"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Kendal, in the county of Westmoreland, and within the diocese of Chester, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint George, situate in the said parish of Kendal, in pursuance of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners under the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Saint George, Kendal," with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned:

"The boundary of the said proposed district commences at the northern end of the Mill-bridge over the river Kent, and proceeds from such bridge in a north westerly direction up the middle of Kent-lane as far as Finkle-street, along the middle of which street it proceeds south westerly into Highbgate-street, up the middle of which street it proceeds northerly, and continues in the



same course up the middle of Stricklandgate-street as far as Sands-close; it then proceeds in a north easterly direction up the middle of Sands-close as far as the bank of the river Kent, and crossing that river proceeds in a straight line in a north easterly direction to a bound stone, placed on the north eastern side of the road to Appleby, at the distance of one hundred yards from the house and premises occupied by William Dewksberry; and from such bound stone it then proceeds in a straight line in a south easterly direction to another bound stone, placed on the southern side of the road to Sedbergh, at the eastern corner of the boundary of Common-garden; and from such latter bound stone it proceeds in another straight line south westerly to the first bridge over the Lancaster-canal, which bridge it crosses and proceeds in a straight line westerly as far as the eastern bank of the river Kent, and proceeds north westerly along the bank of that river as far as the Mill-bridge, which it crosses, to the point where the boundary first commenced, and as such proposed district is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured green :

“ Your Majesty’s Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parishes of Middleton and Bury, in the county of Lancaster, and diocese of Manchester, it appears to them to be expedient to unite and consolidate certain contiguous portions of the said parishes into one consolidated chapelry, for all ecclesiastical purposes, for the consecrated church of Saint John the Baptist, situate at Birkle, in the said

parish of Middleton, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further amendment of the Church Building Acts," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners under the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed consolidated chapelry should be called, "The Consolidated Chapelry of Birkle," and that the same should commence at the north point, in an old lane, from Cobhouse Nab Farm, westward, to Cobhouse, thence along the boundary between Birkle in Middleton and Walmersley in Bury, and then to follow the boundary between the townships of Bury and Walmersley till it joins the boundary between Bury and Birkle, which it follows, taking in a detached portion of Bury, still following the same boundary, and taking in a farm, called the Bower, situate in Bury, it reaches a house, called the Hagg, also situate in Bury, which it also takes in; from which house the boundary is an old occupation road, which joins the turnpike road at a place, called Fern-grove, and here, crossing such turnpike road, it takes in a detached portion of Birkle, called Clerk's-croft, when the boundary takes a southerly direction as far as Bridge-hall; whence it follows the road to the Bridge-hall Paper-mills, on the banks of the river Roach, which river is the boundary of the proposed consolidated chapelry, on the south and south east side, to the point where a brook, called Cheesden-brook, falls into it, which brook forms the boundary on the east and north till it reaches a farm, called Deep Moss, in Walmersley; the boundary then takes a westerly direction along the boundary between the Deep Moss land and Cobhouse Nab land, till it reaches an old lane, which leads up to the gate of the Cobhouse Nab farm-yard, up which said lane it proceeds northerly, to the point where the boundary of the said proposed consolidated chapelry commenced, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured green and yellow :

"Your Majesty's Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that it has been mutually agreed between the Right Honourable Edward

Vernon Baron Suffield, as the patron of the parish church of the said parish of Middleton, and the Right Honourable Edward Smith Earl of Derby, as the patron of the parish church of the said parish of Bury, with the approbation of your Majesty's said Commissioners, that the right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to serve the said church of Saint John the Baptist and proposed consolidated chapelry of Birkle should be vested in, belong to, and, whenever occasion may require, be exercised by, the Rector of the said parish church of Middleton for the time being :

"That the consents of the Right Reverend James Prince Bishop of Manchester, as Bishop of the diocese, and of the said Edward Vernon Baron Suffield and Edward Smith Earl of Derby, as such patrons as aforesaid, have been severally obtained to the formation of such proposed consolidated chapelry, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said James Prince Bishop of Manchester, Edward Vernon Baron Suffield, and Edward Smith Earl of Derby have respectively signed and sealed this representation :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

DISPATCHES, of which the following are extracts or copies, have been received at this Office :

SIR,

Vindictive, at Jamaica,
5th March 1848.

WITH reference to my letter, No. 42, of the 1st instant, reporting the departure of Her Majesty's ships Alarm and Vixen for Blewfields, to consult with Her Majesty's Consul General and Agent, as to the best means of obtaining redress from the Nicaraguan Government for the insults and outrages therein mentioned, and to obtain the release of two British subjects, carried off from San Juan by Colonel Salas, of the Nicaraguan army. I have the honour to transmit herewith, to be laid before the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty; a copy of a dispatch, dated the 21st February, which I have this day received from Captain G. G. Loch, of the Alarm, reporting, that the ships arrived at Blewfields on the 5th of that month, and Mr. Walker having been embarked, according to his request, they proceeded on the 7th for San Juan, where they arrived on the following day.

As the nearest Nicaraguan settlement was at Serapaqui, about thirty miles up the river, which, from the strength of the current and various rapids, is generally a four days' journey, Captain Loch, accompanied by Mr. Walker in his own boat, proceeded to that place at once with a force of 260 men in twelve boats, and after a most fatiguing pull of seventy-two hours, anchored on the evening of the 11th, near the spot.

