intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making additional provision for the cure of souls in certain parishes where such assistance is most required.

"Whereas, under the authority of the said recited Acts, we have from time to time prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council certain schemes, in which we have recommended and proposed, that certain grants should be made, in augmentation of the incomes of certain benefices and churches, in certain classes, and subject to certain limitations therein mentioned, which schemes have been ratified by Orders of your Majesty in Council, and such Orders have been duly gazetted:

"And whereas, on the sixth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, we found it necessary to suspend, until

further notice, our recommendations of further grants, with certain specified exceptions; and the several benefices and churches described in the schedules hereunto annexed either fall within such exceptions, or the incumbents thereof have received specific promises from us that we would recommend the grants in the said schedules respectively proposed, in consequence of their coming within some or one of such classes as aforesaid:

"And whereas we have satisfied ourselves, after due inquiry, that the churches described in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked A 3., fall within the first of such classes, subject to the respective limitations in the said Orders mentioned; and that the said churches are fit and proper to be forthwith augmented by the respective annual amounts stated in the last column of the said schedules respectively:

"And whereas, from the source set opposite to the name of the church described in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked B., in the sixth column of such schedule, the benefaction of one thousand pounds stock, mentioned in the seventh column of the same schedule, has been transferred to us, and the house, mentioned in the same column, has been permanently secured to the incumbent of such church, as therein specified; and we have satisfied ourselves that the said last-mentioned church falls within the second of such classes, as limited by the said Orders, and is fit and proper to be forthwith augmented by the annual amount stated in the last column of the same schedule:

"And whereas the benefices described in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked C., fall within the third class in the said Orders mentioned, and are situate within the places set opposite to the names thereof respectively in the fifth column of of the same schedule; and we are in possession of certain tithes or lands arising or situate in such places respectively, or of the proceeds thereof; and, after due inquiry and consideration, we have satisfied ourselves, that the same benefices are fit and proper to be forthwith augmented by the respective annual amounts stated in the last column of the same schedule:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the incumbent for the time being

of each of the benefices and churches so described in the said schedules marked A 3., B., and C., the fixed annual sum set opposite to the name of such benefice or church in the last column of the said schedule, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year; and that the first such half-yearly payment shall in each case be made on the first day of May next, except in the cases of the vicarages of Saint John Buckhurst-hill, Chigwell, and Hurstborne Tarrant with Verham Dean, and the perpetual curacy of Weeford and Hints, the incumbents whereof shall, on such last-mentioned day, receive three such half-yearly payments, and except also in the cases of the district church of Saint Barnabas King's-square, in the parish of Saint Luke's, London, and the vicarages of Chard and Llansaintfraid yn Mechan, the incumbents whereof shall, on such last-mentioned day, receive two such half-yearly payments; and that, in case of a vacancy in any of the benefices or churches contained in the said three schedules having already happened during the period over which the payment so recommended and proposed extends, or hereafter happening on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the incumbent making the vacancy, or his personal representatives, and the incumbent succeeding to the benefice or church so becoming or having become vacant.

" Provided that, in the cases of the vicarages of Chard, Hurstborne Tarrant with Vernham Dean, and Sonning, the respective payments shall be made only on the production to us, or to our treasurer and secretary, on or before the first day of May and first day of November respectively in this and every succeeding year, of a certificate, under the hand of the bishop of the diocese, that a curate, licensed by such bishop,

has been duly employed at Tatworth, in the parish of Chard, at Vernham Dean, and at Early, in the parish of Sonning.

" And whereas we have satisfied ourselves, that the several benefices contained in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked E., fall within the third class aforesaid; we, therefore, recommend and propose, that, in order to provide fit houses of residence for the incumbents of the benefices contained in the last-mentioned schedule, we shall be at liberty to pay, to such persons and at such times as shall appear to us from time to time to be expedient, such a sum or sums of money, in the case of each such benefice, as shall be required for providing a fit house of residence for the incumbent thereof.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent the further augmentation of any of such benefices or churches, if it shall be deemed fit, when there shall be sufficient means for that purpose; and that if it shall appear to us to be expedient, at any future time, that instead of the annual sum then in course of payment by us to the incumbent of any benefice, or instead of any part of such annual sum, any land, tithe or other hereditament should be conveyed to such benefice in fee, nothing herein, or in any other scheme, contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing such a substitution; provided that no such change shall take effect before the then next vacancy of the benefice affected thereby, without the written consent of the then existing incumbent.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure for making better provision for the cure of souls, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them."

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to carry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of "Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of

another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend "two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical "Commissioners for England," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for substituting a money payment to the Prebendary of Brampton, in the cathedral church of Lincoln, for the property of his prebend.

