A T the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 20th day of May 1847,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the provisions of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further amendment of "the church building Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of November one thousand eight hundred and fortysix, in the words following, that is to say:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parishes of Gargrave and Kirkby Malhamdale, in the west riding of the county of York, and within the diocese of Ripon, it appears to them to be expedient to unite and consolidate certain contiguous parts of the said parishes, and to form the same into one consolidated chapelry for the consecrated church, called Saint Peter's, situate at Coniston Cold, in the said parish of Gargrave, under the provisions

of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the "further amendment of the church building Acts;" and that such consolidated chapelry should be named, "The Consolidated Chapelry of Coniston," and consist of the township of Coniston Cold and parts of the townships of Eshton and Gargrave, in the parish of Gargrave, also of part of the townships of Otterburn and Airton, in the said parish of Kirkby Malhamdale, and that such consolidated chapelry should be bounded as follows, that is to say:

"On the west by the parish of Long Preston; on the south by the township of Banknewton, in the said parish of Gargrave; on the east by the boundary line which separates the townships of Coniston Cold and Gargrave, as far as the point at the southern end of the strip of plantation below Bell Busk Mill, where it intersects the boundary of the township of Coniston Cold; from which point it proceeds northerly, up the eastern side of the said plantation and of a watercourse, to the point where such watercourse joins the boundary line of the parish of Kirkby Malhamdale; it then follows the boundary line, in a south easterly and north easterly direction, to the south western corner of Windsor Copy; it then pro-

ceeds along the south eastern boundary of the said Windsor Copy, in a north easterly direction, as far as the road leading to Granny House, which road it crosses and proceeds in a south easterly direction, along the north eastern side of the said road, as far as the eastern boundary of the croft on the south eastern side of Granny House; it then proceeds in a north westerly direction, along the north eastern boundaries of the said croft and of Granny Croft, and back of House Pasture, and along the northern boundary of the latter pasture, to the point where it joins the boundary line of the parish of Kirkby Malhamdale, up which boundary it proceeds northerly to the northernmost point of Higher Pasture, west of the river Air; it then turns south westerly, along the north western and northern boundaries of the said Higher Pasture and of Buscow or Dam Stones Pasture, as far as the road leading to Airton, up the western side of which road it proceeds to the point where it diverges from the boundary line of Lower Pasture; the consolidated chapelry is then bounded on the north by proceeding from the above-mentioned road in a westerly direction, along the northern boundary of Lower Pasture, to the point where it joins the easterly point of Near Well Head Meadow; it then proceeds northerly, westerly, northerly, and again westerly, along the boundary of the said meadow, as far as Far Well Head Meadow, and proceeds northerly along the eastern side thereof, and westerly along the northern side thereof, then turning southerly, down the western side thereof, to the northern boundary of Well Head Pasture, along which boundary it proceeds in a westerly and south westerly direction as far as a ditch which separates the townships of Airton and Otterburn, down which ditch it proceeds southerly to the northern fence of Higher Pasture, along which fence it proceeds westerly and then southernly down its western fence, till it reaches the boundary line which separates the parishes of Gargrave and Kirkby Malhamdale, and proceeds westerly along such boundary as far as the parish of Long Preston, where the said consolidated chapelry commenced, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan thereof hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured yellow and green:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners beg leave

further to represent, that it has been mutually agreed between the Reverend Anthony Marsden, of Gargrave aforesaid, Clerk, as the patron of the parish church of the said parish of Gargrave, and the Most Noble William Spencer Duke of Devonshire, as the patron of the parish church of the said parish of Kirkby Malhamdale, with the approbation of your Majesty's said Commissioners, and also with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, in whose diocese the said two parishes of Gargrave and Kirkby Malhamdale are situate, that the right of presentation, nomination, and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to the said church of Saint Peter's and consolidated chapelry of Coniston should belong to, be in, and be exercised, when occasion may require, by James Braithwaite Garforth, of Coniston Cold aforesaid, Esq. his heirs and assigns for ever:

"That the consents of the said Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, as bishop of the diocese as aforesaid, and of the said Anthony Marsden and William Spencer Duke of Devonshire, as such patrons as aforesaid, have been severally obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, Anthony Marsden, and William Spencer Duke of Devonshire have respectively signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed formation into one consolidated chapelry be accordingly made, and the agreement, in respect of the right of presentation, nomination, and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to the said church of Saint Peter's and consolidated chapelry of Coniston, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
