The Speech of the Lords Commissioners to | both Houses of Parliament, on Tuesday, November 23, 1847.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

ER Majesty has ordered us to declare to you the causes which have induced Her to call Parliament together at the present time.

Her Majesty has seen with great concern the distress which has for some time prevailed among the commercial classes. The embarrassments of trade were at one period aggravated by so general a feeling of distrust and of alarm, that Her Majesty, for the purpose of restoring confidence, authorized Her Ministers to recommend to the Directors of the Bank of England a course of proceeding suited to such an emergency. This course might have led to an infringement of the

enabled to inform you that the law has not been infringed, that the alarm has subsided, and that the pressure on the banking and commercial interests has been mitigated.

The abundant harvest with which this country has been blessed has alleviated the evils which always accompany a want of employment in the manufacturing districts. Her Majesty has, however, to lament the recurrence of severe distress in some parts of Ireland, owing to the scarcity of the usual food of the people. Her Majesty trusts that this distress will be materially relieved by the exertions which have been made to carry into effect the law of the last session of Parliament for the support of the destitute poor. Her Majesty has learnt with satisfaction that landed proprietors have taken advantage of the means placed at their disposal for the improvement of land.

Her Majesty laments that in some counties of Her Majesty has great satisfaction in being Ireland atrocious crimes have been committed

and a spirit of insubordination has manifested itself, leading to an organized resistance to legal rights.

The Lord Lieutenant has employed with vigour and energy the means which the law places at his disposal to detect offenders, and to prevent the repetition of offences. Her Majesty feels it, however, to be Her duty to Her peaceable and well-disposed subjects to ask the assistance of Parliament in taking further precautions against the perpetration of crime in certain counties and districts in Ireland.

Her Majesty views with the deepest anxiety and interest the present condition of Ireland, and she recommends to the consideration of Parliament measures, which, with due regard to the rights of property, may advance the social condition of the people, and tend to the permanent improvement of that part of the United Kingdom.

Her Majesty has seen with great concern the breaking out of civil war in Switzerland.

Her Majesty is in communication with Her Allies on this subject, and has expressed Her readiness to use, in concert with them, Her friendly influence for the purpose of restoring to the Swiss Confederation the blessings of peace.

Her Majesty looks with confidence to the maintenance of the general peace of Europe.

Her Majesty has concluded with the Republic of the Equator a treaty for the suppression of the slave trade.

Her Majesty has given directions that this treaty should be laid before you.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

Her Majesty has given directions that the estimates for the next year should be prepared, for the purpose of being laid before you. They will be framed with a careful regard to the exigencies of the public service.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

Her Majesty recommends to the consideration of Parliament the laws which regulate the navigation of the United Kingdom, with a view to ascertain whether any changes can be adopted, which, without danger to our maritime strength, may promote the commercial and colonial interests of the empire.

Her Majesty has thought fit to appoint a Commission to report on the best means of im-

proving the health of the metropolis; and Her Majesty recommends to your earnest attention such measures as will be laid before you relating to the public health.

Her Majesty has deeply sympathized with the sufferings which afflict the labouring classes in the manufacturing districts in Great Britain and in many parts of Ireland, and has observed with admiration the patience with which these sufferings have been generally borne.

