A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

HEREAS Our Parliament stands prerogued to Thursday the eleventh day of November next, We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the

said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said eleventh day of November next, to Thursday the eighteenth day of November next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Writ Patent for proroguing the same accordingly: and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Thursday the eighteenth day of November next, assemble and be held and sit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Thursday the eighteenth day of November next.

Given at Our Court, at Windsor, this thirtieth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fortyseven, and in the eleventh year of Our reign.

HEREAS a Treaty has been concluded between Her Majesty and His Majesty the King of Hanover, whereby due protection has been secured within the dominions of Hanover for the authors of books, dramatic works, or musical compositions, and the inventors, designers, engravers of prints and articles of sculpture, and the authors, inventors, designers, or engravers of any other works whatsoever of literature and the fine arts, in which the laws of Great Britain and of Hanover do now or may hereafter give their respective subjects the privilege of copyright, and for the lawful representatives or assigns of any such authors, inventors, designers, or engravers, with regard to any such works first published within the dominions of Her Majesty:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Her by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of Her reign, intituled " An Act to amend the law relating to international "copyright," doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers of any of the following works (that is to say), books, prints, articles of sculpture, dramatic works, musical compositions, and any other works of literature and the fine arts, in which the laws of Great Britain give to British subjects the privilege of copyright, and the executors, administrators, and assigns of such authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers, respectively, shall, as respects works first published within the kingdom of Hanover, after the twenty-eighth day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, have the privilege of copyright therein for a period equal to the term of copyright which authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers of the like works, respectively, first published in the United Kingdom are by law entitled to, provided such books, dramatic pieces, musical compositions, prints, articles of sculpture, or other works of art have been

T the Court at Windsor, the 30th day of according to the requirements of the said recited Act, within twelve months after the first publication thereof in any part of the said kingdom:

> And it is hereby further ordered, that the authors of dramatic pieces and musical compositions which shall, after the said twenty-eighth day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, be first publicly represented or performed within the said kingdom, shall have the sole liberty of representing or performing in any part of the British dominions such dramatic pieces or musical compositions, during a period equal to the period during which authors of dramatic pieces and musical compositions first publicly represented or performed in the United Kingdom are entitled by law to the sole liberty of representing or performing the same; provided such dramatic pieces or musical compositions have been registered, and copies thereof have been delivered according to the requirements of the said recited Act, within twelve calendar months after the time of their being first represented or performed in any part of the said kingdom:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary orders herein accordingly.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled " An Act to amend an Act of the seventh " and eighth years of Her present Majesty, for " reducing, under certain circumstances, the " duties payable upon books and engravings," it is enacted, that whenever Her Majesty has, by virtue of the authority vested in Her for that purpose, declared, that the authors, inventors, designers, engravers, or makers of any books, prints, or other works of art, first published in any foreign country or countries, shall have the privilege of copyright therein, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, if she think fit, from time to registered, and copies thereof have been delivered time, by an Order in Council, to declare that,



from and after a day to be named in such Order, in lieu of the duties of Customs from time to time payable on the importation into the United Kingdom of books, prints, and drawings, there shall be payable only such duties of Customs as are mentioned in the said Act:

And whereas Her Majesty hath this day, by virtue of the authority vested in Her for that purpose, declared that the authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers of books, prints, and certain other works of art, first published within the dominions of Hanover, shall have the privilege of copyright therein:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Act, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the day of the date of this Order, in lieu of the duties of Customs now payable upon books, prints, and drawings, published at any place within the said kingdom, there shall be payable only the duties of Customs following (that is to say):

On books originally produced in the United Kingdom, and republished at any place within the said kingdom, a duty of two pounds ten shillings per hundred weight.

On books published or republished at any place within the said kingdom, and not being books originally produced in the United Kingdom, a duty of fifteen shillings per hundred weight.

On prints and drawings, plain or coloured, published at any place within the said kingdom,

Single, each, -Bound or sewn, the dozen, 1 d.

street, or some of them, in the parishes of St. | Olave Hart-street, St. Katherine Coleman, Allhallows Staining, and Allhallows Barking, or some of them, in the city of London; and also for powers to make and maintain the following branch railways (that is to say), a branch railway, from and out of the London and Blackwall Railway, at or near to White Lion-street otherwise Lemanstreet, in the parish of St. Mary Matfelon otherwise Whitechapel, in the county of Middlesex, passing thence through or into the parishes and places of St. Botolph Without Aldgate, the Tower liberties and precints, St Katherine near the Tower, and St. John of Wapping, or some of them, in the county of Middlesex, and terminating in or near the London Docks, in the said parish of St. John of Wapping; also a branch railway, from and out of such last-mentioned branch railway, at or near to the street called Upper East Smithfield, in the said parishes of St. John of Wapping and St. Botolph Without Aldgate, or one of them, and terminating in or near the St. Katherine's Docks, in the last-mentioned parish. And that it was also intended to alter the levels of part of the London and Blackwall Extension Railway, at or near its junction with the Eastern Counties Railway, in the parish of St. Mary Stratford-le-Bow, in the county of Middlesex.

And whereas, in pursuance of the aforesaid notices, application was made to Parliament in the last session for a Bill comprising the aforesaid works and objects, except the last-mentioned alteration of levels of part of the London and Blackwall Extension Railway, and under the authority of the resolutions of the Right Honourable the House of Lords and of the Honourable the House of Commons, dated, respectively, the tenth day of June last, the said Bill was suspended in the Right Honourable the House of Lords, at the close of the last session.

And whereas such Bill was intitutled "An Act to amend the Acts relating to the London and Blackwall Railway, and to authorize the Company to alter the guage of their railway, and to make certain improvements in the approaches to the said railway, and to make branches to the London and St. Katherine's Docks;" and the short title thereof was "London and Blackwall Railway improvement and branches to the St. Katherine's and London Docks."
