What We now say, as well as what We shall do in pursuance of Our word, bas been approved of (for God would have itso) by the Marshy of Our Resplendant, Puissant and Formidable Emperour and King of the Superficies of the Earth. Wherefore we have fent to you the faid Acom: t Deschelchi, to whom We have entrusted certain things to impart to you by Word of Mouth. If consequently you will fend to Us a Trufty Person o'n your part to Treat a Peace and the Re-establishment of the Publick Quiet, We bops to enter into Conference, Whereupon Salute in the Name of him that follows the true Direction.

Given in the Camp of Peft. IBrahim. After which the Aga prayed his Highness to contribute all he could on his part towards the putting an end to a Warswhich hadcaufed the effusion of so much Bloud, and the ruine of so many poor Prople, saying that he thought his Highness after so glorious a Campagne ought the more readily to confent to a Peace.
