PRESENT,

'The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act "to amend and render more effectual an Act, "passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the seventh day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Ashton-under-Lyne, in the county of Lancaster, and within the diocese of Chester, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the new church of Saint George, situate at Stayly-bridge, in the said parish of Ashton-under-Lyne (which was erected by your Majesty's said Commissioners, and consecrated in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty), under and

by wirtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render "more effectual an Act, passed in the last session "of Parliament, for building, and promoting the "building, of additional churches in populous "parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in any wise enabling your Majesty's said Commissioners in this behalf; and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of New Saint George, Stayly-bridge," and that the boundaries thereof should be as follow, that is to say:

" The boundary commences at the bridge over the river Tame, at the southern end of Waterstreet, and proceeds north easterly up the middle of that street to King-street; then continues north easterly up the middle of King-street to Churchstreet, continuing up the middle of Churchstreet to the northern extremity thereof; and from that point, in a straight line for the length of one hundred and ninety one yards north westerly, to the eastern end of Cow-lane; then north westerly up the northern side of that lane to Ridge-hill-lane; and then northerly up the middle of Ridge-hill-lane and Arlies-lane, as far as Spoutbrook; it then proceeds northerly up the middle of May-hill-lane, until it enters the old turnpike road from Mossley to Ashton-under-Lyne, along

the middle of which road it proceeds south westerly into the turnpike road from Ashtonunder-Lyne to Mossley, and proceeds south westerly down the middle of that road to the southernmost corner of the enclosure walls of Hartshead or Ashton Barracks; and from that point proceeds in a straight line southerly to the bend of Cock-brook, just above its entrance into Chadwick's Reservoirs, and proceeds southerly along the western bank of that brook and of the said reservoirs till it again follows the course of the said brook into the river Tame; and then proceeds in a south easterly and north easterly direction along the northern and north western bank of that river, as far as Water-street, where the boundary commenced, and as the same is more particularly delineated on the plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured yellow:

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said new church of Saint George, at Stayly-bridge aforesaid; and that all the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and should belong to the Minister thereof for the time being:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend John Bird Lord Bishop of Chester, as Bishop of the diocese, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said John Bird Lord Bishop of Chester has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further amendment of "the church building Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, in the county and diocese of Oxford, contained a population of seven hundred and sixty-two persons (of whom three hundred and fifty-three were in the township or liberty of Littlemore), and the parish of Iffley, in the same county and diocese, contained a population of nine hundred and fifty-eight persons, of whom one hundred and ninety-four were in the said township or liberty of Littlemore:

"That the said parishes of Saint Mary the Virgin and Iffley are contiguous to each other, and the said township or liberty of Littlemore is formed out of a part of each of the said contiguous parishes:

"That there is in the said township of Littlemore a consecrated church, called the Church of Saint Mary the Virgin and Saint Nicholas (situate in the said parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, in Oxford), which church, at Littlemore, affords accommodation for about two hundred persons, all being free seats, and is situated at a distance of two miles and three quarters of a mile from the parish church of Saint Mary the Virgin, in Oxford, and three quarters of a mile from Iffley parish church, and divine service is regularly performed in the said church at Littlemore; and it appears to your Majesty's said Commissioners to be expedient to unite and consolidate certain contiguous parts of the said two parishes, and to form the same into one consolidated chapelry for the

said church at Littlemore, for all ecclesiastical purposes, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act for the "further amendment of the church building Acts;" and that such consolidated chapelry should be called, "The Consolidated Chapelry of Littlemore," and should consist of so much of the said parishes of Saint Mary the Virgin, in Oxford, and Iffley, as now constitute the township of Littlemore, and that the boundaries thereof should commence at the point where the south westernmost corner of the boundary of the parish of Cowley reaches the turnpike road leading from Oxford to London; and thence proceeding in a southerly direction, down the said turnpike road, as far as the north east corner of the plot of land marked, on the Littlemore inclosure award map, as belonging to N. Kent Walders; thence proceeding to the north west corner of the said plot, and thence southward, along the western boundary of the same, as far as the northern corner of the boundary of the inclosure marked, on the said map, No. 27, and from that corner proceeding along the north western boundary of the said inclosure No. 27, and of the inclosures No. 31, 32, 33, 35, 36, and 37; and thence proceeding south westerly and north westerly, along the boundary line of the parish of Iffley, to the north eastern boundary of the plot No. 43, described in the said map as Nithe Mead Close; and thence proceeding westerly, along the northern boundary of the said plot No. 43, and of the adjoining plot, being the fourth allotment of Richard Allin, as far as the river Isis, as the boundaries of the said consolidated chapelry are more particularly delineated on the said map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink and green:

"That Charles Crawley, of Littlemore aforesaid, Esq. has transferred into the names or to the account of the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne for the augmentation of the maintenance of the poor clergy, the sum of four thousand three hundred and twelve pounds thirteen shillings and four pence, Three Pounds Five Shillings per Cent. Bank Annuities, as and by way of an endowment of the said church at Littlemore, and proposes to make a further endowment thereof: "That the Provost and Scholars of Oriel College, within the University of Oxford, propose to endow the said church, at Littlemore, with forty pounds per annum, or with land to the value of forty pounds per annum; and that the said Provost and Scholars are the patrons of the parish church of Saint Mary the Virgin, in Oxford, and the Archdeacon of Oxford, for the time being, is the patron of the parish church of Iffley aforesaid:

" Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, it has been mutually agreed between patrons of the parish churches of the said parishes of Saint Mary the Virgin Iffley, with the approbation of your Majesty's said Commissioners, and also with the consent of the Right Reverend Samuel Lord Bishop of Oxford, within whose diocese the said two parishes. are situate, that the right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to the said church of Saint Mary the Virgin and Saint Nicholas and consolidated chapelry of Littlemore should belong to, be in, and, when occasion may require, be exercised by, the said Charles Crawley during his life; and that after his decease such right of presentation and appointment should belong to, be in, and, when occasion may require, be exercised by, Eliza Katherine Crawley, the wife of the said Charles Crawley, during her life; and upon her decease should devolve upon Charles Edward Crawley, Esq. the son of the said Charles Crawley, during his life; and that, upon the decease of the said Charles Edward Crawley, the said right of presentation and appointment should for ever thereafter be vested in, and, when occasion may require, be exercised by, the heirs, devisees, or assigns of the survivor of them, the said Charles Crawley, Eliza Katherine Crawley, and Charles Edward Crawley, and in and by the Provost and Fellows of Oriel College, within the University of Oxford, alternately; and that the said heirs, devisees, or assigns should have and exercise the first turn or right of presentation and appointment which should arise after the decease of the survivor of them, the said Charles Crawley, Eliza Katherine Crawley, and Charles Edward Crawley:

"That the consents of the said Samuel Lord Bishop of Oxford, as Bishop of the diocese, and of the Provost and Fellows of Oriel College aforesaid, as the patrons of the parish church of the said parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Oxford, and of the Venerable Charles Carr Clerke, Archdeacon of Oxford, as the patron, in right of his archdeaconry, of the parish church of the said parish of Iffley, have been severally obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Samuel Lord Bishop of Oxford and the said Charles Carr Clerke have respectively signed and sealed this representation, and the said Provost and Fellows have caused their common or college seal to be hereunto affixed:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the beforementioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed formation into one consolidated chapelry be accordingly made, and the agreement, in respect of the right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to the said church and consolidated chapelry, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
