Coming to Her Majesty's Drawing-Room, on Thursday the 27th of May, are to fall into line and come down the left hand side of St. James's-street, enter at the iron gate nearest the Palace, set down at the Arcade, turn round, and go out by the iron gate nearest Marlboroughhouse, to wait in St. James's-square. When called, they are to pass from the square through Charles-street, into Regent-street and Jermynstreet, come down St. James's-street as before, take up, and go away through Pall-mall.

No hackney carriages will be admitted within the gates.

For all persons having the privilege of the entrée, tickets will be delivered at the Board of Green Cloth, on Tuesday next, from eleven till

three o'clock; their carriages are to enter the gate at Constitution-hill, proceed down St. James's-park, through Stable-yard, into the Ambassadors'-court, set down, and go out into Cleveland-row. The carriages of Ambassadors, Foreign Ministers, Cabinet Ministers, and Great Officers of State may afterwards wait in the Ambassadors'-court, and those of all other persons having the entrée may wait in Stable-yard or St. James's-park till called; they are then to take up in the same order as they had set down, and pass away up St. James's-street.

No carriage will be admitted with company a second time with the same ticket, to prevent which, it must be produced at Constitution-hill-gate, and Stable-yard-gate also, where a corner of it will be torn off by the Marshalmen in attendance; and no person can be allowed the privilege of the *entrée* by any other approach to the Palace than the gates last mentioned.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for " rendering more easy the taking the poll at " county elections," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time, on petition from the justices of any county, riding, parts, or division in England or Wales, in quarter sessions assembled, representing, that the number of polling places for such county, riding, parts, or division is insufficient, and praying that the place or places mentioned in the said petition may be a polling place or polling places for the county, riding, parts, or division of the county within which such place or places is or are situate, to declare that any place or places mentioned in the said petition shall be a polling place or polling places for that county, riding, parts, or division; and that the justices of the peace for such county, riding, parts, or division, in quarter sessions or some special sessions assembled, as mentioned in an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the second and third years of the reign of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act to settle " and determine the divisions of counties and the " limits of cities and boroughs in England and "Wales, in so far as respects the election of " Members to serve in Parliament," shall, conformably to the said last-mentioned Act, divide such county, riding, parts, or division into convenient polling districts, and assign one of such districts to each polling place:

And whereas the justices of the peace of the west riding of the county of York, in general quarter sessions assembled, at Pontefract, in the said riding, on Monday the fifth day of April in the present year, have presented a petition to Her Majesty in Council, representing, that the number of polling places within the said west riding is insufficient, and praying that the town of Selby, situate within the said riding, may be a polling place for the said west riding:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, having taken the said petition into consideration, doth, pursuant to the said first-mentioned Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, declare, order, and direct, that the said place named in the said petition, namely, the town of Selby, shall be a polling place for the west riding of the county of York; and further, that the justices of the peace for the said west riding, assembled in general quarter sessions or some special sessions, as in the said Act secondly above mentioned is mentioned, shall, conformably to that Act, divide the said west riding into convenient polling districts, and assign one of districts to each polling place.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for "the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-second day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for authorizing the sale of certain property lately belonging to the prebends of Norwell Overhall, Norwell Palishall, and Norwell Tertia, founded in the collegiate church of Southwell.

"Whereas it is by the said Act (amongst other things) enacted, that, notwithstanding the charge by that Act created (being a charge created in favour of the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne), all the same and the like powers and rights of ownership, as are possessed and enjoyed respecting and over any lands, tenements or other hereditaments whatsoever by any absolute owner thereof, shall be enjoyed by us with respect to and over all or any lands, tithes, rent charges, tenements and other hereditaments vested in us under certain Acts therein mentioned (being the Acts under which the property hereinafter described is vested in us), and may, subject to the provisions of the same Acts and of the now reciting Act, be exercised by us by proper instruments, in writing, duly executed according to law; with a certain proviso respecting the application of every sum of money received as the consideration or purchase money for the sale, transfer, and conveyance by us of any of such lands, tithes, tenements or other hereditaments, or of any estate or interest therein, and with a further proviso, that none of such lands, tithes, tenements or other hereditaments be sold, transferred, or conveyed except by the authority of a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council ratifying the same:

