WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of

another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for authorizing the sale of certain lands, tenements and hereditaments now forming part of the endowment of the prebend of Bishopshull, in the cathedral church of Lichfield.

"Whereas, under the provisions of the first-recited Act, the whole of the property belonging to any prebend not residentiary in any cathedral church in England (except any right of patronage) becomes, upon the first avoidance of such prebend, absolutely vested in us for the purposes of such Act:

"And whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act enacted, that all the same and the like powers and rights of ownership as are possessed and enjoyed respecting and over any lands, tenements or other hereditaments whatsoever by any absolute owner thereof, shall be enjoyed by us with respect to and over all or any lands, tithes, rent charges, tenements and other hereditaments vested and liable to be vested in us under the provisions of the said first-recited Act and the other Acts therein recited, and may, subject to the provisions thereof,

be exercised by us, by proper instruments in writing duly executed according to law, but, in the case of any such lands, tithes, rent charges and other hereditaments not actually in our possession, with the consent of the respective owners thereof, testified by their being made parties to such instruments; and with a proviso, that none of such lands, tithes, tenements or other hereditaments as aforesaid be sold, transferred or conveyed except by the authority of a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council ratifying the same :

“ And whereas the lands, tenements and hereditaments mentioned in the schedule hereunto annexed, now form a portion of the property and estates of the said prebend of Bishopshull, in the said cathedral church of Lichfield, of which the Venerable William Spooner, Archdeacon of Coventry, is Prebendary, and application has been made to us for the absolute sale of all our estate and interest in the said lands, tenements and hereditaments, and, after due consideration, it appears to us to be expedient that the same should be accordingly sold :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said William Spooner, testified by his having signed this scheme, that we may be authorized, by deed or deeds duly executed under our common seal, to sell, convey and assign, according to the provisions of the said Acts, all our reversionary estate and interest in the said lands, tenements and hereditaments, described in the said schedule, unto and to the use of the purchaser or purchasers thereof respectively, and their respective heirs and assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall appoint, in such manner, and for such price or prices, sum or sums of money to be paid to us, as shall, upon due calculation and inquiry, appear to us to be just and reasonable.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Saint Philip, Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, and within the diocese of Worcester, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Peter, situate in the said parish of Saint Philip, Birmingham, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional

"churches in populous parishes," and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Saint Peter, Birmingham," and that the boundaries thereof should be as follow, that is to say :

"On the north the district commences at the junction of Lancaster-street, Aston-street, Stafford-street, and Lichfield-street, and proceeds in a southerly direction, along the middle of Stafford-street, to the junction of Stafford-street, Coleshill-street, and Dale-end, and proceeds, along the boundary line of Saint Philip's parish and the district about to be assigned to Saint Bartholomew's church, till it meets the Birmingham and Oxford Junction Railway, and then along the boundary line of Saint Martin's parish to the junction of High-street and New-street; and from thence proceeds north easterly, along the middle of High-street, as far as Bull-street; and thence in a north westerly direction, along the middle of Bull-street, as far as the Minories; and thence north easterly, along the middle of the Minories and square and Lichfield-street, as far as the wall of the ground enclosing the schools (which schools are not to be included in the district, and are left uncoloured on the map hereinafter referred to) belonging to Saint Philip's parish, and proceeds south westerly, north easterly, and north westerly, along the said wall, until it again enters Lichfield-street, and proceeds north easterly, along the middle of that street, to the junction of Lancaster-street, Aston-street, and Stafford-street, where the boundary commenced, and as such district is more particularly delineated on the annexed map, and thereon coloured blue :

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said church of Saint Peter, Birmingham; and that all the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the Minister thereof for the time being :

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Lord Bishop of Worcester, as Bishop of the diocese, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Henry Lord Bishop of Worcester has signed and sealed this representation :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Bishop's Tawton, in the county of Devon, and within the diocese of Exeter, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church or chapel, called Newport Chapel, situate at Newport, in the said parish, under, and by virtue of the power for such

purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," and that such district should be called, "The Chapelry District of Newport," and should be bounded as follows, that is to say:

"The chapelry district of Newport is bounded on the south west and south by Wood-street Water; on the west by the river Taw; on the north and north east by Cooney Cut; and on the south east and east by the parish of Landkey from Cooney Cut to the Landkey-road, the boundary then crosses over that road, enters the parish of Bishop's Tawton, and proceeds in a southerly direction, along the eastern fence of a field, called Ganghorns, to the south eastern extremity thereof; it then turns westerly up the southern fence of that field to the fence which bounds the grounds of Rose-hill-villa, and proceeds southerly, along the eastern fence thereof, as far as Brindon-cross-road, which road it crosses and then continues still southerly, along the eastern fence of the field called Little Silver, until that fence reaches Wood-street Water, as such district is more particularly delineated on the map thereof hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured yellow:

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, and churchings, and also burials, upon a burial ground being provided for the said church and chapelry district of Newport, should be solemnized and performed in such church; and that the fees to arise therefrom should be received on account of and paid to the present Incumbent of the said parish of Bishop's Tawton, during his incumbency thereof; but, upon his resigning or otherwise avoiding the said incumbency, the said fees should thereafter belong to the Incumbent for the time being of the said church at Newport:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Lord Bishop of Exeter, as Bishop of the diocese, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Henry Lord Bishop of Exeter has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
