T the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 17th day of June 1847,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better providing for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the third day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Liverpool, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Chester.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parechial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incum-

bent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said parish of Liverpool is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned and described, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bird Bishop of Chester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Liverpool, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly, and that the same shall be named, "The District of Vauxhall."

" And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when licensed according to the said Act. the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

"The district of VAUXHALL, being-

"All that part of the parish of Liverpool, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Chester, bounded as follows, that is to say, on the north by an imaginary line extending along the middle of that part of Burlington-street situate between the Leeds and Liverpool Canal and the Vauxhall-road; on the east by an imaginary line extending along the middle of such road; on the south east by an imaginary line extending along the middle of Tithebarn-street; and on the west by an imaginary line extending northward from the middle of Tithebarn-street aforesaid, along the middle of Key-street, to a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) opposite to the middle of Edmund-street, and thence westward along the middle of such last-mentioned street, as far as the line of railway, or intended line of railway, between Liverpool and Bury, and thence northward along the middle of such line of railway, as far as the Leeds and Liverpool Canal aforesaid, and thence towards the north east along the middle of such canal, as far as Burlingtonstreet aforesaid."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patron of the church of the parish, and to the incumbents and patrons of the churches or chapels of the districts, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas such incumbents and patrons have respectively consented to the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Chester.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act "to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed "in the last session of Parliament, for building, "and promoting the building, of additional "churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, viz.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the parish of Eastbourne, in the county of Sussex, and within the diocese of Chichester, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned, under the powers or provisions for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend " and render more effectual an Act, passed " in the last session of Parliament, for building, " and promoting the building, of additional "churches in populous parishes," to the consecrated church of the Holy and Undivided Trinity, situate in the said parish of Eastbourne, and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of the Holy Trinity, Eastbourne," and that the boundaries thereof should be as follow, that is to say:

"The district is bounded on the north by the parish of Willingdon; on the east and south by the sea; and on the west and north west by the remaining part of the parish of Eastbourne, from which it is separated as follows, namely, proceeding from the sea in a north westerly direction, up the middle of Leet-way, until it enters the high road, along the middle of which high road the boundary then proceeds north easterly as far

the new road leading to Eastbourne, and passing north westerly, up the middle of that road, as far as the hedge-row or plantation separating Middle Field from Further Field, and proceeding north easterly along that hedge-row or plantation crosses Water-lane and enters the horse way or road leading to Bedford Well, along which horse way it proceeds as far as Marsh Piece, containing two acres and fifteen perches, along the north western boundary of which said Marsh Piece, as also of Marsh Piece containing two acres one rood and twelve perches, and marsh pieces, called respectively Shaw Brook, containing two acres two roods and thirteen perches, and Field, near Bedford Well, containing two acres one road and three perches, and along the south western and north western fences of marsh piece, called Seven Acre Marsh, containing seven acres one rood and twenty-nine perches, and along the western fence of marsh piece, called Four Acre Marsh, containing four acres two roods and thirty-one perches, and then along the south western side of another marsh piece, called the Over the Bridge Piece, containing seven acres three roods and thirty-two perches, and their meets the boundary of the said parish of Willingdon, as such district is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured yellow:

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, and churchings, and also burials, so soon as a burial ground can be procured for the said district, should be solemnized and performed in the said church called Trinity Church; that the fees from marriages and burials should be reserved for, on account of, and paid to the present Vicar or Incumbent of the parish church of Eastbourne, during his incumbency thereof, and that, upon the next avoidance of such incumbency, the said fees should belong to the Minister, for the time being, of the said church called Trimity Church, and that the fees from baptisms and churchings should forthwith belong to the said Minister of Trinity Church, and be paid to him and his successors:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Ashhurst Turner Lord Bishop of Chichester, as Bishop of the diocese, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Ashhurst Turner Lord Bishop of Chichester has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

W. HEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the first year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend an " Act for the regulation of municipal corporations " in England and Wales," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that if the inhabitant householders of any town or borough in England or Wales shall petition Her Majesty to grant to them a charter of incorporation, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by any such charter if she shall think fit, by the advice of Her Privy Council, to grant the same, to extend to the inhabitants of any such town or borough within the district to be set forth in such charter, all the powers and provisions of the Act of the fifth and sixth William the Fourth, chapter seventy-six, for regulating cosporations, whether such town or borough be or be not a corporate town or borough, or be not named in either of the schedules to the said Act; provided, nevertheless, that notice of every such petition, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same may be taken into consideration by Her Privy Conneil, shall be published in the London Gazette one month at least before such petition shall be so considered:

the township of Wolverhampton, in the county of Stafford, have presented a petition to Her Majesty in Council, praying that a charter of incorporation may be granted to such part of the borough of Wolverhampton as is comprised in the township of Wolverhampton; and the inhabitant householders of the borough of Halifax, in the west riding of the county of York, have presented a petition to Her Majesty in Council, praying that a charter of incorporation may be granted to the said borough; Her Majesty was this day pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said petitions be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on Thursday the twenty-second day of July next.

Bear Haven Light-house, South West Coast of Ireland.

Ballast-Office, Dublin, 29th April 1847.

THE Corporation for preserving and improving the port of Dublin hereby give notice, that a light-house has been erected on Roancarrig Island, Bantry Bay, county Cork, from which a light will be exhibited on the evening of the 1st of August 1847, and which will thereafter be lighted every night from sun-set to sun-rise.

Specification given of the position and appearance of the Light, by Mr. Halpin, Inspector of Light-houses.

The light-house built on Roancarrig Isle, at the eastern entrance to Bear Haven, is in latitude 51° 39′ 10″ N. and longitude 9° 44′ 49″ W. and bears

From North Point of Whiddy Island (just open of Mehal Point), W. by N. distant 10\frac{1}{2} sea miles.

From Ducallia (half tide rock), W. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. distant $\frac{1}{2}$ sea mile.

From Gerane West Rock (off S. W. point of Whiddy Island), W. by N. 3/4 N. distant 71/2 sea miles.
