NOTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness Prince Albert will, by the desire of Her Majesty, hold a Levee, at St. James's-Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Wednesday the 22d March instant, at two o'clock.

It is Her Majesty's pleasure, that presentations to His Royal Highness at this Levee shall be considered equivalent to presentations to the Queen.

Addresses to the Queen may either be forwarded to Her Majesty, through the Secretary of State for the Home Department, or may be reserved until Her Majesty shall hold a Levee.

REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE LEVEES,
AT ST. JAMES'S-PALACE.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who purpose to attend the Levees, at St. James's-Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name.

Those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them, should be sent to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office, *before twelve o'clock on the Monday previous* to each Levee, in order that they may be submitted for approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall be made at the Levees, but in conformity with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half past one o'clock.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the law respecting

"the office of county coroner," it is enacted, that when and so often as it shall seem expedient to the justices of any county in England, that their county should be divided into two or more districts for the purposes of that Act, it shall be lawful for them, in general or quarter sessions assembled, to resolve that an humble petition should be presented to Her Majesty, praying that such division be made; and that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, if she shall think fit, with the advice of Her Privy Council, after taking into consideration any such petition, and any petition which may be presented to Her by any coroner of the same county concerning the proposed division, or whenever it shall seem fit to Her Majesty to direct the issue of a writ de coronatore eligendo, for the purpose of authorizing the election of an additional coroner above the number theretofore customarily elected, to order that such county be divided into such and so many districts, as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, shall seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts, and to determine at what place within each district the court for the election of coroner shall be holden; and whereas a petition of the justices of the peace of the county of Buckingham, in quarter sessions assembled, and certified under the hands and seals of two of the justices present when such petition was agreed to, hath been presented to Her Majesty, praying that their county may be divided into four districts, respectively described as the Aylesbury District, the Beaconsfield District, the Newport Pagnell District, and the Winslow District; and the said petitioners pray that the district, described as the Aylesbury District, should comprize the following parishes and places within the said county, that is to say, Aylesbury with Walton, Aston Clinton with St. Leonards, Ashendon, Aston Sandford, Aston Mil ins, Aston Abbots, Berton with Broughton, Buckland, Bledrow with Bledrow Ridge, Brill, Boarstall, Cuddington, Chearsley, Chilton, Cheddington, Cholesbury, Creslow, Cublington, Dinton with Ford, Upton Moreton and Waldridge, Dorton, Drayton Beauchamp, Dunton, Ellesborough, Edlesborough with Dagnall, Hudnall and Northall, Fleetmarston, Grove, Haddenham, Halton, Hartwell, Hulcott, Hampden Great, Hampden Little, Hawridge, Horsendon, Hardwick with Weedon, Hogston, Ickford, Ilmire, Ivinghoe with Aston Horton and Seabrook and Saint Margarets, Kimble Great, Kimble Little, Kingsey, Lee, Ludgershall, Long Crendon, Linslade, Missenden Great, Missenden Little, Mentmore with Ledburne, Marsworth, North-Marston, Oving, Oakley, Pitchcot, Pightlesthorne with Nettleden and Friesden, Quainton with Doddershall and Shipton Lee, Quarrendon, Risborough Monks, Risborough Princes, Stoke Mandeville, Stone with Bishopstone, Shabbington, Slapton, Soulbury, Towersey, Western Turville, Wendover, Waddesdon with Westcott and Woodham, Wotton Underwood, Winchendon Upper, Winchendon Lower, Worminghall, Wing, Wingrave, Whitechurch, and all other places (if any) in the county of Buckingham situated to the south of the re-

Now, therefore, it appearing that the requirements of the said Act have been duly complied with, and Her Majesty, having taken the said petition into consideration, doth, in pursuance of the said Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, order and direct, that the said county of Buckingham shall be divided, for the purposes of the said Act, into four districts, as prayed by the said petition; and that the district, described in the said petition as the Aylesbury district, shall be named the Aylesbury District; and that the district, described in the said petition as the Beaconsfield district, shall be named the Beaconsfield District; and that the district, described in the said petition as the Newport Pagnell district, shall be named the Newport Pagnell District; and that the district, described in the said petition as the Winslow district, shall be named the Winslow District: and it is hereby further ordered and determined, that the court for the election of coroner for each of the said districts, respectively, shall be holden within each district, at the following places, that is to say, for the Aylesbury Dis-

trict, at Aylesbury; for the Beaconsfield District, at Beaconsfield; for the Newport Pagnell District, at Newport Pagnell; and for the Winslow District, at Winslow: and it is hereby further ordered, that this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

Whereas, by virtue of a Commission issued out of the Court of Exchequer, at Westminster, in Trinity Term, in the fourth year of the reign of King George the Second, the bounds and limits of the port of Bridlington were declared to extend and be accounted from the promontory or point called Spurn Head, all around the said head northward to the most easterly point of Flamborough Head, including all the sea coast, and to fourteen fathoms water from low water mark, together with bays, creeks, rivers, inlets, and streams, between the said Spurn Point and the most easterly point of Flamborough Head :

And whereas the trade and business at Bridlington have become so trifling as no longer to warrant the continuance of that place as an independent port :

We, the undersigned, being three of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby, under the authority of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of Her present

Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs," annul the limits of the said port of Bridlington, as set out by virtue of the said Commission, and have included the same within the limits of the port of Hull, as hereinafter set out; and we do hereby declare the said port of Bridlington to be no longer a port.

And we, the said Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby, under and by virtue of the powers vested in us by the said Act, appoint Boston, Grimsby, and Hull to be ports in that part of the United Kingdom called England; and we do hereby declare, that the limits of the port of Boston shall commence at Sutton Corner, in Lincolnshire, being the northern limits of the port of Wisbeach, and continue along the east coast of the said county, in a northerly direction, to the drain or canal called Trussthorpe Drain and Tunnel, dividing the parishes of Marblethorpe and Trussthorpe, in the said county :

That the port of Grimsby shall commence at the drain or canal called Trussthorpe Drain and Tunnel, dividing the parishes of Marblethorpe and Trussthorpe, on the east coast of Lincolnshire, and continue, in a northerly direction, along the coast of the said county to Cleanness and Cleethorpe; and from thence up the river Humber to Skitterness, on the Lincolnshire bank of the said river, including so much of the said river as extends to low water mark, at spring tides, on the Yorkshire coast, from Spurn Point to Paull Light-house :

That the port of Hull shall commence at the confluence of the rivers Trent and Ouse with the river Humber, and include the whole of the said river to a supposed straight line drawn from Skitterness, on the Lincolnshire bank, to Paull Light-house, on the Yorkshire bank of the said river Humber; and the said limits shall continue at low water mark, at spring tides, along the Yorkshire bank of the said river Humber, from the said Paull Light-house to Spurn Point, at the entrance of the said river; and from thence, northerly, along the coast of Yorkshire to Flam-rough Head, being the southern limits of the port of Scarborough, in the said county.

And we, the said Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do further declare, that the limits seaward of the said several ports shall extend to a distance of three miles from low water mark out to sea; and that the limits of such ports shall include all islands, bays, harbours, rivers, and creeks within the same respectively.

And we, the said Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby annul all former limits of the said ports.
