God, in order to obtain pardon of Our sins, and may, in the most devout and solemn manner, send up Our prayers and supplications to the Divine Majesty, for the removal of those heavy judgments which Our manifold sins and provocations have most justly deserved, and under which We at this present time labour; and We do strictly charge and command, that the said public Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving subjects in England and Ireland, as they tender the favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His wrath and indignation; and upon pain of such punishment as may be justly inflicted on all such as contemn and neglect the performance of so religious and necessary a duty. And, for the better and more orderly solemnizing of the same, We have given directions to the Most Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England and Ireland, to compose a Form of Prayer, suitable to this occasion, to be used in all churches, chapels, and places of public worship; and to take care the same be timely dispersed through their respective dioceses.

Our will is, therefore, and We charge, that this Our Proclamation seen, ye forthwith proceed to the Market Cross of Edinburgh, and all other places needful, and there, in Our name and authority, make publication hereof, that none pretend ignorance; and Our will and pleasure is, that Our Solicitor do cause printed copies hereof to be sent to the Sheriffs of the several shires, Stewards of stewartries, and Bailiffs of regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to see the same published; and We do appoint them to send copies hereof to the several-parish churches within their bounds, that,

upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the day above mentioned, the same may be published and read from the pulpits, immediately after Divine Service.
