The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twentieth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making better

provision for the spiritual duties of the parish of Bethnal-green, in the county of Middlesex, and diocese of London.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that arrangements may be made, by the authority therein provided, for the apportionment of the income of two benefices belonging to the same patron between the incumbents or ministers of such benefices, or the churches or chapels connected therewith; provided that no such arrangement shall be made in any case so as to prejudice the interest of any existing incumbent, nor without the consent of the Bishop of the diocese :

"And whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the second and third years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the assignment of ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes," it is enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne to accept, take and hold any endowments and emoluments which shall have been, or may thereafter be, provided for the use or benefit of any church or chapel, whether built, acquired or appropriated, or to be built, acquired or appropriated, under the

authority of the Acts therein recited, or any of them, or under any other authority, or for the use or benefit of the incumbent of any such church or chapel, or of the spiritual person serving the same, upon the trusts and for the intents and purposes for which the same shall have been or may thereafter be given or granted by the person or persons providing the same, in like manner as any such endowments or emoluments may now be taken or held by any private trustees or trustee; and it shall and may be lawful for any trustees or trustee of any such endowments or emoluments to assign and transfer the same to the said Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, to be held and applied by them upon the same trusts and for the same intents and purposes as the same, previously to such assignment and transfer, were held by such trustees or trustee; provided always, that no such gift, grant, assignment or transfer shall be made to the said Governors of the Bounty Queen Anne until, by an instrument in writing under their common seal, they shall have signified their consent to accept the same :

“ And it is further enacted, that in all cases in which such consent of the said Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne shall have been so given, the money provided for such endowments shall be paid to the treasurer, for the time being, of the said Governors; and the receipt or receipts of such treasurer shall be effectual discharges, or an effectual discharge, for so much money as in such receipts or receipt shall be expressed to the person or persons paying the same; and, after obtaining such receipt or receipts, the person or persons paying such money shall be absolutely discharged from all liability touching such money, and from all trusts relating thereto :

“ And whereas the Bishop of London, for the time being, is patron of the rectory or benefice of Saint Catharine Coleman, in the city and diocese of London, which said rectory or benefice is now vacant, and he is also patron of the rectory or benefice of Saint Matthew, Bethnal-green, in the county of Middlesex, and the said diocese, with which rectory are connected the churches or chapels of the several new parishes or districts named in the schedule hereunder written; and he is also patron of the said churches or chapels of the said new parishes or districts :

“ And whereas a desire has been expressed to us by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Bishop of London, that arrangements should be made for apportioning the income of the said rectory or benefice of Saint Catharine Coleman, between the rector thereof and the perpetual curates, ministers or incumbents of the said new parishes or districts in manner hereinafter mentioned, and it appears to us to be expedient that such arrangement should be forthwith carried into effect :

“ And whereas the average annual income of the said rectory of Saint Catharine Coleman, amounts to the sum of one thousand one hundred pounds, or thereabouts, and the population of the parish does not exceed seven hundred souls; and whereas the average annual income and the population of each of the said new parishes and districts are, as nearly as may be, of the respective amounts set against their respective names in the first and second numerical columns of the said schedule :

“ And whereas the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne have, by an instrument in writing under their common seal, bearing even date herewith, signified their consent to accept the annual sum hereinafter recommended, to be paid at the times and upon the trust mentioned, and also any further sum of money which may be contributed, as hereinafter mentioned, towards the endowment of the district of Saint John, Bethnal-green, in the same schedule named:

