PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for annexing, to a canonical residence in the cathedral church of Saint David's, certain land in the vicinity thereof.

"Whereas it is by the said Act provided, that any small portion of land, situate in the vicinity of any residentiary house, may be permanently annexed to such residentiary house by the authority therein provided :

"And whereas the house of residence belonging to the canonry in the said cathedral church of Saint David's, now held by the Reverend Edmund Melvill, as Chancellor of the said church, has no land attached or belonging thereto, except a small garden, and it therefore appears to us to be expedient, permanently to annex to the said house the piece or parcel of land described in the schedule hereunto annexed, which is in the vicinity thereof, and formerly belonging to the dignity or office of Chancellor in the said cathedral church, but now vested in us under the provisions of the same Act :

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that all that piece or parcel of land, described in the said schedule hereunto annexed, shall forthwith, without any deed or assurance in the law other than this scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, be permanently annexed to the said house of residence belonging to the said canonry held by the Reverend Edmund Melvill as aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from

recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matter aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ All that meadow, piece or parcel of land, called ‘ the Chancellor’s Meadow,’ containing two acres and two roods, or thereabouts, situate in the Cathedral-valley, in the city of Saint David’s, to the north of the common called Penrhiw, and bounded on the south by the said common, on the west by the river Alan, and on the east by certain lands belonging to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in the occupation of Henry Harries, of Tregennis, Esq. and certain other lands belonging to William Davies.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council ; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Saint David’s.

sentation, bearing date the twenty-second day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, viz.

“ Your Majesty’s Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Gillingham, in the county of Dorset, and within the diocese of Salisbury, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint George, situate at Bourton, in the said parish of Gillingham, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “ An Act to amend “ and render more effectual an Act, passed “ in the last session of Parliament, for building, “ and promoting the building, of additional “ churches in populous parishes,” or under or by virtue of any other power in that behalf vested in us, and that such district should consist of the whole of the hamlet of Bourton, which is a detached portion of the said parish of Gillingham, and that such district should be called, “ The Chapelry District of Bourton,” and that the boundaries thereof should be as follow :

“ The chapelry district of Bourton is bounded on the north east by the hamlet of Zeals, in the parish of Mere, and by a detached portion of the parish of Silton; on the west by the parish of Cucklington and another detached portion of the said parish of Silton; and on the north west and north by another detached portion of such last-named parish, and also by the parish of Penzlewood, as such district is more particularly delineated on the map or plan thereof hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured yellow :

“ That baptisms, churchings, and burials should be performed, or continue to be performed, in the said church at Bourton; and that the fees arising therefrom should continue to be paid and should belong to the Incumbent thereof for the time being :

“ That the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Lord Bishop of Salisbury, as Bishop of the diocese, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned ;

in testimony whereof, the said Edward Lord Bishop of Salisbury has signed and sealed this representation :

" Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Ormskirk, in the county of Lancaster, and within the diocese of Chester, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint John, situate at Burscough Bridge, in the said parish of Ormskirk,

under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to amend and render " more effectual an Act, passed in the last session " of Parliament, for building, and promoting the " building, of additional churches in populous " parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power in that behalf vested in us; and that such district should comprise all those portions of the townships of Burscough and Latham which are hereinafter more particularly mentioned or referred to, and which district should be named, " The Chapelry District of Saint John, Burscough Bridge :"

" The chapelry district of Saint John, Burscough Bridge, is to consist of portions of the townships of Burscough and Latham, and is bounded as follows, that is to say, on the south by a line beginning in the road, southward of Merscar House, at the boundary of the township of Scarisbrick; thence to proceed eastward along that road to Martin-lane, and south eastwards along the middle of such lane to the Lord's Gate, and then southwards along the Lord's Gate to the Preston turnpike road, thence crossing that road and to proceed along the middle of the Abbey-lane to Blyth-road, and along the middle of that road eastwards to the edge of the township of Latham, thence taking a northerly direction along the Mill-walks to the Eller Brook, and north eastwards along the Eller Brook to Brier's Mill, thence leaving Brier's Hall to the south proceeds south easterly down the middle of the road to the Three Oaks, thence north eastwards over the Ring of Bells Bridge, along the middle of the Bispham and Mawdsley road, to the Wanes Blades Bridge, where the boundary of the township of Latham terminates; the district is then bounded on the east by the river Douglas, which separates it from the township of Bispham and parish of Croston; on the north by the parish of Rufford; and on the north west by the boundary line which separates the townships of Burscough and Scarisbrick, in the parish of Ormskirk, as far as the road southward of Merscar House, where the boundary commenced, as is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured red :

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said church of Saint John, at Burscough Bridge aforesaid; and that all the fees to arise therefrom should be received for, on account of, and paid to, the present Vicar of the said parish of Ormskirk, during his incumbency thereof; but that, upon the next avoidance of the said parish, the said fees should belong to the Incumbent for the time being of the church of Saint John, at Burscough Bridge aforesaid :

"That the consent of the Right Reverend John Bird Lord Bishop of Chester, as Bishop of the diocese, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said John Bird Lord Bishop of Chester has signed and sealed this representation :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to carry into effect a convention of commerce concluded between His Majesty and the United

States of America, and a treaty with the Prince Regent of Portugal," whereby, after reciting certain provisions contained in certain treaties or conventions, made between His said late Majesty and the United States of America, and between His said late Majesty and the Prince Regent of Portugal, divers provisions were made respecting the duties payable and the bounties and allowances to be granted upon the importation and exportation of goods, wares, and merchandize into or from the United Kingdom in vessels of the United States and in Portuguese vessels, and respecting the repayment to certain corporations, bodies politic and corporate, and sundry other persons, of the amount of the sums of money of which they would be deprived by means of the said Act :

And whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for granting duties of Customs," it is, amongst other things, enacted and declared, that, from and after the ratification of any treaty heretofore made by Her Majesty, and any of Her royal predecessors, subsequently to the said first hereinbefore recited Act, or of any treaty which may hereafter be made by Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors, with any foreign power, in which treaty have been or shall be contained provisions similar to those recited in the said first hereinbefore recited Act, all and every the provisions, clauses, matters, and things in the said first hereinbefore recited Act contained, shall apply and extend to the trade and shipping of such foreign powers, respectively, as fully and effectually to all intents and purposes as to the trade and shipping of the said United States and of the said kingdom of Portugal, and also shall apply and extend to differential duties or charges on goods imported or exported in the ships of such foreign powers as well as to differential duties on the ships of such foreign powers :

And whereas by the last recited Act it is further enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors, by any Order or Orders to be by Her or them made with the advice of Her or their Privy Council, and published in the London Gazette, from time to time to declare what are the foreign powers with which any such treaty or treaties aforesaid is or are subsisting, and that the said recited Acts

shall apply and shall be deemed, from the time of the ratification of any such treaties, to have been applicable to the trade and shipping of such foreign countries as shall be so mentioned in any such Order or Orders in Council as aforesaid, so long as any such Order or Orders shall continue unrevoked, and no longer :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said Act [of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, doth hereby declare, that a treaty has been concluded and is now subsisting between Her Majesty and His Imperial and Royal Highness the Grand Duke of Tuscany :

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