The distress which has lately prevailed among the commercial classes has affected many important branches of the revenue; but Her Majesty trusts that the time is not distant when, under the blessing of Divine Providence, the commerce and industry of the United Kingdom will have resumed their wonted activity.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further amendment of the "church building Acts," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in that behalf vested in them under the church building Acts, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, viz.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building | new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parishes of Worplesdon, Ash, and Wanborough, severally situate in the county of Surrey, and within the diocese of Winchester, it appears to them to be expedient to unite certain contiguous parts of the said parishes, and to form the same into one consolidated chapelry, for all ecclesiastical purposes, for the consecrated church of Saint Mark, at Wyke, in the said parish of Worplesdon, under or by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign intituled " An Act for the further amendment of "the church building Acts," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners under the church building Acts, and that such consolidated chapelry should be called, "The Consolidated Chapelry of Wyke;" and that it should consist of the hamlet of Wyke, which is a detached portion of the said parish of Worplesdon, and such portions of the adjoining parishes of Ash and Wanborough as lie between the said hamlet of Wyke and the remaining part of the parish of Worplesdon; the boundary of such consolidated chapelry commencing at a bound stone placed on the north west side of Henleypark, on the boundary line separating the parishes of Pirbright and Ash, and to proceed in a straight line south westerly from that bound stone to another placed on the boundary line separating the said hamlet of Wyke from the said parish of Ash, and from the last-mentioned bound stone to proceed along such boundary line northerly, westerly, and southerly, until it reaches the boundary line separating the said hamlet of Wyke from the parish of Wanborough, along which said boundary it proceeds south easterly and north easterly until it reaches the road leading from Ash to Down Farm and Compton, and then proceeds along the southern side of that road easterly until it meets the boundary line of the parishes of Worplesdon and Wanborough, and then proceeds northerly and north westerly along the said boundary until it meets the parish of Ash, and continuing along the boundary of the parishes of Ash and Worplesdon northerly and north easterly

to the point where the boundary line of the parishes of Pirbright, Worplesdon, and Ash meet, and then to continue along the boundary of the parishes of Ash and Pirbright south westerly and north westerly as far as the point where the first bound stone is placed north west of Henly-park, as such consolidated chapelry is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink, green, and yellow:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that, with the approbation of your Majesty's said Commissioners, and also with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Richard Lord Bishop of Winchester, as the Bishop of the diocese, it has been mutually agreed between the Provost and College of the Blessed Mary of Eton, near unto Windsor, in the county of Bucks, as the patrons of the parish church of the said parish of Worplesdon, the Warden and Scholars of Saint Mary Winton College, near Winchester, in the county of Southampton, as the patrons of the parish church of the said parish of Ash, and Frederick Mangles, Charles Edward Mangles, and Albert Mangles, Esquires, as the devisees, in trust, of James Mangles, Esq. deceased, and as such devisees the patrons, in trust, of the parish church whenever one shall be built and consecrated in the said parish of Wanborough, that the right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to serve the said church of Saint Mark and consolidated chapelry of Wyke should belong to and be exercised (whenever occasion may require) by the Reverend George Bethell, the present Rector or Incumbent of the said parish and parish church of Worplesdon, during such time only as he shall continue to be the Rector or Incumbent thereof; and that, upon his resigning or otherwise avoiding the said parish church of Worplesdon, the said right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to serve the said church of Saint Mark and consolidated chapelry, of Wyke should for ever thereafter belong to and be exercised (whenever occasion may require) by the Provost and College of the Blessed Mary of Eton, near unto Windsor, in the county of Bucks:

"That the consents of the said Charles Richard Lord Bishop of Winchester, as Bishop of the diocese, and of the said patrons of the said three parishes, have also been severally obtained to the formation of such proposed consolidated chapelry, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Charles Richard Lord Bishop of Winchester has signed and sealed this representation, and the said Provost and College, and Warden and Scholars, have affixed their respective common seals hereto, and the said Frederick Mangles, Charles Edward Mangles, and Albert Mangles, have severally signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof; and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed formation into one consolidated chapelry be accordingly made, and the agreement, in respect of the right of presentation or appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to serve the said church and consolidated chapelry, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

Truro Turnpike Roads.

(Continuation and Extension of Trust, and Formation of new Road, with powers to vest certain Roads in the Trustees; to surrender part of an old Turnpike Road; and to amend several Acts of Parliament.

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for an Act or Acts to continue the Trust established by an Act of Parliament, passed in the ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, cap. 3, and inttituled "An Act for making, repairing, and improving certain roads leading to and from Truro, in the county of Cornwall;" and to enable the Trustees of, or acting under the said Act, to make and construct a new road, with proper
