Wherefore wo bave jent to you the fard Acam: t Defchelcbi, to wobom We bive entrujted cerrain things to impart to you by Word of Mouth. If consequently sou will fend to Usa Trufly Perfon on gour part to Treat a Reace and the Re-eplablijhment of whe Publick Quiet, We bops toenter into Conference, Whercupon Salute in the तame of bim that follows she true Diretion.

A $\hat{W}$ er which the Aga prayed his Highnefs ro contribute all he could on his part towards the putiong an end to a War, which hadcaufed the effufinn of fo much Bloud, and the ruine of fo many poor P، ople, faying that be thought his Highnefs after foglorious a Campagne ought the more readily to confent toa Peace. And offering in that Cafe, in the Grand Signiors naure, to abandon Count Teckeley, and even to deliner to the Empeor the Holtages he has now at the Port. To which the Duke of Iorrain anfwered, That a Viflorions Army was not to be amufed with Over. tures of Peace, and that be bad no Injiructionsto bearken to any ; but that be rould acquaint bis Imperial Majefty woub the Serafquier's Propofals.

Hamburgh, Sept. 20. The Sieur Cbauvel General of the Troops of Brun/wick, which ate in the Imperial army in Hungary bath ient an Exprefs to acquaint the Dukes of Zell and Hanover with the Propofilt that have been made to him by the Duke of Lorrain about Winter Quarters. The differen. ces between the Duke of Zell and this City cannot yet be accommodared, new difficulties ar fing daily. Thefe Magiftracss are fending two Depucies so Viexma to Compliment the Emperor upon the Marriage of $t$ e Eledtor of Bavaria with the Arch-duchefs his Daughter.

Culogye, Sept:2g. One of the Imperial Sub-Commifuolers who went the lalt weck to Cobients to give the Elcetor of Trier an account of their proccedings here, is come back, and has fince had lieveal mectings with his Collegue about the dfiairs of this City, in the which thy $y$ are yet cone to no determination. The Dracols, who were put aut of their Places about three years ago, make great application to the Commiflioners to be reftured, but they will hardly obtain it for that the old Magiftrales would then presend to be likewife reftored. The Letters from Vienne of the 13 th inftant tell us liat the Imperial Army was encripped near the River Ipol, having fent D:tachements towards Efperies, Agria, and Croatia: And that the Serafo quier who was encamped riear Buda had nate with Thim above igooo Horle, and that he had fint a.fecond time to the Duke of Lorrain to p o,ofe 2 Treary of Prace
 ed hither the zath infant fiom Elgenderss Tho next day arsived the Spanigh Letters, by which his

Efecllency bad an account that lis Catholick Majelty hath eunferted the Office of Secreiary of State and War in thefe Councrits upon Don Fernardo Purez de olmedo; And a promile chat Bills for 150 thorrfand Crowns thould b: fenchither by the next Or* dinary. Sir Richard bulfrode Envop from His Majeity of Great britain at this Court had this day his Publick Audience of his Excellency, by whom he was receiv. d with parricular Marks of refpect. The States of the Province of Namur bave granted his Excellency a Sabfidy of 80000 Florins, which is more then they have given at a time to any of the late Governors. The 26 h inflant one Telliet who was a Caproin in the late Rebellion in England, and made his elcape inco thefe parts, was by the the meansof Captain Slater and Enfign Buller fcizadac Malines with leave of the Governor, and lecured in the Common Prifon of that place. The Lettera from Vienna of the 1 oth inflanc inform us that the Imperial Army was encamped berween Novigrad and Barkan. and that the Duke of Lorrain was difpoling $t$ ings in order to put the Troops into Winter Quazcels.

Hague, Oltober 2. The Treaty lately concluded betne.n this State and the EleCtor of Brandenbarg is Ratified by the States General, and the Racifications will be exchangedina day or two by the sieur Dieft iu the abfence of the Sieur Fuchs. The Count d' Aviux Ambaflador from France, having leave from his Moft Chriltian Majefty to Yeturn home, to look after his privatc affairs, parted from bence the 30 palt with two or three Servants only, intending co be her again in a month or fix weeks. The Letters from Vienna of the 1 gth inflant give an acz count of the furrender of Efreries.
