A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the eleventh day of November next, We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the

said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said eleventh day of November next, to Thursday the eighteenth day of November next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Writ Patent for proroguing the same accordingly: and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Thursday the eighteenth day of November next, assemble and be held and sit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Thursday the eighteenth day of November next.

Given at Our Court, at *Windsor*, this thirtieth day of *October*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and in the eleventh year of Our reign.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session holden in the ninth and tenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the more easy recovery of small debts and demands in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, that the judges, clerks, bailiffs, and officers of the courts holden under the said Act, or any of them, shall be paid by salaries instead of fees, or in any manner other than is provided by the said Act :

And whereas by the said Act it is also enacted, that any Order in Council made for the purposes of the said Act shall be published in the London Gazette, and notice of the intention of Her Majesty to take into consideration the propriety of making any such Order shall be published in the London Gazette, one calendar month at least, before any such Order shall be made :

And whereas Her Majesty has been pleased this day to refer the consideration of the said Act, and of the Order which it may be proper to make for the purposes of the said Act as before mentioned, to a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and to direct, that the said Committee do report their opinion thereupon to Her Majesty :

Notice is hereby given, that, after the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the publication of this notice in the London Gazette, Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, will take into consideration the propriety of making

an Order, under the provisions of the said Act, for paying the judges, clerks, bailiffs, and officers of the said courts by salaries instead of fees, or in such other manner as may be deemed expedient.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventh day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for the assignment of the right of patronage of the new parish of Saint John, Wednesbury, in the county of Stafford, and in the diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority therein provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), at any time to assign the right of patronage of any district or new parish constituted under the provisions of the said Act, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity or for one or more nomination or nominations to any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole, or to either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons,

or body respectively, upon condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons, contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion and in such manner as shall be approved by the like authority:

“ And whereas by a scheme duly prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council by us, and an Order, ratifying the same, made by your Majesty in Council on the twenty-third day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty four, and duly gazetted, the district of Saint John, Wednesbury, was constituted out of the parish of Wednesbury, in the said county and diocese; and a church having been duly approved by us and consecrated as the church of the said district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, such district has since become, under the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, by the name of “ The New Parish of Saint John, Wednesbury.”

“ And whereas the said scheme and Order contained no provision respecting the right of patronage of the said district or new parish:

“ And whereas by a certain indenture, bearing date the sixth day of August instant, to which we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, are made parties, the Right Honourable Emily Foley, commonly called Lady Emily Foley, of Stoke Edith-park, in the county of Hereford, widow, has duly granted and confirmed to the Reverend John Winter, and his successors, perpetual curates of the said new parish, in perpetual augmentation of the endowment of the said new parish, one undivided moiety of the rent charge or annual sum of two hundred and thirty-five pounds awarded in lieu of the great tithes of the said parish of Wednesbury, and subject to variation pursuant to the provisions in that behalf of the Statutes for or relating to the commutation of tithes in England and Wales, being the entire interest of the said Lady Emily Foley in the said tithes; and it has been proposed to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that, in consideration of such grant, the patronage of the said new parish should be assigned in manner herein-after mentioned; and such grant was made to the

intent and upon the condition that such assignment should be accordingly made:

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that the right of patronage of the said new parish of Saint John, Wednesbury, and the nomination of the perpetual curate thereof, shall be absolutely assigned to, and shall and may, from time to time, hereafter be exercised by the said Lady Emily Foley, her heirs and assigns, for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that subject and without prejudice in any respect to the said preceding recommendation and proposal, and the full operation thereof, nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been duly given in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, and no objection has been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lichfield.

WHEREAS Her Majesty doth deem it expedient to appoint the town and port of *Portland*, in the district of *Port Phillip, New South Wales*, to be a free warehousing port for the

purposes of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of Her reign, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad."

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in pursuance of the authority committed to Her by the said Act, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said town and port of Portland shall, from and after the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, be a free warehousing port for the purposes of the said Act:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Earl Grey, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them respectively may appertain.

Crossford Bridge and Manchester Road.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for leave to bring in a Bill to alter, amend, and enlarge some of the powers and provisions of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the first year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for more effectually maintaining the road from Crossford Bridge to the town of Manchester, in the county palatine of Lancaster, and for making a branch road to communicate therewith;" or to repeal the said Act, and to grant more effectual powers instead thereof; and in such Bill power will be applied for to increase or alter the respective weights permitted to be conveyed upon the said roads in waggons, carts, and other carriages, and to reduce the tolls authorized to be collected in respect of any excess in such weights; and to authorize the collection of tolls in respect of dogs drawing carriages upon the said roads; and notice is hereby further given, that it is intended to restrain the Trustees for executing the said Act from laying out any money on any road, comprised in the said Act, which is situate within the limits of any Act of Parliament passed for the improvement of any city, town, or place, and from restraining the said Trustees from collecting any toll thereon; and also to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from payment of tolls, rates, or duties, and other rights and privileges.
