WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the eleventh day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Saint Martin, in the borough of Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Worcester, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to

the consecrated church of Saint Bartholomew, situate in the said parish of Saint Martin, Birmingham, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Saint Bartholomew, Birmingham," and that the same should commence at that point of the boundary line which separates the parishes of Saint Martin, Birmingham, and Aston, at the junction of Coleshill-street, Prospect-row, and Duke-street, and proceed in a south westerly direction, along the middle of Coleshill-street, as far as the boundary line which separates the parish of Saint Martin from the parish of Saint Philip, Birmingham, and then follow that boundary line south westwardly and southerly as far as the proposed Birmingham and Oxford Junction Railway, along the middle of which it proceeds south easterly as far as the boundary line of the said parish of Aston; it then continues along such boundary line in a north

easterly, westerly, north easterly, and north westerly direction, as far as the point at the junction of Prospect-row, Duke-street, and Coles-hill-street, where the boundary commenced, as such district is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink; excepting, however, out of such district, the two parochial burial grounds or parish cemeteries belonging to the parish of Saint Martin, Birmingham, and which two burial grounds or parish cemeteries are situate on the eastern side of Park-street, and are left uncoloured on the said map :

“ That banns of marriage should be published, and also that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said church of Saint Bartholomew ; and that all the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the Minister thereof for the time being :

“ That the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Lord Bishop of Worcester, as Bishop of the diocese, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Henry Lord Bishop of Worcester has signed and sealed this representation :

“ Your Majesty’s said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

and the parish of Winterborne Monkton; and on the east the district is bounded by the remaining part of the parish of Fordington, from which it is separated by the road leading from Weymouth to Dorchester, from the point where the said road leaves the said parish of Winterborne Monkton; and from thence, north easterly, up that road as far as South-street, Dorchester, as the said district is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured yellow :

“ That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, and churchings, and also burials so soon as a burial ground can be procured for the said district, should be solemnized and performed in the said church, called Christ Church ; and that all the fees to arise therefrom should be received by and belong to the Minister of such church for the time being :

“ That the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Lord Bishop of Salisbury, as the Bishop of the diocese within which the said parish of Fordington is situate, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned or referred to; in testimony whereof, the said Edward Lord Bishop of Salisbury has signed and sealed this representation :

“ Your Majesty’s said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty’s reign, intituled “ An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues,” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-second day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty’s reign, intituled “ An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues,” have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making better provision for the cure of souls in the parish of Winsham, in the county of Somerset, and diocese of Bath and Wells.

“ Whereas it was by the said Act enacted, that out of the rents and profits of the lands, tithes, and other hereditaments vested and to be vested in us, or if, in any case, it be deemed more expedient, by means of an actual conveyance and assignment of such lands, tithes, or other hereditaments, or of a portion thereof, additional provision should be made, by the authority therein provided, for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance should be most required, in such manner as should, by the like authority, be deemed most conducive to the efficiency of the Established Church; and it was provided, that in making any such additional provision out of any tithes, or any lands or other hereditaments allotted or assigned in lieu of tithes, so vested or to be vested in the said Commissioners, or out of the rents and profits thereof, due consideration should be had of the wants and circumstances of the places in which such tithes then arose, or had theretofore arisen;

"And whereas, after due consideration of the wants and circumstances of the said parish of Winsham, we have deemed it expedient that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls therein, in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that the piece or parcel of land and premises, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, lately forming part of the endowment of the deanery of the cathedral church of Wells, but now vested in us under the provisions of the said Act, shall forthwith, without any deed or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, be conveyed and assigned to and vested in the Reverend George Ware, the present Vicar of the vicarage and church of Winsham aforesaid, and his successors, Vicars of the said vicarage for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matter aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

"All that piece or parcel of land, with the cottages and buildings erected thereon, situate and being near the church-yard of the parish of Winsham, in the county of Somerset, formerly belonging to the deanery of the cathedral church of Wells, and lately in the tenure or occupation of Anthony Hodder, and containing, by estimation, sixteen perches, or thereabouts, the same being numbered 94 on the plan, in the possession of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, of this and other property in the said parish, formerly belonging to the said deanery, and now vested in the said Commissioners"

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this

“Whereas, under the provisions of the said Acts, the whole of the property (except any right of patronage) belonging to the dignity or office of precentor or to any prebend not residentiary in any cathedral church in England and Wales becomes upon the first avoidance of such dignity, office or prebend absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, and the chief of such purposes is that of making better provision for the cure of souls, in parishes where such assistance is most required:

“And whereas, it is by the said recited Acts enacted, that by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement may, from time to time, be made with the consent in writing, under the hand of any prebendary or other dignitary or officer of any cathedral church in England and Wales, for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments in the possession or enjoyment of any dean, canon, prebendary or other dignitary or officer of any cathedral or collegiate church, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes or hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting, in any case, any lands, tithes or other hereditaments, for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes or other hereditaments:

“And whereas we did, in the month of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, negotiate for an arrangement with the said William Cleaver, for the payment to him of a sum of five hundred pounds, or thereabouts, in consideration of his forthwith surrendering to us all his estate and interest in the lands, tenements and other hereditaments and endowments of and belonging to the said dignity or office of precentor and prebend of Vaynol in the said cathedral church, with a view to the earlier possession thereof for the purpose hereinbefore particularly specified; and the said William Cleaver did consent to the said arrangement in writing under his hand:

“We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that in fulfilment of the negotiation and arrangement aforesaid, in full reliance upon the completion whereof the said William Cleaver has recently resigned the said dignity and prebend, we may be authorized and empowered forthwith to pay to him, the said William Cleaver, the sum of five hundred pounds.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Saint Asaph.