"Whereas, by and under the provisions of the said Acts, the whole of the separate estates and endowments belonging to the said Prebendary, as such, will (excepting any right of patronage), upon the first avoidance of his prebend, become absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, and the chief of such purposes is that of making better provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required :

"And whereas it was by the same Acts enacted that, by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement might, from time to time, be made, with the consent, in writing, under the hand of any prebendary of any cathedral church for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments belonging to such prebendary, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes or other hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting in any case any lands, tithes or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes or other hereditaments :

"And whereas it has been agreed between us and the Reverend Theodore Bouwens, the present Prebendary of the said prebend of Brampton, that, with a view to sooner carrying into effect the purpose of the said recited Acts hereinbefore particularly mentioned, the following arrangement should be recommended by us to your Majesty in Council :

"We, therefore, with the consent of the said Theodore Bouwens, testified by his having signed this scheme, humbly recommend and propose that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law, other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and

upon and after the day of such gazetting, all lands, tithes and other hereditaments whatsoever (except any right of patronage) now belonging to the said Theodore Bouwens as such Prebendary of the said prebend of Brampton as aforesaid, or to or in which he has or ought to have any estate, right, title or interest, shall, together with all such estate, right, title and interest therein (except as aforesaid), be and be held to be, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed by and from the said Theodore Bouwens as such Prebendary to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, subject only to any legally subsisting lease or leases thereof or of any part or parts thereof; and that, in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance, there shall be paid by us to the said Theodore Bouwens, on the tenth day next after the day of the gazetting of such Order of your Majesty in Council, the sum of eight thousand pounds sterling; provided that no renewal of any lease, nor any new lease, of the said lands, tithes or other hereditaments, or of any part thereof, shall, since the twenty-first day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, have been or shall be granted or made by the said Theodore Bouwens.

“And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lincoln.

Chapter of the Most Noble Order of the Garter.

A Chapter of this Most Noble Order having been summoned for this day, the Knights Companions hereafter named, in their mantles and collars, assembled in the Green Drawing-room, viz.

The Duke of Wellington, the Marquess of Anglesey, the Marquess of Exeter, the Duke of Buccleuch, the Marquess of Lansdowne, the Duke of Beaufort, the Marquess of Salisbury, the Duke of Cleveland, Earl De Grey, the Marquess of Abercorn, Earl Talbot, the Marquess Camden, the Marquess of Hertford, and the Duke of Bedford, attended by the following Officers, viz.

The Lord Bishop of Winchester, Prelate; the Lord Bishop of Oxford, Chancellor; the Honourable and Reverend George Neville-Grenville, Dean of Windsor, Register; Sir Charles George Young, Knt. Garter Principal King of Arms; and Sir Augustus William James Clifford, Bart. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod.

At half past one o'clock the Knights Companions were called over by Garter, when (Her Majesty and His Royal Highness the Prince Albert having passed into the Throne-room) they proceeded with the Officers of the Order from the Green Drawing-room into the Throne-room.

The Sovereign being seated in Her chair of state, and His Royal Highness Prince Albert at the table on the right hand of Her Majesty, the other Knights Companions took their respective places at the table; the Prelate standing on the right hand of the Sovereign, the Chancellor on the left hand, the Register, Garter, and Black Rod at the bottom of the table.

The Chancellor then signified to the Chapter Her Majesty's royal will and pleasure, that the vacant stall in the Royal Chapel of Saint George, at Windsor, be filled; and, as by the statutes none but a Knight can be elected, the Most Noble Henry Charles Duke of Norfolk was introduced by Garter and Black Rod, and knighted by Her Majesty with the sword of state; and his Grace, having kissed the Sovereign's hand, retired.

The Knights Companions then proceeded to the election, and the suffrages, having been collected by the Chancellor, were by him presented to the Sovereign, who commanded him to declare, and he accordingly did declare, that the Most Noble Henry Charles Duke of Norfolk had been duly elected a Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter.

Then, by the Sovereign's command, his Grace was received at the door of the Chapter-room by the Duke of Bedford and the Marquess of Hertford, the two junior Knights Companions present, and conducted between them to Her Majesty, preceded by Garter (bearing the ensigns of the Order upon a crimson velvet cushion), and by Black Rod. The Duke of Norfolk, kneeling near the Sovereign,

Garter, on his knee, presented the garter, and Her Majesty, assisted by His Royal Highness Prince Albert and the Duke of Wellington, the two senior Knights Companions present, buckled it on his Grace's left leg, the Chancellor pronouncing the usual admonition.

Garter next presented, in like manner, the ribband and George, and Her Majesty, assisted as before, put the same over his Grace's left shoulder, the Chancellor pronouncing the admonition. The Duke then again kissed Her Majesty's hand, and, having received the congratulations of each of the Knights Companions, retired.

The Chapter being ended, Garter, by Her Majesty's command, again called over the Knights Companions, who, with the Officers of the Order, retired from the presence of the Sovereign, with the usual reverences.

An Act for raising the sum of seventeen millions nine hundred and forty-six thousand five hundred pounds, by Exchequer Bills, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight.

An Act for the better security of the Crown and Government of the United Kingdom.

An Act for punishing mutiny and desertion, and for the better payment of the Army and their quarters.

An Act for the regulation of Her Majesty's Royal Marine Forces while on shore.

An Act for authorizing a borough police superannuation fund.

An Act to amend the Act of the present session to facilitate the completion of public works in Ireland.

An Act for amending the law for the leasing of mines in Ireland.
