ON Saturday the 27th day of May, Her Royal Highness Princess Sophia, Aunt to Her Most Gracious Majesty, departed this life, at Kensington-Palace, to the great grief of Her Majesty and of the Royal Family.

ORDERS for the Court's going into Mourning, on Thursday next the 1st of June, for Her late Royal Highness the Princess Sophia, Aunt to Her Majesty, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk, fringed or plain linen, white gloves, necklaces and ear-rings, black or white shoes, fans and tippets.

The Gentlemen to wear black, full trimmed, fringed or plain linen, black swords and buckles.

The Court to change the Mourning on Thursday the 15th of June next, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk or velvet, coloured ribbons, fans and tippets, or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuffs, with black ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black coats, and black than a ble or plain white, or white and gold, or white and uniforms.

silver stuff waistcoats, full trimmed, coloured swords and buckles.

And, on Thursday the 22d of June next, the Court to go out of Mourning.

The Earl Morshal's Order for a General Mourning for Her late Royal Highness the Princess Sophia.

IN pursuance of Her Majesty's commands, these are to give public notice, that upon the melancholy occasion of the death of Her late Royal Highness the Princess Sophia, Her Majesty's Aunt, it is expected that all persons do put themselves into decent mourning for ten days, to commence from Thursday next the 1st June.
