WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with

" certain modifications, the fourth report of the " Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Re-" venues;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to " explain and amend two several Acts relating to " the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating " the cathedral churches of Wales," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fortyseven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An "Act to carry into effect, with certain modifica-" tions, the fourth report of the Commissioners " of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament

held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend "two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical "Commissioners for England;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral "churches of Wales," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making additional provision for the cure of souls in certain parishes where such assistance is most required.

"Whereas, under the authority of the said recited Acts, we have, from time to time, prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council certain schemes, in which we have recommended and proposed, that certain grants should be made, in augmentation of the incomes of certain benefices and churches, in certain classes, and subject to certain limitations, therein mentioned, which schemes have been ratified by Orders of your Majesty in Council, and such Orders have been duly gazetted:

"And whereas, on the sixth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, we found it necessary to suspend, until further notice, our recommendations of further grants, with certain specified exceptions; and the several benefices and churches described in the schedules hereunto annexed either fall within such exceptions, or the incumbents thereof have received specific promises from us that we would recommend the grants in the said schedules respectively proposed, in consequence of their coming within some or one of such classes, as aforesaid:

"And whereas we have satisfied ourselves, after due inquiry, that the churches described in the schedules hereunto annexed marked A. 2. and A. 3. fall within the first of such classes, subject to the respective limitations in the said Orders mentioned; and that the said churches are fit and proper to be forthwith augmented by the respective annual amounts stated in the last column of the said schedules respectively:

"And whereas, from the source set opposite to the name of the benefice described in the schedule hereunto annexed marked B., in the sixth column of such schedule, the benefaction stated in the seventh column of the same schedule has been permanently secured to the incumbent of such benefice, as therein specified; and we have satisfied ourselves that the said last-mentioned benefice falls within the second of such classes, as limited by the said Orders; and is fit and proper to be forthwith augmented, by the annual amount stated in the last column of the same schedule:

"And whereas the benefices described in the schedule hereunto annexed marked C. fall within the third class in the said Orders mentioned, and are situate within the places set opposite to the names thereof respectively in the fifth column of the same schedule; and we are in possession of certain tithes or lands arising or situate in such places respectively, or of the proceeds thereof; and, after due inquiry and consideration, we have satisfied ourselves, that the same benefices and churches are fit and proper to be forthwith augmented, by the respective annual amounts stated in the last column of the same schedule:

" We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the incumbent for the time being of each of the benefices and churches so described in the said schedules marked respectively A. 2., A. 3., B., and C., the fixed annual sum set opposite to the name of such benefice or church, in the last column of the said schedules respectively, and to the incumbent for the time being of the perpetual curacy of Saint Benedict Glastonbury, in the county of Somerset, a fixed annual sum of one hundred pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year; and that the first such halfyearly payment shall in each case be made on the first day of May next, except in the case of Hildenborough, the incumbent shall on such last-mentioned day receive six such half-yearly payments, and except also in the case of Voelas, the incumbent whereof shall on such last-mentioned day receive five such half-yearly payments, and except also in the case of Mansfield, the incumbent whereof shall on such last-mentioned day receive three such half-yearly payments, and except also in

the cases of Stockton-on-the-Forest and Wokingham, the incumbents whereof shall on such last-mentioned day receive two such half-yearly payments; and that in case of a vacancy in any of the benefices or churches contained in the said five schedules having already happened during the period over which the payment so recommended and proposed extends, or hereafter happening on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the incumbent making the vacancy, or his personal representatives, and the incumbent succeeding to the benefice or church so becoming or having become vacant.

" And whereas we have satisfied ourselves that the several benefices contained in the schedule hereunto annexed marked E. fall within the second class aforesaid, except the perpetual curacies of All Saints Chardstock and Duddington, and the vicarages of Corringham and Gretton, which fall within the third class aforesaid; we, therefore, recommend and propose, that in order to provide fit houses of residence for the incumbents of all the benefices and churches contained in the last-mentioned schedule. we shall be at liberty to pay, to such persons and at such times as shall appear to us from time to time to be expedient, such a sum or sums of money, in the case of each such benefice or church, as shall be required for providing a fit house of residence for the incumbent thereof; provided that, except in the cases of the four last named benefices, the total amount so paid by us, in addition to the amount of the benefaction, shall not exceed such amount where the benefice is in public patronage, or two third parts of such amount where the benefice or church is in private patronage.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent the further augmentation of any of such benefices or churches, if it shall be deemed fit, when there shall be sufficient means for that purpose; and that if it shall appear to us to be expedient, at any future time, that instead of the annual sum then in course of payment by us to the incumbent of any benefice, or instead of any part of such annual sum, any land, tithe, or other hereditament should be conveyed to such benefice in fee, nothing herein or in any other scheme contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing such a substitution; provided that no such change shall take effect before the then next vacancy of the benefice affected thereby, without the written consent of the then existing incumbent.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure for making better provision for the cure of souls, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for "the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifteenth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act" to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parishes of Chatham and Gillingham, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Rochester.

" Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it

scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said parishes of Chatham and Gillingham are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of each of such parishes hereinafter mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be together constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend George Bishop of Rochester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Chatham, and also all that part of the said parish of Gillingham, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—

all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be together constitued a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly, and that the same shall be named, "The District of Brompton."