It was here that the melancholy death of Mr. Walker occurred; he was unfortunately drowned, whilst attempting to save the life of a friend who had accompanied him in his boat, and had fallen overboard in the night. They both lost their lives.

On the morning of the 12th, the expedition got under weigh, and proceeded towards the fort, where it had been ascertained Colonel Salas was commanding officer. On nearing it, Captain Loch and Commander Ryder pushed ahead in their gigs, in order to state the object of Her Majesty's forces being in the river, but no sooner were they seen than they were fired at, both by cannon and small arms. As this act effectually prevented any peaceable arrangements, boats were at once brought up, and after an hour and a half's pull against the rapid tide to reach the landing-place, during which the crews were exposed to a very heavy fire from both sides of the river, they effected their object, and the Nicaraguan troops fled at once, when Captain Loch totally destroyed the fort, and threw all the arms into the river.

The loss on our side amounted to two killed, and one officer, and 12 seamen, marines, and soldiers wounded; a list of which is inclosed.

I have to express my admiration of the great gallantry, zeal, and perseverance displayed by Captain Loch and the officers and men of both services employed under his orders on the occasion. I have, &c.,

Fort San Carlos, Nicaragua,
February 21, 1848.

SIR,

IN pursuance of your instructions, and in accordance with the wishes of Her Majesty's late Agent and Consul General, Mr. Walker, I have the honour to acquaint you, that I proceeded up the river San Juan de Nicaragua, in command of Her Majesty's combined forces, consisting of 260 officers and men, contained in twelve boats of H. M. ships Alarm and Vixen, and captured the post of Serapaqui, after a sharp action of one hour and forty minutes, with a loss of two killed and thirteen wounded.

The post is situated on a point projecting into the river very abruptly to the height of fifty feet, is protected in the rear by a dense forest, and in the front by an abattis, formed of large trees felled, with their heads and branches reaching into the river. It was only to be approached by heading a rapid current of nearly five knots an hour, in order to pass the fort and descend towards a steep and narrow landing place above the stockaded batteries.

On Friday the 12th instant, Commander Ryder and myself (who were in advance in our gigs) hove in sight of Serapaqui, situated at the head of a straight reach, of about a mile and a half long. No sooner did my boat appear, than she was fired upon by two guns, which effectually precluded the possibility of any peaceful arrangement.

I therefore waited to reconnoitre until the heavy boats arrived, when I led them up the river. A spare pinnace, commanded by Lieutenant Johnston, of H. M. S. Alarm, containing some of H. M. 38th regiment; the Alarm's barge, commanded by Lieutenant Ridge, and First Lieutenant Boyle, of the royal marines, with a part of his detachment, and the Vixen's port paddle box boat, with the head quarters of the detachment of that regiment, commanded by Captain Smith, owing to their fast pulling, took the lead after the gigs, and on we went, but the current was so strong, that one hour and forty minutes elapsed before we were enabled to pass the batteries sufficiently high to drop down to the landing-place previously mentioned, by which time nearly all the boats were up. I then gave the order to land, which they did with an English cheer, and in ten minutes our flag was hoisted on the fort.

After a chase of thirty minutes into the thick woods, I ordered the recall to be sounded, destroyed the stockades, spiked the guns, broke their trunnions, and threw them into the river, together with musquets, ammunition; and, after embarking the force, set fire to the defences.

I was unable to ascertain accurately the loss of the enemy, owing to the density of the cover into which they retreated; twenty, however, were found dead, and I have reason to believe, that about double the number were wounded. Their force consisted of about two hundred soldiers, besides some boatmen, pressed by Colonel Salas into his service.

Nine prisoners were captured, amongst them two wounded officers; these I sent to the ship; the remainder I have distributed amongst the boats to act as pilots.

The defences of the post consisted of six angular stockaded entrenchments, formed of very tough timber, eight feet high and four feet thick, one side of each stockade looking across the river, and the other down the reach. The principal stockade commanded the landing-place, in which one of the guns was mounted at the time.

It was with great satisfaction that I saw the cool and steady behaviour of the men, under the trying circumstances of crowded boats, exposed to a hot fire from both sides of the river from unseen marksmen, without the possibility of effectually returning it, while in almost a stationary position, owing to the current running like a mill-stream. And it is astonishing to me that a greater loss did not occur, as the boats were riddled with shot, and nearly half the oars broken.

To distinguish one brave officer from another, when all did their duty, is a difficult task; but I may remark, that I found Captain Smith, commanding the detachment of Her Majesty's 38th regiment, by my side on landing; Commander Ryder, at the head of his division, close by me; Lieutenants Johnston and Ridge, of the Alarm, leading their men in gallant style; and First Lieutenant Boyle, Royal Marines, of the same ship, leading his detachment as my guard, and showing an example, which his marines could not but follow.

Mr. Martin, Paymaster and Purser of the Alarm, accompanied me in my gig, and was of the greatest value and assistance. Besides these officers, I beg to recommend to your favourable notice Mr. Collins, Paymaster and Purser of H. M. S. Vixen, who was a volunteer in the head quarter port paddle box boat; the Honourable H. A. Moreton, Mate of the Alarm, who commanded the pinnace, and did good execution; Mr. Tyler, Mate of the same ship; Mr. N. E. B. Turnour, Midshipman of Vixen, who was badly wounded; and I beg to mention a seaman of the Vixen, named in the margin*, who captured the colours. If I have, &c.
