T is hereby notified, that Viscount Palmerston, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from Count Reventlow, the Danish Minister at Her Majesty's Court, a note, dated the 10th instant, of which the following is a translation:

(Translation.)

In conformity with the orders which he has received from his Government, the undersigned, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from His Majesty the King of Denmark, has the honour to notify to his Excellency the Viscount Palmerston, Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs of Her Majesty the Queen of Great Britain, that the Government of the King has decided to blockade, from the 15th of this month, the rivers Elbe, Weser, and Jahde, as well as the eastern entrance of the port of Stralsund, and of Greifswalde, and to solicit him to have the goodness to cause the usual notification thereof to be made.

The undersigned has been instructed to observe to his Excellency Viscount Palmerston, that neutral packet boats will be able freely to keep up the regular postal communications heretofore established, upon condition that they do not carry contraband of war.
