Her Majesty has also been pleased to appoint P. A. Ganteaume, Esq. to be Registrar General for the island of Trinidad.

Her Majesty has further been pleased to appoint William Gillam, Esq. to be Registrar and Secretary, Clerk of the Enrolments, and Clerk of the Council, for the island of Dominica.

We, the undersigned, being three of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby, under the authority of an Act, passed in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs," appoint Cardiff, Swansea, Llanelly, Milford, Cardigan, and Aberystwith, to be ports, in that part of the United Kingdom called Wales; and we do hereby declare, that the limits of the port of Cardiff shall commence at Redwick-pill, in the county of Monmouth, and continue along the coast of the said county, and also that of Glamorganshire to a place, called Nash-point, in the latter county; that the limits of the port of Swansea shall commence at Nash-point aforesaid, and con-

tinue along the coast of Glamorganshire to Worms-head, and from thence to Whitford-point, in the said county :

That the port of Llanelly shall commence at Whitford-point, in Glamorganshire, including the whole of the Burry river, and continue from that river along the coast of Carmarthenshire to Sandersfoot, being the western extremity of the county of Carmarthen :

That the port of Milford shall commence at Sandersford aforesaid, and continue along the coast to a place, called Saint Justinian's Chapel, near St. David's Head, in the county of Pembroke, including Milford Haven :

That the port of Cardigan shall commence at Saint Justinian's Chapel aforesaid, and continue along the coast of Pembrokeshire and Cardiganshire to a place, called New Quay Head, in the latter county :

That the port of Aberystwith shall commence at New Quay Head aforesaid, and continue along the coasts of Cardiganshire and Merionethshire to the north bank of the river Dyssyn, being the southern limits of the port of Caernarvon :

And we, the said Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury do further declare, that the limits seaward of the said several ports shall extend to a distance of three miles from low water mark out to sea, and that the limits of the before-mentioned ports shall include all islands, bays, harbours, rivers, and creeks within the same respectively :

And we, the said Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby annul all former limits of the said ports.
