The Queen, taking into Her royal consideration that, upon the decease of John Baron Wodehouse, in the year 1846, the title and dignity of Baron in the High Court of Chancery.

Wodehouse, as eldest son and heir of Henry Wodehouse, as eldest son and heir of Henry Wodehouse, Esq. commonly called the Honourable Henry Wodehouse, who, whilst living, was the eldest surviving son and heir of the said John late Baron Wodehouse; and that, according to the ordinary rules of honour, the only brother of the said John now Baron Wodehouse cannot enjoy that place and precedence which would have been due to him in case his late father, the said Henry Wodehouse, had survived the said John late Baron Wodehouse, and had thereby succeeded to the said title and dignity; Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare, that Henry Wodehouse, Esq. the only brother of the said John now Baron Wodehouse, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence, as if his late father, Henry Wodehouse, had succeeded to the title and dignity of Baron Wodehouse:

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
