THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to make further provision, for one year and to the end of the then next session of Parliament, for the carriage of passengers by sea to North America.

An Act to amend an Act for consolidating the Queen's Bench, Fleet, and Marshalsea Prison, and for regranting the Queen's Prison.

Wharfedale Railway.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Commissioners of Railways, by a warrant under their seal, bearing date the 30th day of March now last, and made in pursuance of an Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to give further time for making certain railways," have ordered and declared; that the period of time limited by the Wharfedale Railway Act, 1846, for the completion of the railway described in the said warrant (that is to say), a railway, commencing by a junction with the extension of the Leeds and Bradford Railway, at or near to the town of Skipton, in the parish of Skipton, in the west riding of the county of York, and terminating by junctions with the Leeds and Thirsk Railway, in the parishes of Addle and Otley, in the west riding of the county of York, shall be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said period so limited by such Act; and also that the period of time limited by the same Act, for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purpose of constructing the said hereinbefore-mentioned railway, shall be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said last-mentioned period so limited by such Act; subject nevertheless to all such savings, exceptions, and provisions whatsoever as are contained in the said Act of the present session of Parliament.—Dated this 31st day of March 1848.
