Those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office, on *Monday* the 15th of May, *before twelve o'clock*, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's

command, that no presentation shall be made at the Levees, but in conformity with the above Regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

The State Apartments will not be open for the reception of company coming to Court, until half past one o'clock.

Notice is hereby given, that all persons, having Petitions or Addresses to present to Her Majesty at the Levee, are to write on two cards, with their names, a statement of the objects of such Petitions or Addresses, and the names of the persons from whom they come; one card to be delivered to the Page in the Ante-room, and the other to the Lord Chamberlain, who will read its contents, at the time of presentation, to Her Majesty; and, on these occasions, no other statement is to be addressed to Her Majesty.

A Deputation to present an Address is not to exceed four persons.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the

sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirteenth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for compensating certain spiritual persons whose emoluments have been diminished by reason of proceedings under the said Act.

"Whereas the said Act, together with the Acts therein recited, authorize the assigning at any time, and from time to time, to the incumbent of any church or chapel whose fees, dues or other emoluments shall be diminished by or in consequence of any proceeding under the provisions of the first-mentioned Act, of such an annual sum as shall, upon due inquiry, appear to be a just and reasonable compensation for such diminution:

"And whereas by certain duly gazetted Orders of your Majesty in Council for confirming certain schemes prepared by us, pursuant to the same Act, certain new parishes have been duly constituted, and the perpetual curates thereof respectively have become entitled to receive certain fees, dues and other emoluments arising therein, and we deem it just and reasonable, that compensation should be made to the incumbents of the churches or chapels hereinafter mentioned whose fees, dues or other emoluments have been diminished by or in consequence of such proceedings, and that the annual sums hereinafter mentioned should be assigned to such incumbents:

Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that, in respect of the new parishes mentioned in the first column of the schedule hereunto annexed, there shall be paid by us to the several parties mentioned in the second column of the same schedule, the annual sums mentioned in the third column thereof by way of such compensation as aforesaid, by equal half-yearly payments on the



first day of May and the first day of November in each year; and that the first payment in each case shall be made on the first day of May next, and shall be calculated from the day on which the said fees became by law receivable by the perpetual curates of such new parishes respectively.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, with an especial view to the better care of populous parishes, that arrangements may from time to time be made, by the authority therein provided, for improving the value or making better provision for the spiritual duties of ill-endowed parishes or districts by means of such alterations in the exercise of patronage as may be agreed upon by patrons, with the consent of the bishop :

"And whereas, under the authority of the said Act, we have from time to time prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council certain schemes, in which we have recommended and proposed that certain grants should be made in augmentation of the incomes of certain benefices and churches, in certain classes, and subject to certain limitations therein mentioned, which schemes have been ratified by Orders of your Majesty in Council, and such Orders have been duly gazetted :

"And whereas, on the sixth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, we found it necessary to suspend, until further notice, our recommendations of further grants, with certain specified exceptions :

"And whereas the benefice or church of Saint James the Less, Hambridge, in the said parish of Curry Rivell, is in the private patronage of Richard Thomas Combe, of Earnshill, in the county of Somerset, Esq. and the incumbent thereof had, prior to the said sixth day of August, received a specific promise from us that we would recommend the grant hereinafter proposed, upon

the said benefice or church being brought within the first of the classes above referred to, by being placed in public patronage :

"And whereas the said Richard Thomas Combe, in order to comply with such condition, is willing to transfer his right of patronage in such benefice or church in manner hereinafter mentioned :

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Honourable and Right Reverend Richard Bishop of Bath and Wells and of the said Richard Thomas Combe (testified by their having respectively signed and sealed this scheme) that the patronage of and right of nomination to the said benefice or church shall become and be transferred to, and absolutely vested in, the said Richard Bishop of Bath and Wells and his successors Bishops of Bath and Wells, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice or church, the fixed annual sum of sixty-four pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year, and that the first such half-yearly payment shall be made on the first day of May next.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act, or any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Bath and Wells.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for substituting a money payment to the Prebendary of Bartonsham, in the cathedral church of Hereford, for the property of his prebend.

"Whereas, by and under the provisions of the said Acts, the whole of the separate estates and endowments belonging to the said prebend will (excepting any right of patronage), upon the first avoidance hereof, become absolutely vested in us, for the purposes of the said Acts, and the chief of such purposes is that of making better provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required :

"And whereas it was by the same Acts enacted, that, by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement might, from time to time, be made, with the consent, in writing, under the hand of any prebendary of any cathedral church, for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments belonging to such prebendary, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes or other hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting in any case any lands, tithes or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes or other hereditaments :

"And whereas it has been agreed between us and the Reverend John Hopton, the present Prebendary of the said prebend of Bartonsham, that, with a view to sooner carrying into effect the purpose of the said Acts hereinbefore particularly mentioned, the following arrangement should be recommended by us to your Majesty in Council :

"We, therefore, with the consent of the said John Hopton, testified by his having signed this scheme, humbly recommend and propose that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and after the day of such gazetting, all lands, tithes and other hereditaments whatsoever (except any right of patronage), now belonging to the said John Hopton, or to or in which he has or ought to have any estate, right, title or interest as such Prebendary, shall, together with all such estate, right, title and interest therein (except as aforesaid), be and be held to be, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed by and from the said John Hopton, as such Prebendary, to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, subject only to any legally subsisting lease or leases thereof, or of any part or parts thereof; and that, in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance, there shall be paid by us to the said John Hopton, so long as he shall continue to be the Prebendary of the said prebend of Bartonsham, and no longer, the annual sum of one hundred and fifty-nine pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the seventeenth day of March and the

seventeenth day of September; and that the first such half-yearly payment shall be made on the seventeenth day of September next; provided that no renewal of any lease, nor any new lease, of the said lands, tithes or other hereditaments, or of any part thereof, shall, since the twenty-first day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, have been or shall be granted or made by the said John Hopton; and that if the next avoidance of the said prebend shall happen on any other day than one of the said two half-yearly days of payment, then a proportionate sum only shall be paid to the said John Hopton, or his representatives.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Hereford.