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Charles James Bishop of London, in testimony whereof he hath signed and sealed this scheme, that there shall hereafter be paid by the rector, for the time being, of the said rectory of Saint Catharine Coleman, out of the revenues of the said rectory, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year, to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, by their treasurer for the time being, but in trust for the incumbents or ministers, for the time being, of the said new parishes or districts, the clear annual sum of four hundred pounds; and that such annual sum of four hundred pounds, and each and every instalment thereof, is and are hereby charged upon the said revenues, and upon all the glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, dues,

profits and emoluments whatsoever, which of right do, shall or may belong to the said rectory, or to the rector thereof, for the time being, as such rector.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that the said annual sum of four hundred pounds shall be thus divided and distributed, that is to say, there shall be paid thereout, by the said treasurer of the said Governors, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year, to the respective incumbents or ministers of the said several new parishes or districts, the several sums set against the respective names thereof in the third numerical column of the same schedule; and that the first such half-yearly payment to the said treasurer of the said sum of four hundred pounds, or such proportionate part thereof as shall have accrued from the day of the date of the vacancy of the said rectory, shall be made on the first day of July next; and the first half-yearly payment, or the proportionate part thereof, to each of the said several incumbents and ministers shall be made by the said Governors, or their treasurer, on the same day, except in the case of the said district of Saint John, Bethnal-green; and that no such payment, or any proportionate part thereof, shall be made to the incumbent or minister thereof, unless or until a sum of money, to be approved by us and by the Bishop of London for the time being, shall have been contributed and paid to the said Governors, or their treasurer, in trust, for the incumbent or minister of the district of Saint John, and towards the permanent additional endowment

thereof, nor unless or until the whole or so many of the sittings in the church of Saint John, as shall be determined and approved by Her Majesty’s Commissioners for building new churches and the said Bishop of London, for the time being, shall have been declared and made free; and that, in the meantime, the remainder or balance of the said annual sum of four hundred pounds which shall be in their possession on each of the said half-yearly days of payment shall, together with all interest thereon, be retained by the said Governors, upon trust, for the said incumbent or minister of the said district of Saint John, to be applied by the said Governors towards the erection of a house of residence for such incumbent or minister, or otherwise in such manner as shall be directed by us and the said bishop for the time being; and that if any vacancy in the incumbency or ministry of either of such churches or chapels, new parishes or districts, shall happen on any other day than the first day of January or the first day of July, the then next half-yearly payment which shall be due in respect thereof shall be apportioned between and paid to the incumbent or minister making such vacancy, or his personal representatives, and the succeeding incumbent or minister.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the said rectories, or to the said churches or chapels, new parishes or districts, or either of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts, or any other Act of Parliament

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to alter and amend the law relating to ecclesiastical houses of residence," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the third day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say :

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to alter and amend the law relating to " ecclesiastical houses of residence," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, respecting the alteration and improvement of the episcopal house of residence belonging to the see of Oxford.

" Whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the eighteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, ratifying a scheme prepared by us, dated the fourth day of the same month of March, sanction was given, according to the provisions of the said recited Act, to certain arrangements for adding to, altering, and improving the episcopal house of

residence of the see of Oxford; and the said Order has been duly gazetted; and whereas since the said Order was so gazetted, it has been made to appear to us, that the said house contained internal defects which could not be discovered until after the commencement of the alterations and repairs contemplated thereby, and that there will be required, in addition to the monies already provided under the said scheme and Order, a further sum of one thousand six hundred and sixty-nine pounds, for the purpose of putting the said house in a fit state as an episcopal residence; and we are of opinion, after full consideration of all the circumstances of the case, that it will be just and proper to provide the said further sum, in manner following :

" We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Samuel Bishop of Oxford, testified by his having hereunto set his hand and episcopal seal, that he the said Samuel Bishop of Oxford be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend, under the provisions of the said hereinbefore mentioned Act, and another Act therein referred to, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty, the sum of one thousand six hundred and sixty-nine pounds, being less than the amount of income limited by the last-mentioned Act, and as a security for the same that the said Samuel Bishop of Oxford do mortgage all or any part of the lands, tenements and hereditaments of and belonging to his said see to the said Governors, by deed, for the term of thirty-five years, or until the said sum of one thousand six hundred and sixty-nine pounds, with the interest for the same, and all costs and charges attending the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied; and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest, in manner following, videlicet, from and after the expiration of the first year of the said term, computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, in which year no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable, the said Samuel Bishop of Oxford, or his successors, shall yearly and every year pay to the said Governors, their successors or assigns, one thirtieth part of the said principal sum, until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall, at the end of the first and each succeeding year, pay interest, at the rate