" And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November, to the minister, for the time being, of the district so recommended to be constituted, and so soon as such district shall have become, according to the provisions of the said Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, to the perpetual curate thereof, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister, or of such perpetual curate, as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

" And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority aforesaid, at any time to assign the right of patronage of any such district or new parish as aforesaid, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity, or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation aggregate or sole, or to either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion and in such manner as shall be approved by the like authority:

- "And whereas a sufficient sum of Three Pounds per Centum Consolidated Bank Annuities to produce the annual sum of one hundred pounds has been contributed and transferred to our account and into our names in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, by the Reverend William Conway, of Rochester, in the said county of Kent, and Martha Conway, of the same place, spinster, towards such permanent endowment as aforesaid of the minister of the district so herein recommended to be constituted, and, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid, of the perpetual curate thereof:
- "And whereas it is the intention of the said Reverend William Conway and Martha Conway to provide a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish:
- "We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that, in consideration of such contribution towards the endowment of the said district or new parish of Brompton, the right of patronage of, and the nomination of the minister to, the said district shall be, for the two first nominations, assigned to and shall and may be exercised by the said William Conway and Martha Conway; and that so soon as a church or chapel shall have been provided and completed by the said William Conway and Martha Conway, and duly approved and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, according to the provisions of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon have become a new parish, and the minister thereof a perpetual curate, the future patronage in perpetuity of such new parish and the nomination of such perpetual curate shall be assigned to, and, without any further act or deed whatsoever, become and be absolutely vested in the said William Conway and Martha Conway; and that such right of patronage and nomination shall be assigned to, and shall and may be exercised by, the said William Conway and Martha Conway, or their assigns, or the survivor of them, the said William Conway and Martha Conway, or the heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns of such survivor for ever.
 - " And we further recommend and propose, that

nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" The district of Brompton, being,-

"All that part of the parish of Gillingham, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Rochester, situate on the western side of the lines of fortification, and also all that part of the parish of Chatham, in the same county and diocese, situate on the eastern side of the eastern wall of Chatham Dock-yard, and of an imaginary line extending southward from such wall to a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) in the middle of Westcourt-street and at the western end thereof, and thence along the middle of the road leading from such last-mentioned street to Chatham Church as far as a certain lane or passage called the New Cut or Footpath, and on the northern side of an imaginary line extending eastward from such last-mentioned road along the middle of the said lane or passage as far as the boundary between the said parishes of Gillingham and Chatham."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parishes out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted:

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it

is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said parish of Mottram in Longdendale is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bird Bishop of Chester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Mottram in Longdendale, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in

the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly, and that the same shall be named, "The District of Godley cum Newton Green."

" And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the said district herein recommended to be constituted, when licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

" And we further recommend and propose, that

nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

"The district of Godley cum Newton Green, being-

"All that part of the parish of Mottram in Longdendale, in the county and diocese of Chester, comprised within the township of Godley, in the said parish, and such part of the township of Newton, in the same parish, as is situate on the south eastern side of that part of Hall Bottom Brook flowing wesward of the line of railway called 'the Sheffield, Ashton-under-Lyne, and Manchester Railway,' and on the south western side of the said line of railway, extending from the said brook, to its junction with the township of Godley."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the church of the parish, and to the incumbent and patron of the church or chapel of the district, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted:

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain "modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifteenth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to carry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecc" clesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making better provision for the cure of souls in the several parishes of Corringham and Stow, in the county and diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas it was by the said recited Act enacted, that except as therein otherwise specified, all the moneys and revenues to be paid to us, and all the rents and profits of the lands, tithes, and other hereditaments vested and to be vested in us by and under the authority of that Act, together with all accumulations of interest produced by and arising therefrom, should be, from time to time. carried over by us to a common fund, and by payments or investments made out of such fund, or if, in any case, it be deemed more expedient, by means of an actual conveyance and assignment of such lands, tithes, or other hereditaments, or of a portion thereof, additional provision should be made, by the authority therein provided, for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required, in such manner as should, by the like authority, be deemed most conducive to the efficiency of the Established Church; provided always, that in making any such additional provision out of any tithes, or any lands or other hereditaments

allotted or assigned in lieu of tithes, so vested or to be vested in us, or out of the rents and profits thereof, due consideration should be had of the wants and circumstances of the places in which such tithes then arose, or had theretofore arisen:

"And whereas by reason of the vacancy of the prebend of Corringham-cum-Stow, in the cathedral church of Lincoln, and under the provisons of the said recited Act, all the lands, tithes, and other hereditaments belonging to the said prebend became (subject to any legally subsisting lease thereof) vested in us for the purposes of the said recited Act:

"And whereas by virtue of an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-third day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, made under the authority of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for "the spiritual care of populous parishes," which Order was duly gazetted, the piece of land particularly described in the first schedule hereto annexed, marked A, has been conveyed to and is now absolutely vested in us, in lieu of other lands and hereditaments, so vested in us by reason of such vacancy; and the piece of land particularly described in the second schedule hereto annexed, marked B, is part of the lands herein first mentioned, and the leasehold interest therein has since been conveyed to us under the said Order in Council:
