AT the Court at *Buckingham-Palace*, the 20th day of *May* 1847,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared, and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twentieth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making better

provision for the spiritual duties of the parish of Bethnal-green, in the county of Middlesex, and diocese of London.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that arrangements may be made, by the authority therein provided, for the apportionment of the income of two benefices belonging to the same patron between the incumbents or ministers of such benefices, or the churches or chapels connected therewith; provided that no such arrangement shall be made in any case so as to prejudice the interest of any existing incumbent, nor without the consent of the Bishop of the diocese :

"And whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the second and third years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the assignment of ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes," it is enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne to accept, take and hold any endowments and emoluments which shall have been, or may thereafter be, provided for the use or benefit of any church or chapel, whether built, acquired or appropriated, or to be built, acquired or appropriated, under the authority of the Acts therein recited, or any of

them, or under any other authority, or for the use or benefit of the incumbent of any such church or chapel, or of the spiritual person serving the same, upon the trusts and for the intents and purposes for which the same shall have been or may thereafter be given or granted by the person or persons providing the same, in like manner as any such endowments or emoluments may now be taken or held by any private trustees or trustee; and it shall and may be lawful for any trustees or trustee of any such endowments or emoluments to assign and transfer the same to the said Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, to be held and applied by them upon the same trusts and for the same intents and purposes as the same, previously to such assignment and transfer, were held by such trustees or trustee; provided always, that no such gift, grant, assignment or transfer shall be made to the said Governors of the Bounty Queen Anne until, by an instrument in writing under their common seal, they shall have signified their consent to accept the same :

“ And it is further enacted, that in all cases in which such consent of the said Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne shall have been so given, the money provided for such endowments shall be paid to the treasurer, for the time being, of the said Governors; and the receipt or receipts of such treasurer shall be effectual discharges, or an effectual discharge, for so much money as in such receipts or receipt shall be expressed to the person or persons paying the same; and, after obtaining such receipt or receipts, the person or persons paying such money shall be absolutely discharged from all liability touching such money, and from all trusts relating thereto :

“ And whereas the Bishop of London, for the time being, is patron of the rectory or benefice of Saint Catharine, Coleman-street, in the city and diocese of London, which said rectory or benefice is now vacant, and he is also patron of the rectory or benefice of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, in the county of Middlesex, and the said diocese, with which rectory are connected the churches or chapels of the several new parishes or districts named in the schedule hereunder written; and he is also patron of the said churches or chapels of the said new parishes or districts :

“ And whereas a desire has been expressed to us by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Bishop of London, that arrangements should be made for apportioning the income of the said rectory or benefice of Saint Catharine, Coleman-street, between the rector thereof and the perpetual curates, ministers or incumbents of the said new parishes or districts in manner hereinafter mentioned, and it appears to us to be expedient that such arrangement should be forthwith carried into effect :

“ And whereas the average annual income of the said rectory of Saint Catharine, Coleman-street, amounts to the sum of one thousand one hundred pounds, or thereabouts, and the population of the parish does not exceed seven hundred souls; and whereas the average annual income and the population of each of the said new parishes and districts are, as nearly as may be, of the respective amounts set against their respective names in the first and second numerical columns of the said schedule :

“ And whereas the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne have, by an instrument in writing under their common seal, bearing even date herewith, signified their consent to accept the annual sum hereinafter recommended, to be paid at the times and upon the trust mentioned, and also any further sum of money which may be contributed, as hereinafter mentioned, towards the endowment of the district of Saint John, Bethnal-green, in the same schedule named:

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Charles James Bishop of London, in testimony whereof he hath signed and sealed this scheme, that there shall hereafter be paid by the rector, for the time being, of the said rectory of Saint Catharine, Coleman-street, out of the revenues of the said rectory, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year, to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, by their treasurer for the time being, but in trust for the incumbents or ministers, for the time being, of the said new parishes or districts, the clear annual sum of four hundred pounds; and that such annual sum of four hundred pounds, and each and every instalment thereof, is and are hereby charged upon the said revenues, and upon

all the glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, dues, profits and emoluments whatsoever, which of right do, shall or may belong to the said rectory, or to the rector thereof, for the time being, as such rector.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that the said annual sum of four hundred pounds shall be thus divided and distributed, that is to say, there shall be paid thereout, by the said treasurer of the said Governors, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year, to the respective incumbents or ministers of the said several new parishes or districts, the several sums set against the respective names thereof in the third numerical column of the same schedule; and that the first such half-yearly payment to the said treasurer of the said sum of four hundred pounds, or such proportionate part thereof as shall have accrued from the day of the date of the vacancy of the said rectory, shall be made on the first day of July next; and the first half-yearly payment, or the proportionate part thereof, to each of the said several incumbents and ministers shall be made by the said Governors, or their treasurer, on the same day, except in the case of the said district of Saint John, Bethnal-green; and that no such payment, or any proportionate part thereof, shall be made to the incumbent or minister thereof, unless or until a sum of money, to be approved by us and by the Bishop of London for the time being, shall have been contributed and paid to the said Governors, or their treasurer, in trust, for the incumbent or minister of the district of Saint John, and towards the permanent additional endowment

