HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held în the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with "certain modifications, the fourth report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and " Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to explain and amend two several Acts relating " to the Ecclesiastical Commis-ioners for England, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications,

T the Court at Windsor, the 22d day of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend " two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical "Commissioners for England," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for substituting a money payment to the Prebendary of the prebend of Barnby, in the cathedral church of York, for the property belonging to him as such Prebendary.

> " Whereas, by and under the provisions of the said Acts, the whole of the separate estates and endowments belonging to the said Prebendary, as such, will (excepting any right of patronage), upon the first avoidance of his prebend, become absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, and the chief of such purposes is that of making better provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required:

"And whereas it was by the same Acts enacted. that, by the authority therein provided, and for the purposes of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement might, from time to time, be made, with the consent, in writing, under the hand of any canon or prebendary of any cathedral church for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments belonging to him as such, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes or other hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting in any case any lands, tithes or other hereditaments "the fourth report of the Commissioners of for any money payment, or any money payment Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of for any lands, tithes or other hereditaments:

" And whereas an agreement was entered into, on the thirteenth day of August last, between us and the Reverend Charles Hawkins, the present Prebendary of the said prebend of Barnby, otherwise Barmby upon the Moor, that the following arrangement should be recommended by us to your Majesty in Council, with a view to sooner carrying into effect the purpose of the said recited Acts hereinbefore particularly mentioned:

We, therefore, with the consent of the said Charles Hawkins, testified by his having signed this scheme, humby recommend and propose that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law, other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and after the day of such gazetting, all lands, tithes, tenements and other hereditaments and endowments whatsoever (except the prebendal house, situate in Stonegate, in the city of York, mentioned in the said agreement and any right of patronage) now belonging to the said Charles Hawkins as such Prebendary as aforesaid, or to or in which, as such, he has or ought to have any title or interest, shall, together with all right, title and interest therein (except as aforesaid), be and be held to be, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed by and from the said Charles Hawkins to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, subject only to any legally subsisting lease or leases thereof or of any part or parts thereof; and that, in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance, there shall be paid by us to the said Charles Hawkins, on the third day next after the day of the gazetting of the said Order of your Majesty in Council, the sum of eight hundred pounds of lawful money of Great Britain, with interest thereon, at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum, from the said thirteenth day of August last, according to the tenor and upon the terms of the agreement aforesaid,

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for " carrying into effect the reports of the Commis-" sioners appointed to consider the state of the " Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into " effect, with certain modifications, the fourth " report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, respecting the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty in Council, bearing date the fifth day of October one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, duly made, registered, and gazetted, under the first-recited Act, all that part of the county of York, which then formed part of the archdeaconry of Richmond, was separated from the diocese of Chester, and was included in the diocese of

Ripon:

"And whereas by the said first recited Act it was provided, that the existing deanries and archdeacouries should be newly arranged, so that every parish and extra-parochial place should be within a rural deanry, and every deanry within an archdeaconry, and that no archdeaconry should extend beyond the limits of one diocese:

" And whereas by the secondly recited Act it was enacted, that in any case in which it should . appear upon the representation of the bishop to.

 $\mathfrak{J}^{n}:=\{a^{n}: j \in \mathfrak{I}^{n}\}$ be proper to divide any archdeaconry or rural deanry on account of the magnitude thereof or any other peculiar circumstances connected therewith, such archdeaconry or rural deanry might, by the authority in the same Act provided, be divided into two or more portions, and each of such portions might be constituted a separate archdeaconry or rural deanry, as the case might be, and a district might be assigned thereto; provided always, that no such division should be made without the consent of the bishop, under his hand and

" And whereas by the said first recited Act it was also enacted, that it should be competent to us to propose in any scheme prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council, under the provisions thereof, that all parishes, churches, or chapelries locally situate in any diocese, but subject to any peculiar jurisdiction other than the jurisdiction of the bishop of the diocese in which the same were locally situate, should be only subject to the jurisdiction of the bishop of the diocese in which

the same were locally situate:

"And whereas a portion of the deanry of Kirkby Lonsdale is within that part of the archdeaconry of Richmond, which was so as aforesaid -separated from the said diocese of Chester and included in the said diocese of Ripon, and it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon that it would be and we deem it to be expedient, that such portion should be constituted a separate deanry, and we further deem it expedient that all peculiar and exempt jurisdictions within the said diocese of Ripon should be abolished:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that that portion of the deanry of Kirkhy Lonsdale, which is included in the diocese of Ripon, shall be constituted a separate dearry, and shall be named the dearry of Clapham, in the archdeaconry of

Richmond and diocese of Ripon.

"And we further recommend and propose, that, upon and after the first day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and fortyeight, all parishes and places then locally situate within the limits of the said diocese of Ripon, and of the several archdeaconrics thereof respectively, and all churches and chapels, and the whole clergy and others your Majesty's subjects, locally situate within the limits of such parishes and places respectively, shall, notwithstanding any peculiar or other ecclesiastical jurisdiction or exemption from jurisdiction which any of such parishes, places, churches, chapels or clergy may possess or be subject to, or claim to possess or be subject to, be respectively under and subject only to the jurisdiction and authority of the Bishop of Ripon, and of the Archdeacons of the several archdeaconries of the said diocese of Ripon, within the limits of which they shall respectively be so locally situate, except the cathedral church of Ripon, which shall remain and be subject to the jurisdiction and visitation to which the Majesty the King of the French,

same is now by law subject, and to none. other; and we further recommend and propose, that, with the like exception, all and each of such parishes, places, churches and chapels, so possessing or being subject or claiming to possess or be subject to any such peculiar jurisdiction or exemption from jurisdiction, and all other parishes, places, churches and chapels, locally situate within the diocese of Ripon, shall severally and respectively be included in, and form part of, the said diocese, and of the archdeaconries thereof respectively within the limits of which they shall respectively be so locally situate.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts,

or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.
