TREASURY WARRANT.

Whereas by an Act, passed in the fourth  
year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled  
"An Act for the regulation of the duties of  
postage," power is given to the Commissioners of  
Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by  
warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any  
of the rates of British postage or inland postage  
payable by law on the transmission by the post of  
foreign or colonial letters or newspapers, or of any  
other printed papers, and to subject the same to  
rates of postage according to the weight thereof,  
and a scale of weight to be contained in such  
warrant; and, from time to time, by warrant as  
aforesaid, to alter or repeal any such altered  
rates, and make or establish any new or other  
rates in lieu thereof; and, from time to time, by  
warrant as aforesaid, to appoint at what time the  
rates that may be payable are to be paid; and  
it is provided, that the power thereby given should  
extend to any increase or reduction or remission  
of postage:

And whereas by divers warrants under the  
hands of three of the Commissioners of Her  
Majesty's Treasury, the said Commissioners, in  
exercise of the power for such purpose vested in  
them by the said Act, have fixed and established  
rates of postage on letters passing direct between  
the United Kingdom and Hamburg:

And whereas, in consequence of communications  
opened with the Post-office at Hamburg, it is  
considered expedient to fix and establish certain  
rates of postage on printed newspapers, and other  
printed papers, conveyed between that country  
and the United Kingdom direct:

Now we, the undersigned, being three of the  
Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do, in  
exercise of the power reserved to us in and by  
the said Act, and of all other powers enabling  
us in this behalf, by this warrant, under our  
hands, order and direct, that such printed news-  
papers; printed publications, printed prices cur-  
rent, printed commercial lists, and printed courses  
of exchange as are hereinafter mentioned, may be  
sent by the post according to the regulations and  
rates hereinafter set forth, that is to say:

British newspapers, and such British publica-  
tions as are allowed to pass by the post as news-  
papers in the United Kingdom, may, if posted  
in the United Kingdom, addressed to Hamburg,  
be sent from the United Kingdom to Hamburg  
direct by packet boat or private ship free of  
postage.

Newspapers, and other publications allowed to  
pass by the post as newspapers in Hamburg,  
published and posted in Hamburg, and addressed  
to the United Kingdom, may be sent from Ham-  
burgh direct to the United Kingdom by packet  
boat free of postage, and by private ship at a rate  
of one halfpenny each.

Newspapers, and other publications allowed to  
pass by the post as newspapers in Hamburg,  
published and posted in Hamburg, may be sent  
from thence to the British colonies and foreign.
