Bolton, Blackburn, Clitheroe, and West Yorkshire Railway.

NOTICE is hereby given, that, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to give further

time for making certain railways," the Bolton, Blackburn, Clitheroe, and West Yorkshire Railway Company have made application, in writing, to the Commissioners of Railways, setting forth, that the Bolton, Blackburn, Clitheroe, and West Yorkshire Railway Company are desirous that the period of time limited by "The Blackburn, Clitheroe, and North Western Junction Railway Act, 1846," for the completion of the railways and works thereby authorized to be made, should, as to such portion of the said railways, and the works connected therewith, as are situate between the field, numbered on the plans deposited with the respective Clerks of the Peace of the county of Lancaster, and of the west riding of the county of York, 222, in the parish of Whalley, in the said county of Lancaster, and the termination of the railway in the township and parish of Long Preston, in the said west riding of the county of York, and also between the junction with the said last-mentioned railway, in the extra-parochial place of Sawley with Tosside, in the said west riding of the county of York, and the junction or junctions with the Leeds and Bradford Extension Railway, in the township of Elslack, in the parish of Broughton, in the said west riding, be extended for the further period of two years, from the expiration of the period so limited by such Act; and also that the period of time limited by the same Act for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purpose of constructing the said railways and works should, as to such of the lands mentioned and described in the plans of the said railways, and the books of reference thereto, deposited with the respective Clerks of the Peace of the county of Lancaster, and the west riding of the county of York, as are situate within the several parishes, townships, and extra-parochial and other places following (that is to say), Sawley with Tosside, Rimington, Gisburne, Bolton by Bowland otherwise Bolton by Bolland, Paythorne, Halton West, Hellfield, Long Preston, Bracewell, Barnoldswick, Brogden, Martons Both, Coates, Thornton, Thornton in Craven, Broughton, and Elslack, all in the west riding of the county of York; and as to such of the said lands, situate within the said parish of Whalley, as are numbered consecutively from 223 to 331, both inclusive, in the said plans, be extended for the further period of two years, from the expiration of the period so limited by such Act.
