The Gentlemen to wear black coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuff waistcoats, full trimmed, coloured -swords and buckles.

And, on Sunday the 26th instant, the Court to go out of Mourning.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the eards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provi-"sion for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixteenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say : "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parishes of Madron and Saint Paul otherwise Paul, in the county of Cornwall, and in the diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided,

that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided :

"And whereas the said parishes of Madron and Saint Paul otherwise Paul are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular parts of such parishes hereinafter mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be together constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Exeter, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Madron, and also all that part of the said parish of Saint Paul otherwise Paul, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly, and that the same shall be named, "The District of Saint Peter, Newlyn."

" And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to

such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" The district of SAINT PETER, NEWLYN, being-

" All that part of the parish of Madron, in the county of Cornwall and diocese of Exeter, and also all that part of the parish of Saint Paul otherwise Paul, in the same county and diocese, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary. line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map

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or plan hereunto annexed) on the boundary between such parishes, and in the middle of the road from Street-an-nowan to Trereif, and thence extending towards the north west along the middle of such road to the middle of the high road from the Land's End to Penzance, and thence towards the north east along the middle of such lastmentioned road to a point (marked b as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Love-lane, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such lane as far as the Lariggan river, and thence southward following the course of such river as far as the south eastern boundary of the said parish of Madron, and thence towards the south west along such boundary to the eastern boundary of the said parish of Saint Paul otherwise Paul, and thence southward along such last-mentioned boundary to a point (marked c as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a certain lane leading from the road from Mousehole to Newlyn to the orchards and garden ground of Pembroke-lodge, the property of Philip Marrack, Esquire, of Penzance, Banker, and thence westward along the middle of such lane to the western end thereof, and thence towards the north west in a straight direction twelve chains or thereabouts to a point (marked d as aforesaid) in the middle of Gwavaslane and opposite to the middle of another lane or road commonly called Treworvenneth-walk, leading to the estate and house called Treworvenneth, the property of Seymour Tremenheere, Esquire, and thence northward along the middle of Gwavaslane aforesaid, and westward along the middle of Church-lane and Adit-lane, across the road to Penzance, and along the middle of Treworvenneth Vean-lane to a certain hedge or fence (marked e as aforesaid) extending direct from Treworvenneth, Vean-town-place to the village of Tredavoe, and separating the fields (south west of such hedge or fence) numbered and called in the tithe apportion. ment book and map 396 Harvey's Meadow, 397 Croft Meadow, 398 Lower Park Grouse, and 399 Upper Park Grouse, all belonging to the Reverend Thomas Leah, from the fields on the north east of the said hedge or fence, numbered and called on the said map 246 Barnfield, 247 Park Venton and End (now in one), 248 Dewlale, and thence towards the north west in the same direction as the said hedge or fence to the road leading from the village of Tredavoe aforesaid, and thence first westward along the southern

boundary of such village, and northward and eastward along the western and northern boundary thereof, to the middle of Saint Golders-lane, and thence northward along the middle of such lastmentioned lane and of Smelting-house-lane to the middle of the said road from Street-an-nowan to Trereif, and thence westward along the middle of such last-mentioned road to the point where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parishes out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such incumbents and patrons have respectively consented to the said scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Exeter.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to alter and amend the law re-" lating to ecclesiastical houses of residence," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the ninth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty seven, in the words following, that is to say : "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to alter and amend the law relating to "ecclesiastical houses of residence," and of the Act therein first recited, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for improving the demesnes adjoining to the episcopal house of residence of the see of Rochester.

"Whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the eighth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fortyfive, duly made and gazetted, under the said Acts, and ratifying a scheme prepared by us, it was, amongst other things, provided, that the Bishop of Rochester, or his successors, might be authorized and empowered, with our consent, to sell and dispose of certain manors, lands, tenements and hereditaments therein mentioned, and that the proceeds of such sale should be applied by us towards the purchase of a suitable house of residence for the said bishop, and towards putting such house into tenantable condition; and that the balance, if any, should be vested in and applied by us for the purposes of the said Acts :

"And whereas it is by the said herein recited Act enacted, that it may be lawful, by the authority therein provided, and with the consent, under the hand and episcopal seal of the bishop, to make such arrangement as may by such authority be deemed most expedient for improving the demesnes adjoining to any episcopal house of residence by the purchase of any land, tenement or hereditament in the immediate neighbourhood or within view thereof:

"And whereas certain of the said manors, lands, tenements and hereditaments mentioned in the said scheme have since been sold, and an episcopal house of residence has been purchased and completed for the bishops of Rochester, out of the monies arising from the sales thereof, and there is now at our disposal a balance of such monies more than sufficient for the purpose hereinafter mentioned, which balance is likely to be encreased by further like sales :

"And whereas the piece or parcel of land, particularly mentioned and described in the schedule hereunto annexed, is in the immediate

neighbourhood of the said episcopal house of residence, and it has been proposed to us by the Right Reverend George Bishop of Rochester, and it appears to us to be most expedient for the purpose of improving the demesnes adjoining the said episcopal house of residence, that the said piece or parcel of land should be forthwith purchased and annexed thereto, and that authority should be given for the purchase, in like manner, of such other lands, tenements and hereditaments as may appear to be expedient for the like purpose :

" We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said George Bishop of Rochester, testified by his having hereunto set his hand and episcopal seal, that he, the said George Bishop of Rochester, or his successors bishops of Rochester, may be authorized and empowered to purchase and take a conveyance to him, and his successors bishops of Rochester forever, of the piece or parcel of land so particularly, mentioned and described in the schedule hereunto annexed; and also, from time to time hereafter. if there be sufficient monies applicable to such purpose, according to the terms of the said Order in Council, and with our consent, in writing, testified under our common seal, to purchase and take a like conveyance of such other lands, tenements or hereditaments in the immediate neighbourhood or within view of the said episcopal house of residence as aforesaid, as may appear to us to be expedient, for the like or any other purpose or purposes of the said Acts, and at and for such price or prices as shall be deemed by us to be reasonable and proper; and that we shall and may be authorized and empowered to apply, from time to time, the balance of monies so now or hereafter at our disposal as aforesaid, or such part or parts thereof as shall appear to us to be expedient, towards the purchase of the said piece or parcel of land, and of such other lands, tenements or hereditaments as aforesaid, and also towards the costs, charges and expenses of and attending any and each such purchase.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE.

"All that piece or parcel of land or field known by the name of the Twelve Acres, containing, by estimation, eleven acres three roods and twenty-two perches, be the same more or less, situate, lying and being in the parish of Sandon, in the county of Essex, which said field is bounded on the north by the road leading from Sandon to Danbury, on the south and east by land belonging to Mr. Portway, and on the west by land now or late belonging to the devisees of Thomas Murriage."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Rochester.

That the limits of the port of Dover shall commence at St. Margaret's Bay aforesaid, and continue along the said coast of Kent to Copt Point, in the said county:

That the limits of the port of Folkestone shall commence at Copt Point aforesaid, and continue along the coast to Dungeness, in the said county :

That the limits of the port of Rye shall commence at Dungeness aforesaid, and continue along the coasts of Kent and Sussex to Langley Point, in the county of Sussex :

That the limits of the port of Newhaven shall commence at Langley Point aforesaid, and continue along the coast of Sussex to Rottingdean, in the said county of Sussex, being the eastern boundary of the port of Shoreham.

And we, the said Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do further declare, that the himits seaward of the said ports shall extend to a distance of three miles from low water mark out to sea, and that the limits of such ports shall include all islands, bays, harbours, rivers, and creeks within the same respectively.

And we, the said Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby annul all former limits of the said ports.
