

We, the undersigned, being three of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby, under the authority of an Act, passed in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs," appoint the following place, within the port of Ipswich, to be a legal quay for the lading and unlading of goods, and do hereby declare the bounds and extents of such quay to be as follows, that is to say, from a stone marked "Legal Quay," erected near the north side of Stokebridge, one thousand one hundred and forty feet to the Custom-house at Ipswich, and from thence, extending along the bank of the wet dock to the gas house, two thousand feet, and from the said gas house, along the bank of the said wet dock to the embankment at the east end thereof, nine hundred feet, and no further.
