The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provi- "sion for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventh day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the chapelries of Chapel Allerton and Headingley, in the parish of Leeds, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part

thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said chapelries of Chapel Allerton and Headingley are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of each of such chapelries hereinafter mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be together constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said chapelry of Chapel Allerton, and also all that part of the said chapelry of Headingly, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be together constituted a separate district for

spiritual purposes accordingly, and that the same shall be named, "The District of Meanwood."

" And whereas Mary Beckett and Elizabeth Beckett, both of Meanwood-park, in the county of York, spinsters, have transferred to our account and to our names in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, a sum of Three Pounds per Centum Consolidated Bank Annuities, sufficient to produce the annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, for the permanent endowment of the minister of the district herein recommended to be constituted. and so soon as such district shall have become, according to the provisions of the said Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, of the perpetual curate thereof; we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year, to such minister or perpetual curate for the time being of the said district or new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such perpetual curate as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish:

"And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority aforesaid, at any time to assign the right of patronage of any such district or new parish as aforesaid, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity, or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation aggregate or sole, or to either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon

condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion and in such manner as shall be approved by the like authority:

"And whereas, in addition to the benefaction hereinbefore mentioned, it is the intention of the said Mary Beckett and Elizabeth Beckett to contribute largely towards providing a church or chapel within the said district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and also a house of residence for such minister; and it has been proposed to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that, in consideration of the contributions aforesaid, the patronage of the said district or new parish should be assigned in manner hereinafter mentioned:

"We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that the right of patronage of and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate to the said district or new parish of Meanwood shall be assigned to, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Mary Beckett and Elizabeth Beckett, or their assigns, or by the survivor of them, the said Mary Beckett and Elizabeth Beckett, or the heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns of such survivor, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" The district of Meanwood, being-

"All that part of the chapelry of Chapel Allerton, and also all that part of the chapelry of Headingley, in the parish of Leeds, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the north eastern boundary of the township of Headingley cum Burley, in the said parish, where such boundary is crossed

by Bentley beck, and thence extending towards the north east along the middle of such beck, as far as the middle of the bridge carried across the said beck in Stainbeck-lane, and thence towards the north west along the middle of the said lane to a point (marked b as aforesaid) opposite to the southern corner of the garden attached to Laurel cottage, the property of Joseph Henry Oates, of Meanwood aforesaid, Esq. and thence towards the north east across the said lane and along the south eastern boundary of the said garden, and of a certain close of land and plantation adjoining thereto (which close of land and plantation were, together with the garden, comprised in one close called the Allotment), and continuing in the same direction along the south eastern boundaries of four other closes of land, called respectively the Allotment, Eight Acres, House Close, and Low Oaks, as far as the eastern angle of such last-mentioned close, and thence towards the north west along the north eastern boundary of the same close and of two other closes, called respectively Herding and House Garth, and also the property of the said Joseph Henry Oates, as far as the middle of a certain public highway called Stonegate, and thence towards the north east along the middle of such public highway to a point (marked c as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of King-lane, otherwise called Allwoodley-road, and thence towards the north west along the middle of such last-mentioned lane or road as far as the northern boundary of the said parish of Leeds, and thence westward and northward along such last-mentioned boundary as far as the middle of the old turnpike road leading from Otley to Leeds, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such turnpike road to a point (marked d as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Spen-lane, and thence southward along the middle of such lastmentioned lane to a point (marked e as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of the public highway leading from such lane to the Leeds and Otley turnpike road aforesaid, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such last-mentioned public highway and of the said Leeds and Otley turnpike road to a point (marked f as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of the public footpath leading from such turnpike road to Weetwoodlane, and thence towards the east across the said

turnpike road, and along the middle of such public footpath as far as the middle of the highway leading from Headingley to Addle, and thence southward along the middle of such last-mentioned highway to a point (marked g as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Hollin-lane, and thence towards the east along the middle of such last-mentioned lane to the boundary of the said township of Headingley cum Burley, and thence towards the south and south east along the boundary of such township, to the point where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patrons of the church of the parish, and to the incumbents and patron of the churches or chapels of the chapelries, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such incumbents and patrons have consented to the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to authorize the division of the "parish and vicarage of Leeds, in the county of

"York, into several parishes and vicarages," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An "Act to authorize the division of the parish and "vicarage of Leeds, in the county of York, into "several parishes and vicarages," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for setting out, constituting and annexing a district for spiritual purposes to the church or chapel of Saint Mary, Hunslet, in the said parish of Leeds.

