We, the undersigned, being three of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby, under the authority of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs," appoint Newcastle and Shields to be ports in that part

of the United Kingdom called England; and we do hereby declare, that, from and after the 5th day of April next, the limits of the port of Newcastle shall comprize the river Tyne, westward of a supposed straight line drawn from the east end of Jarrow Quay, on the south side of the said river, in the county of Durham, to the east end of Whitehill Point Sand, on the north side of the said river, in the county of Northumberland, including all quays, wharfs, shores, and staiths within the said limits.

That the limits of the port of Shields shall commence at the south side of the river Aln, in the county of Northumberland, and continue from thence along the coasts of the said counties of Northumberland and Durham to Souter Point, in the latter county, including so much of the river Tyne as is northward of a supposed straight line drawn from Whitehill Sand Point, on the northern side of the said river, in the county of Northumberland, to Jarrow Quay, on the south side of the said river, in the county of Durham.

And we, the said Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do farther declare, that the limits seaward of the said port of Shields shall extend to a distance of three miles from low water mark out to sea, and that the limits of the said port shall include all islands, bays, harbours, rivers, and creeks within the same respectively.

And we, the said Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby annul all former limits of the said ports.