thereof; nor unless or until the whole or so many of the sittings in the church of Saint John, as shall be determined and approved by Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches and the said Bishop of London, for the time being, shall have been declared and made free; and that, in the meantime, the remainder or balance of the said annual sum of four hundred pounds which shall be in their possession on each of the said half-yearly days of payment shall, together with all interest thereon, be retained by the said Governors, upon trust, for the said incumbent or minister of the said district of Saint John, to be applied by the said Governors towards the erection of a house of residence for such incumbent or minister, or otherwise in such manner as shall be directed by us and the said bishop for the time being; and that if any vacancy in the incumbency or ministry of either of such churches or chapels, new parishes or districts, shall happen on any other day than the first day of January or the first day of July, the then next half-yearly payment, which shall be due in respect thereof shall be apportioned between and paid to the incumbent or minister making such vacancy, or his personal representatives, and the succeeding incumbent or minister.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the said rectories, or to the said churches or chapels, new parishes or districts, or either of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts, or any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twentieth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for fixing a certain annual payment to be hereafter made to us by the Bishop of Norwich, and for abolishing peculiar and exempt jurisdictions in the diocese of Norwich.

"Whereas it was by the said Act enacted, that in order to provide for the augmentation of the incomes of the smaller bishopricks, such fixed annual sums should be paid to us out of the revenues of the larger sees respectively as should,

upon due inquiry and consideration, be determined on, so as to leave as an average annual income to the archbishops and bishops therein named the respective sums therein mentioned, and that, out of the fund thus accruing, fixed annual payments should be made by us, in such instances and to such amount as should be in like manner determined on, so that the average annual incomes of the other bishops, respectively, should not be less than four thousand pounds, nor more than five thousand pounds:

"And whereas, soon after the passing of the said Act, we proceeded to consider the circumstances of the said see of Norwich, and came to a determination that the average annual income of four thousand five hundred pounds would be suitable to the circumstances thereof; and having also considered the information then before us respecting the actual average annual income of the said see, we were then of opinion, that no alteration need be made in the revenues thereof:

"And whereas, in pursuance of a further provision of the said Act, we did, at the expiration of the first seven years, reckoning from the first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, obtain a new return of the revenues of the said see; and it appears upon such return, that in order to preserve as nearly as may be to the future bishops thereof the amount of income aforesaid, the following fixed annual payment should be made to us out of such revenues:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that from and after the next avoidance of the said see of Norwich, the bishop succeeding thereto, and his successors, shall pay, or cause to be paid to our credit, into the Bank of England, to an account intituled, "Account with the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," by equal half-yearly payments, the fixed annual sum of five hundred pounds; the first payment to be made at the end of six calendar months from the day of such avoidance, whether the same shall happen by death, translation or otherwise; and that whenever a vacancy of the said see shall thereafter happen on any other day than the half-yearly day of payment so calculated as aforesaid, then the next half-yearly payment shall be duly apportioned and paid between and by the bishop making the vacancy, or his representatives, and the bishop succeeding to the said see.

"And whereas it was by the same Act enacted, that it should be competent to us to propose, in any scheme prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council under the provisions thereof, that all parishes, churches or chapelries locally situate in any diocese, but subject to any peculiar jurisdiction other than the jurisdiction of the bishop of the diocese in which the same were locally situate, should be only subject to the jurisdiction of the bishop of the diocese in which the same were locally situate:

"We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that, upon and after the first day of July now next ensuing, all parishes and places, locally situate within the limits of the said diocese of Norwich, and of the several archdeaconries thereof, and all churches and chapels, and the whole clergy and others, your Majesty's subjects, locally situate within the limits of such parishes and places respectively, shall, notwithstanding any peculiar or other ecclesiastical jurisdiction, or exemption from jurisdiction, which any of such parishes, places, churches, chapels or clergy may now possess or be subject to, or claim to possess or be subject to, be respectively under and subject only to the jurisdiction and authority of the bishop of the said diocese, and the archdeacons of the several archdeaconries of such diocese, within the limits of which they shall respectively be so locally situate; except that the cathedral church of and within the said diocese shall remain and be subject to the jurisdiction and visitation, if any, to which it is now by law subject, and to none other; and we further recommend and propose, that, with the like exceptions, all and each of such parishes, places, churches and chapels so possessing or being subject to, or claiming to possess or be subject to, any such peculiar jurisdiction or exemption from jurisdiction, and all other parishes, places, churches and chapels, locally situate within the said diocese, shall severally and respectively be included in and form part of the said diocese and of the archdeaconries and rural deaneries respectively within the limits of which they shall be so locally situate.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matter aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Norwich.
