The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of

another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for substituting a money payment to the Prebendary of the prebend of Barnby, in the cathedral church of York, for the property belonging to him as such Prebendary.

"Whereas, by and under the provisions of the said Acts, the whole of the separate estates and endowments belonging to the said Prebendary, as such, will (excepting any right of patronage), upon the first avoidance of his prebend, become absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, and the chief of such purposes is that of making better provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required:

"And whereas it was by the same Acts enacted, that, by the authority therein provided, and for the purposes of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement might, from time to time, be made, with the consent, in writing, under the hand of any canon or prebendary of any cathedral church for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments belonging to him as such, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes or other hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting in any case any lands, tithes or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes or other hereditaments:

"And whereas an agreement was entered into, on the thirteenth day of August last, between us and the Reverend Charles Hawkins, the present Prebendary of the said prebend of Barnby, otherwise Barnby upon the Moor, that the following arrangement should be recommended by us to your Majesty in Council, with a view to sooner carrying into effect the purpose of the said recited Acts hereinbefore particularly mentioned :

"We, therefore, with the consent of the said Charles Hawkins, testified by his having signed this scheme, humbly recommend and propose that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law, other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and after the day of such gazetting, all lands, tithes, tenements and other hereditaments and endowments whatsoever (except the prebendal house, situate in Stonegate, in the city of York, mentioned in the said agreement and any right of patronage) now belonging to the said Charles Hawkins as such Prebendary as aforesaid, or to or in which, as such, he has or ought to have any title or interest, shall, together with all right, title and interest therein (except as aforesaid), be and be held to be, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed by and from the said Charles Hawkins to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, subject only to any legally subsisting lease or leases thereof or of any part or parts thereof; and that, in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance, there shall be paid by us to the said Charles Hawkins, on the third day next after the day of the gazetting of the said Order of your Majesty in Council, the sum of eight hundred pounds of lawful money of Great Britain, with interest thereon, at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum, from the said thirteenth day of August last, according to the tenor and upon the terms of the agreement aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.

[Incorporation of Cemetery Company, with power to compound for Tolls over Dee Bridges.]

NOTICE is hereby given, that an application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present session, for leave to bring in a Bill to authorise the establishment of a burial ground or cemetery for the burial of the dead, with chapels and other buildings, and all proper approaches and other conveniences connected therewith, in the parish of Saint Mary on the Hill, in the city of Chester, which said proposed burial ground or cemetery, chapels, and other buildings are intended to be erected and constructed in or upon certain pieces or parcels of land, gardens, and houses at Overleigh, in the said parish, and belonging to the Most Honourable Richard Marquess of West-

minster, and the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the city of Chester; and which said pieces or parcels of land, gardens, and houses are bounded on the north by the shore road along the south bank of the river Dee; on the south by the old turnpike road leading from Chester to Northop, and the plantation at the foot thereof; on the east by a certain road or lane leading to the river Dee out of the said old turnpike road from Chester to Northop; and on the west by the road and embankment forming the south approach to the Grosvenor Bridge, over the said river Dee.

And it is also intended by the said proposed Bill to incorporate a company for the purpose of carrying the said undertaking into effect, and to confer upon the said company power to purchase, by compulsion or agreement, and to hold the said pieces or parcels of land, gardens, and houses, and also to vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges connected with the said pieces or parcels of land, gardens, and houses, which would interfere with the purposes aforesaid.

And it is also intended by the said proposed Bill to confer upon the same company power to levy, demand, and receive fees and other payments in respect of the said burial ground or cemetery and other works, and also to enable the said company to borrow and raise money for all or any of the purposes aforesaid.

And it is also intended to apply for powers to enable the Bishop of Chester for the time being, under certain regulations and restrictions, to suspend the further interment of the dead in the church-yards of the several churches in the said city of Chester, or some of them, and to vary or extinguish the rights and privileges of the rectors, vicars, perpetual curates, and incumbents of the parish churches within the said city of Chester, and of all other persons interested therein, in regard to mortuaries and other fees and payments now payable on account of burials therein, and to make compensation in respect thereof.

And it is also intended by the said proposed Bill to alter, amend, extend, and enlarge some of the powers and provisions of an Act, passed in the sixth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for erecting an additional bridge over the river Dee, in the city of Chester, and for opening and making convenient roads and approaches thereto, and for taking down and rebuilding the parish church of Saint Bridget, within the said city, and for repairing the present bridge over the river Dee." And also of an Act, passed in the second year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for extending the time for completing the additional bridge over the river Dee, in the city of Chester." And to enable the Commissioners, acting under and in execution of the powers of the said Acts, to compound with the said company for any tolls payable in respect of horses and carriages travelling over the said bridge, called Grosvenor Bridge, constructed under the powers contained in the

said Acts, and the Old Chester Bridge over the said river Dee, to and from the said intended burial ground or cemetery. And also to confer, vary, and extinguish other rights and privileges.—Dated this 8th day of December 1847.