of three pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, on the said principal sum, or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid; and if and when it shall happen that the principal and interest, directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned, shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same shall become due, it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors, their successors or assigns, to recover the same, and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof, by distress and sale in such manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in being at the time of such distress and sale; and such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, and shall bind as well the said Samuel Bishop of Oxford as every succeeding bishop of the said see, until the principal and interest, costs and charges shall be paid off and discharged.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that the sum of one thousand six hundred and sixty-nine pounds so to be borrowed shall be paid to us, to be applied for the purposes of this scheme, and that the receipt of our treasurer, for the time being, indorsed on the said mortgage deed, shall be a good and sufficient discharge to the said Governors and their successors for the same, who shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof; and that upon the receipt of the said sum of one thousand six hundred and sixty-nine pounds, there shall be applied and paid by us to such persons, at such times and in such manner as we shall deem expedient, the whole or any part or parts of such sum, in or towards completing the said house as a fit episcopal residence for the Bishop of Oxford.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts, or either of them.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every

part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Oxford.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “ An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes,” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say :

“ Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Maresfield, in the county of Sussex, and within the diocese of Chichester, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint James, situate at Nutley, in the said parish of Maresfield, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled “ An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes,” and that such district should be named, “ The Chapelry District of Nutley,” and that the boundaries thereof should be as follow, that is to say :

" The district is bounded on the south west and west by the parish of West Hoathly; on the north west and north by the parishes of East Grinstead and Hartfield; on the north east by a continuation of the said parish of Hartfield; on the east and partly on the south by the remaining part of the parish of Maresfield, from which it is separated as follows, namely, by proceeding from a bound stone placed at the bend of the rivulet where the boundary of the parishes of Hartfield and Maresfield meet on the north east of Marlpit Farm, in a straight line south easterly from such bound stone, as far as the bend in the road eastwards of Misburn's Farm; and then proceeds down the middle of that road south easterly until it enters a lane to the south of Avery's Mill leading to Brickyard-lane; then proceeds westerly, up the middle of that lane, as far as Brickyard-lane, and along the middle of the latter lane, in a south westerly direction, until it enters into the London-road; and proceeds in a north westerly direction, up the middle of that road, as far as the private road leading to Courtland's Farm, up the middle of which said private road it then proceeds south westerly as far as the boundary line of the said parish of Maresfield and the parish of Fletching, by which latter parish it is bounded on the remainder of the south and south west, as such district is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink :

" That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in such church; and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the Minister thereof for the time being :

" That the consent of the Right Reverend Ashhurst Turner Lord Bishop of Chichester, as Bishop of the diocese, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Ashhurst Turner Lord Bishop of Chichester has signed and sealed this representation :

" Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the first year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to amend an Act for the regulation of municipal corporations in England and Wales," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that if the inhabitant householders of any town or borough in England or Wales shall petition Her Majesty to grant to them a charter of incorporation, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by any such charter if she shall think fit, by the advice of Her Privy Council, to grant the same, to extend to the inhabitants of any such town or borough within the district to be set forth in such charter, all the powers and provisions of the Act of the fifth and sixth William the Fourth, chapter seventy-six, for regulating corporations, whether such town or borough be or be not a corporate town or borough, or be not named in either of the schedules to the said Act; provided, nevertheless, that notice of every such petition, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same may be taken into consideration by Her Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette one month at least before such petition shall be so considered :

And whereas the inhabitant householders of the township of Wolverhampton, in the county of Stafford, have presented a petition to Her Majesty in Council, praying that a charter of incorporation may be granted to such part of the borough of Wolverhampton as is comprised in the township of Wolverhampton; and the inhabitant householders of the borough of Halifax, in the west riding of the county of York, have presented a petition to Her Majesty in Council, praying that a charter of incorporation may be granted to the said borough; Her Majesty was this day pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said petitions be taken into consideration.
