

*Legad*, and that these would be reinforced by another Body which was drawing together in order to attack the Imperialists in their Camp near *Turamowitz*; But we have since an account that the said Turkish Forces are gone into their Winter quarters; Count *Coningmark* Velt-Marshal of *Sueden* is going into the Service of the Republick of *Venice*, whose Forces by Land he is to Command next to the Captain General.

*Hamburg*, *Octob. 30*. They write from *Holslein* that the King of *Denmark* having taken a review of his Troops at *Coldingen* and *Itzehoe*, was arrived at *Gluckstadt*, and that his Majesty intended in a day or two to return from thence to *Copenhagen*. The Letters from *Stockholm* give an account of the death of Count *Steinbock* Admiral of *Sueden*. We are told from *Berlin* that they were expecting an Envoy from *Sueden*, with whom it was not doubted but all Matters about the Limits would be finally adjusted.

*Cologne*, *Octob. 30*. It's believed the Imperial Commissioners will in few days, proceed to pronounce Sentence upon *Gulick*, *Sacks* and *Mechowp*, who are Prisoners here; Some of their Party endeavoured two days ago to make a Disturbance in order to their Rescue, for which purpose they got divers of the Commonalty together, but some of them being seized, the rest presently dispersed. We do not yet hear what success the Baron *de Mayerheim* has had in his Negotiation at *Rome*; He is gone from thence for *Paderborne* to confer with that Bishop, and having performed his Commission there, will return with what diligence he can to *Vienna*. The last Letters from *Hungary* informed us, that all that has been said of the surrender of *Caspham* proves to be a mistake; That on the contrary there is a very good Garrison in the place, Commanded by three of *Teckley's* best Officers, and that they seem resolved to defend it to the last.

*Hague*, *Novemb. 2*. The Heer *Heesch*, who was sent by the States General to *Argiers*, *Tunis* and *Tripoli*, to deliver their Presents to those Governments, and to redeem the Subjects of this State, which are there in Slavery, is returned, having performed the first part of his Commission, but not succeeded in the latter, those people demanding for the Redemption of the said Captives, the double of what he had Orders to give. The Baron *de Bodelswojck* sent hither by the Elector of *Brandenburg*, to notice the Birth of his Grand-Son, and to desire the States General to be his God-Fathers, is going back with a present for the young Prince, of two Gold Cups for the value of 5000 Guilders each, and an Order for a yearly Pension of 4000 Guilders in a Gold-Box worth 1000 Guilders. The Heer *Goes*, whom the States have appointed to reside on their part at the Court of *Denmark*, in the place of the Heer *Hoson* deceased, has received his dispatches, and will in few days begin his Journey to *Copenhagen*. The Heer *Van Duyvenwoorden*, the Heer *Van Citters*, and the Heer *Dyckvelt*, returned hither yesterday from *England*, where they have been as Extraordinary Ambassadors from this State; The Heer *Van Citters* having dispatched his private affairs, will go back for *England*, to remain there with the Character of Ambassador. The Deputies of the States General as well as those of the Council of State, are returned from *Scenck Scans*, whither they went to view the *Rhin* and the *Meuse*, in order to the cleansing the said Rivers, and have made their reports to the States General, who it's believed will now give

orders for the taking that work forthwith in hand. Prince *Casimir* Stadtholder of *Friesland* and *Groningen* is expected here towards the middle of this month, about which time it's believed the Prince and Princess of *Orange* will return hither from *Dieren*.

*Paris*, *Octob. 29*. The King as named the Sieur *de Fuvigny*, to go in the quality of his Envoy Extraordinary to the Duke of *Wirtemberg*. The Chancellor lies in so weak a condition that there are little hopes of his recovery. The Ambassador of *Poland* has had a private Audience of his Most Christian Majesty at *Fontainebleau*.

*Paris*, *Novemb. 3*. The 30th of the last month died Messire *Michel le Tellier* Chancellor of *France*, in the 83 year of his Age. The Sieur *Boucherat*, Counsellor of State, is named by the King to succeed him.

*Westminster*, *Octob. 27*. This day *Richard Nelborp*, and *Fohn Ayloff* were brought from *Newgate* to the Kings Bench-Bar, where being asked, What they had to say, why Execution should not be awarded against them, they standing assisted by Counselors of High Treason, for Conspiring the Death of the late King of *Engl. Blessed Memory*, &c. And having nothing to say for themselves, the Court made a Rule that they should be executed on Friday next.