"And whereas the property and endowments heretofore belonging to the said several prebends of Norwell Overhall, Norwell Palishall, and Norwell Tertia, consist, amongst other things, of certain lands, tenements and hereditaments, situate in the county of Nottingham, which have been from time to time and now are demised by leases thereof, granted by the late prebendaries of the said respective prebends; and such lands, tenements and hereditaments are now absolutely vested in us (subject to the said leases) by reason of the vacancies of the said prebends:

"And whereas applications have been and are likely to be made to us by many of the parties beneficially interested under the said leases, for the absolute sale to them of all our estate and interest in the particular portions of such lands, tenements, and hereditaments respectively held by them; and, after due consideration, it appears to us to be expedient, that the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments should be accordingly sold:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that we may be authorized and empowered, by deed or deeds duly executed under our common seal, from time to time, to sell and duly to convey,

according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said lands, tenements and hereditaments, with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title and interest therein or in any part thereof, unto and to the use of the purchaser or purchasers thereof respectively, and their respective heirs and assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall appoint, in such manner, and for such price or prices, sum or sums of money, to be paid to us as shall, upon due calculation and enquiry, appear to us to be just and reasonable.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lincoln.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to carry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ec"clesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for consolidating the two medieties of the vicarage of Bubwith, in the county and diocese of York.

"Whereas it is by the said recited Act enacted, that with respect to any parish in which both the posits and the spiritual charge are divided between two or more incumbents, each having a mediety or portion of the benefice, a plan or plans may be framed by the bishop of the diocese, with the consent of the patron or patrons, and so as not to prejudice the interest of any existing incumbent, for constituting any of such portions separate benefices, or for consolidating two or more of such portions into one benefice to be held by one incumbent, or for making such other arrangements as he may judge likely to promote the efficient discharge of pastoral duties in such parish, and any such plan may be carried into effect by the authority therein provided:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward Archbishop of York, has, by virtue of the said recited provision, duly framed and submitted to us a plan for consolidating the two medicties of the said vicarage of Bubwith, which said plan bears date the fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and is in the words and figures following, that is to say:

- "Whereas the profits and spiritual charge of the vicarage of Bubwith, in the county and diocese of York, have been heretofore divided between two incumbents, each having a mediety or portion of the benefice, and one of such medieties is in the patronage of Her Majesty, and the other is in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter of York, and is now vacant; and it appears to be expedient, that the same medieties or portions should be consolidated into one benefice, and held by one incumbent:
- " And whereas the said patrons have consented and agreed to such consolidation upon the terms and conditions following, that is to say:
- "That the patronage of the said consolidated benefice should hereafter be exercised alternately by Her Majesty and by the said Dean and Chapter of York, and that the first turn should forthwith be exercised by Her Majesty, by presenting to the now vacant mediety or portion the Reverend William George Wilkinson, Clerk, the present holder of the said other mediety or portion, and that upon his vacation of the consolidated benefice, the said Dean and Chapter shall present a Clerk thereto:
- "Now, therefore, I, Edward Archbishop of York, with the consent of Her Majesty, testified by this plan having been signed and sealed by the Right Honourable Charles Christopher Baron Cottenliam, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of York, signified under their common seal, do hereby

recommend and propose, that the said two medicties or portions of the vicarage of Bubwith shall be consolidated into one benefice, upon the terms and conditions hereinbefore mentioned, and shall for ever be called and known by the name of the vicarage of Bubwith, in the county of York, and shall be held by one incumbent as vicar thereof.

- " And whereas the arrangement proposed in the said plan appears to us likely to promote the efficient discharge of the pastoral duties of the said parish of Bubwith:
- "We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that the said plan be carried into effect accordingly.
- "And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.