"Whereas it was by the said Act enacted, that it should be lawful, by the authority in certain Acts therein recited, provided, that is to say, by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, by a scheme or schemes prepared by us according to the provisions of the same Acts, and by your Majesty in Council, by an Order or Orders ratifying the same, according to the like provisions, at such time or times, and from time to time, as by such authority should be deemed expedient, to set out and constitute and to annex to any and every church or chapel already duly consecrated within the limits of the existing parish of Leeds, but in each and every such case with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, and of the trustees of the advowson of the vicarage of Leeds, a district for spiritual purposes, within such boundaries as by the like authority might be considered to be most suitable and convenient, and for that purpose to vary the boundaries of any district then subsisting; and the same Act contained a proviso for postponing the operation of any such scheme and Order, in the case of a church or chapel then consecrated, till the next vacancy thereof, unless with the consent of the incumbent thereof then in possession:

"And whereas it was by the same Act provided and enacted, that a district should not be annexed, under the foregoing provisions, to any such church or chapel, unless or until the nave or body thereof should be or should have been made free for the use of the inhabitants of such district

(subject to the order and disposal of the ordinary), nor unless or until a house of residence for the incumbent of such church or chapel should have been provided, or the means of providing the same should have been secured to the satisfaction of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and the bishop of the diocese; but it was in the same Act provided, that if any difficulty or impediment should be found or arise, by reason whereof the nave or body of any such church or chapel could not be made entirely free as aforesaid, it should be lawful for the bishop of the diocese (if, upon examination into all the circumstances of the case, he should think proper so to do) to order and direct, that a district might be annexed to any such church or chapel, although some part or parts of the nave or body, not exceeding one twentieth part thereof, should not be or have been made free as aforesaid:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us, that the entire floor or body of the said church or chapel of Saint Mary, Hunslet, is free for the use of the inhabitants of the district herein recommended to be constituted and annexed to the said church or chapel of Saint Mary, Hunslet, with the exception of two pews, which are intended to be made free; and the means of providing a house of residence for the incumbent of the said church have been secured to the satisfaction of ourselves and the Bishop of Ripon:

"And whereas no ecclesiastical district has yet been legally assigned to the said church or chapel, and it has been represented to us, that it would be, and it appears to us and the said bishop to be expedient, that a district, comprised within the boundaries hereinafter specified, should be forthwith set out and constituted and annexed to the said church or chapel:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recomend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, and of the Reverend John Clark, Clerk, the present incumbent of the said church or chapel of Saint Mary, Hunslet, in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme, and also with the consent of the parrons of the church of Saint Peter, Leeds, in testimony whereof they have hereunto affixed their common seal, that all that part of the parish of Leeds, comprised within the boundaries or limits of the township of Hunslet, in

same parish,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto annexed,-shall be forthwith constituted and annexed to the said church or chapel of Saint Mary, Hunslet, in the said parish of Leeds, so as fully to entitle the said church or chapel, and such district so annexed thereto, and the present and every future incumbent thereof, to all the benefits, rights, privileges, advantages and attributes accruing and attaching thereto under the provisions of the same Act; and that the nave or body of the said church or chapel, with the exception of the two pews aforesaid, and so soon as such pews shall have been made free, then the entire nave and body of the said church or chapel shall be for ever free for the use of the inhabitants of the said district (subject to the order and disposal of the ordinary); and the house of residence to be provided for the incumbent as aforesaid, when so provided and approved by the bishop of the diocese for the time being, under his hand and seal, shall, with its appurtenances, be and for ever remain the house of residence and vicarage of the incumbent and vicar of the same church or chapel, and of the parish and vicarage of Saint Mary, Hunslet.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been duly transmitted to the incumbent of the said parish and vicarage of Leeds, and he has consented thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to carry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ec-" clesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two " several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Com-" missioners for England," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making additional provision for the cure of souls in the parish of Wookey, in the county of Somerset.

