The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council:

WHEREAS Her Majesty doth deem it expedient to appoint the town and port of Portland, in the district of Port Phillip, New South Wales, to be a free warehousing port for the purposes of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of Her reign, intituled "An Act to regulate the "trade of the British possessions abroad :"

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in pursuance of the authority committed to Her by the said Act, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said town and port of Fortland shall, from and after the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, be a free warehousing port for the purposes of the said Act :

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with cer-"tain modifications, the fourth report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Re-"venues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "for enabling ecclesiastical corporations, aggre-"gate and sole, to grant leases for long terms of "years," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the

twentieth day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act " to carry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ec-" clesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act for enabling eccle-" clesiastical corporations, aggregate and sole, to " grant leases for long terms of years," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, relating to a lease of minerals about to be granted by the Reverend James Hughes, Clerk, Rector of the parish of Llanhileth, in the county of Monmouth, and diocese of Llandaff, and to make better provision for the cure of souls within the said parish.

"Whereas by the secondly-recited Act it was enacted, that, in case of any lease of mines, minerals, quarries, or beds granted thereunder, such portion of the improved value accruing under such lease, as by the authority provided in the first-recited Act should be determined, not being more than three fourth parts nor less than one moiety of such improved value, should forthwith, and from time to time as the same should accrue, be paid to us, and should be subject to the provisions relating to monies payable to us :

"And whereas, in pursuance of the same Act, it is proposed by the said James Hughes, as such Rector as aforesaid, to grant and demise, by lease, the minerals lying under certain lands, part of the glebe lands of his said rectory, and situate at Cwmtylery, in the said county; and the improved value to accrue under such lease will, according to the meaning of the same Act, be the whole net amount of the reservation or reservations to be made therein:

"And whereas it is by the said first-recited Act enacted, that, except as therein otherwise specified (which exception does not include the matters to which this scheme relates), all the monies and revenues to be paid to us by and under the authority of the same Act, together with all accumulations of interest produced by and arising therefrom, shall be from time to time carried over by us to a common fund, and by payments or investments, made out of such fund, additional provision shall be made, by the authority therein provided, for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required, in such manner as shall, by the like authority, be deemed most conducive to the efficiency of the Established Church :

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that three fourth parts of the whole net amount of the reservation or reservations to be made in the lease so to be granted as aforesaid, whether consisting of rent, royalty, or otherwise, shall, by such lease, be made directly payable to us; and that we shall have all the like remedies in respect of such three fourth parts of any such reservation as aforesaid as if the same were a separate rent reserved to us as lessors or grantors and reversioners of the premises comprised in such lease, independently of the rights and remedies of the said James Hughes and his successors, Rectors of Llanhileth, in respect of the remaining one fourth part thereof, without any priority or preference between us and the said Rector of Llanhileth for the time being; and, further, that we shall have full benefit and advantage, either jointly with or separately from the said James Hughes and his successors, Rectors of Llanhileth, of all or any of the covenants, conditions, and agreements in the said lease contained on the lessee's part, in like manner as if we had been grantors, lessors, and reversioners as aforesaid, and as in such lease shall be expressed; and that, for effectuating such objects, the said lease shall and may be framed in such manner, and contain all such clauses and provisions, as we shall approve, and shall have full force accordingly, any rule of law, statute, or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

"And whereas the present average income of the said rectory amounts to the sum of one hundred and sixteen pounds by the year, and the population of the said parish is below one thousand, and we deem it expedient that further provision should be made for the cure of souls within the said parish, according to the provisions of the said first-recited Act, and in respect of the monies accruing to us under the said lease :

"We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that from and after the receipt by us of any sum or sums of money under or by virtue of the said lease, and so from time to time, there shall be paid by us to the Rector of Llanhileth for the time being, by equal or proportionate half-yearly payments, as the case may be, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year, such an annual sum as would be equal to the annual amount of the dividends to arise from so much stock as each sum so received by us, after deducting therefrom any costs, charges, or expenses to which we may have been put in respect of the matters herein referred to, would produce if invested on the day of the receipt thereof in the purchase of three pounds per centum consolidated bank annuities; provided always, and we further recommend and propose, that when the annual sum so to be paid by us shall be equal to such an amount as, together with the average income of the said rectory from other sources, will make up the whole average annual income of three hundred pounds, the payment to be thenceforth made by us as aforesaid shall be and continue to be the same annual sum, and no more; and in case of a vacancy in the said rectory happening on any other day than one of such days of payment, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the incumbent making the vacancy, or his personal representatives, and the incumbent succeeding to the said rectory upon such vacancy.

"And we also recommend and propose, that if it shall appear to us to be expedient at any future time that, instead of the annual sum then in course of payment by us to the said Rector for the time being, or instead of any part thereof, any land, tithe, or other hereditament should be conveyed to the said rectory in fee, or any sum of money should be paid by us towards providing a fit house of residence for the Rector thereof, nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing such substitution; provided that no such change shall take effect before the then next vacancy of the said rectory without the written consent of the then existing incumbent thereof.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazeite pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Kegistrar of the diocese of Llandaff.

THE Trustees of the Liverpool Docks and Harbour do hereby give notice, that the following changes in the lighting, beaconing, and buoying of the northern approaches to this port will take place on and after the night of Tuesday the 2d November 1847:

Crosby Lighthouse .--A new light tower has been erected nearly half a mile N. E. by N. of the present Crosby Lighthouse. The light therefrom will be exhibited, for the first time, on the evening of the above date, and be continued every night from sun-set to sun-rise.

The light in this tower will be stationary, of a red colour, elevated 96 feet above the sea at half-tide level, and will be visible between the bearings of S.S. E. and N. E. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. which limits will indicate respectively when a vessel is westward of Mad Wharf, and when she is abreast of the Crosby Light-vessel, and ought to shape

her fairway course up the Crosby Channel. The Formby Light-vessel will be moved 170 fathoms N. by W. 2 W. of her present position, into 35 feet at low water. When brought in a

line with the New Crosby Shore Light, she will lead in from seaward through the Victoria Channel, on a course of S. E. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E.; and when brought in a line with the Crosby Light-yessel, she will lead in through the Half-tide

Swashway, on the bearing of S. S. E. $\frac{3}{2}$ E. Crosby Beacon.—The Crosby Shore Beacon will be moved nearly half a mile N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. of its present position, on a line with the Crosby Shore ight and Formby Light-vessel.

The Bell Beacon will be moved about 170 fathoms S. W. of its present position, into 35 feet at low water, with the Formby Light-vessel and Crosby Shore Light in one, and bearing from the

N. W. Light-ship N. E. ‡ E. four miles. V. 4, Red (Can) Buoy, with Perch, will be moved nearly a quarter of a mile N. W. by N. of its present position, into 21 feet at low water. Formby Light Vessel bearing N. E. by E.