"for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for authorizing the sale of certain property formerly belonging to the prebend of Harlesdon, in the cathedral church of Saint Paul, London, and now vested in us.

"Whereas it is by the said Act (amongst other things) enacted, that notwithstanding the charge by that Act created (being a charge created in favour of the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne), all the same and the like powers and rights of ownership as are possessed and enjoyed respecting and over any lands, tenements or other hereditaments whatsoever, by any absolute owner thereof, shall be enjoyed by us with respect to and over all or any lands, tithes, rent charges, tenements and other hereditaments vested in us under certain Acts therein mentioned (being the Acts under which the property hereinafter described is vested in us), and may, subject to the provisions of the same Acts and of the now reciting Act, be exercised by us by proper instruments in writing duly executed according to law, with a certain proviso respecting the application of every sum of money received as the consideration or purchase money for the sale, transfer and conveyance by us of any of such lands, tithes, tenements or other hereditaments, or of any estate or interest therein; and with a further proviso, that none of such lands, tithes, tenements or other hereditaments be sold, transferred or conveyed except by the authority of a scheme and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council ratifying the same:

"And whereas all the separate estates and endowments formerly belonging to the said prebend of Harlesdon, comprising, among other estates, certain lands, tenements and hereditaments, situate in the parish of Willesden, in the county

of Middlesex, became vested in us on the vacancy of the said prebend, subject to the subsisting lease thereof :

"And whereas application has been made to us for the purchase of all our estate and interest in certain portions of the said lands, tenements and hereditaments, and after due consideration it appears to us to be expedient, that we should be empowered to dispose of our interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us to be advisable :

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that we may be authorized and empowered, by deed or deeds duly executed under our common seal, from time to time to sell and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said lands, tenements and hereditaments, situate in the said parish of Willesden, heretofore belonging to the said prebend of Harlesdon, with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title and interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his or their heirs or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall, upon due calculation and inquiry, appear to us to be just and reasonable.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council ; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act ; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

VISCOUNT PALMERSTON, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a dispatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Copenhagen, inclosing a note from Count Knuth, the Danish Minister for Foreign Affairs, dated the 8th instant, announcing that neither the Mouth of the Elbe, nor that of the Weser, nor any other port in the North Sea, will for the present be blockaded ; and also that the blockade of Pillau, Dantzig, Stralsund, Rostock, and Wismar, will cease on the 16th instant ; and further announcing, that Kiel, with the Mouth of the Canal of Schleswig at Holtenau, and Swinemünde, will remain blockaded, and that this blockade will be extended, from the 16th instant, to the three Mouths of the Oder, namely, those of Wolgast, of Swinemünde, and of Cammin.

A Chapter of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle having been summoned for this day, the following Knights Brethren, in their mantles and collars, assembled in the Palace, viz.

The Earl of Aberdeen, the Marquess of Ailesbury, the Marquess of Huntly, the Earl Brooke and Earl of Warwick, the Marquess of Breadalbane, and the Earl of Rosebery, attended by the under-mentioned Officers of the Order, in their mantles and wearing their chains and badges, viz. Sir John-Stewart Richardson, Bart. Secretary of the Order, and Frederic-Peel Round, Esq. Gentleman Usher of the Green Rod.

At one o'clock the Knights Brethren were called over by the Secretary, when (Her Majesty and His Royal Highness the Prince Albert having passed into the White Drawing-room) they proceeded, with the Officers of the Order, into the presence of the Sovereign.

The Sovereign being seated in the chair of state, and His Royal Highness the Prince Albert at the table on the right hand of the Queen, Her Majesty was pleased to command the other Knights Brethren to take their seats at the table, according to their seniority in the Order, the Officers of the Order standing in their places, at the bottom of the table.

The Sovereign was then pleased to signify Her royal pleasure touching the election of two Knights into the Order, whereupon the Knights Brethren proceeded to the election; and the suffrages, having been collected by the Secretary (commencing with the junior Knight), were by him, kneeling, presented to the Sovereign, who was pleased to declare, that James-Andrew Earl

of Dalhousie had been duly elected a Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle.

The Chapter then proceeded to a second election, and the suffrages having been collected as before, and presented to the Sovereign, Her Majesty was pleased to declare, that Robert Earl of Camperdown had been duly elected a Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle.

Then, by command of the Sovereign, the Earl of Camperdown was received at the door of the Chapter-room by the Marquess of Breadalbane and the Earl of Rosebery, the two junior Knights Brethren present, and conducted between them to Her Majesty, preceded by the Secretary (bearing on a crimson velvet cushion the ensigns of the Order), and by the Usher of the Green Rod.

The sword of state being thereupon delivered to the Sovereign by His Royal Highness the Prince Albert, the senior Knight, the Earl of Camperdown, kneeling near the Sovereign, was knighted therewith, after which his Lordship had the honour to kiss Her Majesty's hand; the Earl, rising, the oath was administered to his Lordship by the Secretary.

The Earl of Camperdown, then again kneeling, and the Secretary, on his knee, presenting to Her Majesty the ribband and jewel of the Order, the Queen was graciously pleased to place the same over the Earl's left shoulder.

His Lordship having again kissed the Sovereign's hand, and received the congratulations of the Knights Brethren, retired.

The Chapter being ended, the Knights Brethren were, by command of Her Majesty, again called over by the Secretary, and, with the Officers of the Order, retired from the presence of the Sovereign, with the usual reverences.
