WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provi-"sion for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirteenth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Halifax, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any



scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided :

"And whereas the said parish of Halifax is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Halifax, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly, and that the same shall be named, "The District of Saint Mary, Sowerby."

" And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures

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relating to the matters aforesuid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" The district of SAINT MARY, SOWERBY, being-

" All those parts of the townships of Sowerby and Soyland, in the parish of Halifax, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) in the middle of the turnpike road from Rochdale to Halifax near to Kebroyd Bridge where the townships join, and at a distance of two hundred and twenty feet from the middle of the road leading to Mill Bank, and thence extending westward in the same direction with such last-mentioned road, and on the northern side thereof at a distance of two hundred and twenty feet from the middle of such road as far as the public footpath (marked b as aforesaid) leading to Spout Field, and thence towards the north west along the middle of such public footpath across the road from Sowerby Town to Millbank, and along the middle of the road from Spout Field aforesaid, by or past Elm Farm as far as the road from Cotton Stones to Hubberton, and thence in the same direction along the middle of the road leading across Rat Row Moor by Parkin Hall to Holy End and Hawking Clough as far as Shaws-lane Farm, and thence in the same direction along the public footpath leading near Crow Hill End Farm to the boundary of the district of St. John in the Wilderness, in the same county and diocese, and thence towards the south west along such boundary as far as the boundary between the townships of Sowerby and Soyland aforesaid, and thence westward along such last-mentioned boundary to the boundary between the counties of York and Lancaster, and thence towards the south east along such lastmentioned boundary as far as the turnpike road aforesaid from Rochdale to Halifax, and thence eastward along the middle of such turnpike road as far as Baitings Gate, and thence towards the north east along the middle of the old road leading to Halifax by Baitings, Blue Ball, and Upper Shay, to a point (marked c as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of the new road leading from Upper

Crosswells to Dyson-lane, and thence eastward along the middle of such new road to a point at the distance of two hundred feet from the middle of the aforesaid old road, and thence towards the north east in the same direction with such lastmentioned road leading to Halifax and on the eastern side thereof at a distance of two hundred feet from the middle of such road as far as the road leading from Millbank aforesaid to Soyland Town, and thence northward along the middle of the lane leading by Highfield to Kebroyd-lane as far as such last-mentioned lane, and thence eastward along the middle of Kebroyd-lane aforesaid as far as the turnpike road from Rochdale to Halifax aforesaid, and thence northward along the middle of such road to the point where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the church of the parish, and to the incumbents and patron of the churches or chapels of the chapelries, out of which which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such incumbents and patrons have respectively consented to the said scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act "to amend and render more effectual an Act, "passed in the last session of Parliament, for "building, and promoting the building, of ad-"ditional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in that behalf vested in them by the Church Building Acts, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fourteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words following, viz.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Spennithorne, in the county of York, and within the diocese of Ripon, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church at Bellerby, in the said parish of Spennithorne, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to " amend and render more effectual an Act, " passed in the last session of Parliament, " for building, and promoting the building, of " additional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners by the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should be named, " The Chapelry District of Bellerby," with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned :

"The chapelry district of Bellerby is bounded on the east by the parish of Hawkswell; on the north by the parish of Downholme; on the west and south west by the parish of Wensley; and on the south by the Abbergill-brook, which brook separates the said proposed chapelry district of Bellerby from the remaining part of the said parish of Spennithorne, as such proposed district is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured green :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that it also appears to them to be expedient, that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed in the said church at Bellerby; and that the fees to arise therefrom should belong and be paid to the Incumbent thereof for the time being:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Lord Bishop of Ripon (as the Bishop of the diocese within which the said parish of Spennithorne is situate) has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Charles Thomas Lord Bishop of Ripon has signed and sealed this representation :

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Llangollen, in the county of Denbigh, and within the diocese of Saint Asaph, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the church of Saint John the Baptist, recently erected and consecrated at Pontfadog, in the said parish of Llangollen, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of King George the Third, intituled " An Act to "amend and render more effectual an Act. " passed in the last session of Parliament, for " building, and promoting the building, of " additional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners under the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should consist of the townships of Cilcohwin, Crogen Iddon, Crogen-w-Ladies otherwise Crogen Wladis, Erwallo, Hafodgyn fawr, Nantygwryd otherwise Nantgwrhyd, Talygarth, and Cysyllte, and that such proposed district should be called, "The Chapelry District of Pontfadog," with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned :

" The chapelry district of Pontfadog is bounded on the north east by the parish of Chirk; on the east by the parish of Saint Martin; on the south east and south by the parish of Selattyn; on the south west by the parish of Llanarmon; on the west by the parish of Llansilin; on the north west by the parish of Llansantffraid; and on the north by the remaining part of the parish of Llangollen, from which the proposed chapelry district of Pontfadog is separated by the northern boundary of the township of Crogen Wladis, and the western boundary of the township of Cysyllte and the river Dee, as such proposed chapelry district of Pontfadog is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that it also appears to them to be expedient, that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed in the said church at Pontfadog; and that the fees to arise therefrom should, from and after the first or next avoidance of the parish church of Llangollen, belong to the Incumbent for the time being of the said church at Pontfadog :

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Thomas Vowler Lord Bishop of Saint Asaph, as the Bishop of the diocese within which the said parish of Llangollen is situate, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Thomas Vowler Lord Bishop of Saint Asaph has signed and sealed this representation :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

WHEREAS by a Statute, made at the Parment holden in the fifth and sixth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the amendment of the law of "bankruptcy," it was; amongst other things, enacted, that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, after the passing of that Act, by a Commission or Commissions under the Great Seal, to appoint as many persons as Her Majesty should think fit, not exceeding twelve persons, being serjeants or barristers at law of not less than seven years standing at the bar, to be commissioners of the Court of Bankruptcy to act in the prosecution of fiats in bankruptcy in the country, and that any one or more of such commissioners should and might form a District Court of Bankruptcy for the purpose of the said Act; and that every such court should be authorized to act in bankruptcy in the country at such place, and in and for such districts, as Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, should be pleased to direct; and that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, to describe, and from time to time to alter, the limit and extent of every such district as to Her should seem fit: and whereas at a Court holden at Windsor, on the second day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, did order and direct, that, for the purposes of the said Act, there should be seven districts in the country, which should be called, respectively, the Manchester District, the Leeds District, the Liverpool District, the Birmingham District, the Bristol District, the Exeter District, and the Newcastle-upon-Tyne District, and did describe the limit and extent of every such district : and whereas it is expedient that the hundred of Broxtow, in the northern division of the county of Nottingham, which is now comprehended in the Leeds District, should be separated from that district, and be annexed to the Birmingham District; and that the limit and extent of the Leeds District and the limit and extent of the Birmingham District should be altered accordingly:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order and direct, and it is hereby ordered and directed, that the Leeds District and the Birmingham District, respectively, shall, for the purpose of the said Act, be altered, and be as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, the Leeds District shall comprehend all places hitherto comprehended in that district, except the said hundred of Broxtow, which shall be and the same is hereby separated from the Leeds District; and the Birmingham

District shall comprehend all places hitherto comprehended in that district, and in addition thereto all places locally situated within the said hundred of Broxtow, which is hereby annexed to the Birmingham District :

And the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