"Whereas, under the provisions of the said Acts, the whole of the property now belonging to the dignity or office of sub-dean, in the cathedral church of Wells, which consists chiefly of certain lands, tithes, tenements and hereditaments in the parishes of Wookey and Westbury, in the county of Somerset, will (excepting any right of patronage) upon the first avoidance of such dignity or office become absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, and the chief of such

purposes is that of making additional provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required:

"And whereas it is by the same Acts enacted, that by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement may, from time to time, be made, with the consent in writing under the hand of any dignitary or officer of any cathedral church, for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments belonging to such dignitary or officer, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes or other hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting, in any case, any lands, tithes or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes or other hereditaments:

"And whereas the said parish of Wookey is much in need of additional provision for the cure of souls therein, and a church has been recently erected and completed within the said parish:

"And whereas it has been agreed between us and the Reverend Charles Edmund Ruck Keene, the present Sub-dean of the said cathedral church of Wells, that the following arrangement should be recommended by us to your Majesty in Council:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Charles Edmund Ruck Keene, testified by his having signed this scheme, that upon and after the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council for ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, all lands, tithes, tenements and hereditaments whatsoever (except any right of patronage) now annexed or belonging to or forming any part of the endowment of the aforesaid dignity or office of sub-dean of the said cathedral church of Wells, or to or in which the said Charles Edmund Ruck Keene, as such sub-dean, has or ought to have any right, title or interest, shall, together with all right, title and interest therein, without any assurance in the law other than this scheme, and such Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same so published as aforesaid, be and be held to be for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed from and by the said Charles Edmund Ruck Keene to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely

vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, subject only to any legally subsisting lease or leases thereof, or of any part or parts thereof, and that, in consideration of and for such transfer as aforesaid, there shall be paid by us for ever hereafter to the incumbent or minister for the time being of the said new church in the said parish of Wookey, so soon as the said church shall have been duly consecrated, and an ecclesiastical disdistrict shall have been legally assigned thereto, the annual sum of one hundred pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year, and that a payment shall be made on such one of the said two days of payment as shall next follow the day upon which a district shall have been so legally assigned as aforesaid, the amount of such payment being such sum as shall bear a full proportion according to the annual rate aforesaid to the period which shall at the time of such payment have elapsed from the day of the consecration of the said church; and that in the case of a vacancy. hereafter occurring in the incumbency of the said church on any other day than one of the two regular half-yearly days of payment, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the incumbent or minister making the vacancy, or his representatives, and the succeeding incumbent or minister.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Bath and Wells.

HEREAS an Act was passed in the fiftyninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to " carry into effect a convention of commerce " concluded between His Majesty and the United " States of America, and a treaty with the Prince " Regent of Portugal," whereby, after reciting certain provisions contained in certain treaties or conventions, made between His said late Majesty and the United States of America, and between His said late Majesty and the Prince Regent of Portugal, divers provisions were made respecting the duties payable and the bounties and allowances to be granted upon the importation and exportation of goods, wares, and merchandize into or from the United Kingdom in vessels of the United States and in Portuguese vessels, and respecting the repayment to certain corporations, bodies politic and corporate, and sundry other persons, of the amount of the sums of money of which they would be deprived by means of the said Act:

And whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, "An Act for granting duties of intituled "Customs," it is, amongst other things, enacted and declared, that, from and after the ratification of any treaty heretofore made by Her Majesty, and any of Her royal predecessors, subsequently to the said first hereinbefore recited Act, or of any treaty which may hereafter be made by Her. Majesty, Her heirs and successors, with any foreign power, in which treaty have been or shall be contained provisions similar to those recited. in the said first hereinbefore recited Act, all and every the provisions, clauses, matters, and things in the said first hereinbefore recited Act contained, shall apply and extend to the trade and shipping of such foreign powers, respectively, as fully and effectually to all intents and purposes as to the trade and shipping of the said United States and of the said kingdom of Portugal, and also shall apply and extend to differential duties or charges, on goods imported or exported in the ships of such foreign powers as well as to differential duties on the ships of such foreign powers:

And whereas by the last recited Act it is further enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors, by any Order or Orders to be by Her or them made with the advice of Her or their Privy Council, and published in the London Gazette, from time to time to declare what are the foreign powers with which any such treaty or treaties aforesaid is or are subsisting, and that the said recited Acts shall apply and shall be deemed, from the time of the ratification of any such treaties, to have been

applicable to the trade and shipping of such foreign countries as shall be so mentioned in any such Order or Orders in Council as aforesaid, so long as any such Order or Orders shall continue unrevoked, and no longer:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, doth hereby declare, that a treaty has been concluded and is now subsisting between Her Majesty and His Imperial and Royal Highness the Grand Duke of Tuscany:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
