AT the Court at *Osborne-House, Isle of Wight*, the 25th day of *August* 1848,

PRESENT,

The **QUEEN's** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority vested in the said Commissioners under the Church Building Acts, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the eleventh day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Bisley, in the county of Gloucester, and within

the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Michael, situate at Bussage, in the said parish of Bisley, under and by virtue of the power or authority for this purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners by the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should be called, "The Chapelry District of Bussage," with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned :

"The chapelry district of Bussage is bounded on the north west and west by the parish of Stroud; on the south and south east by the Chalford district, as far as the north western corner of the Frith Wood; and on the east and north east by the remaining part of the parish of Bisley, from which it is separated by a line drawn

in a northerly direction, from the said north western corner of the Frith Wood, across Bisley Common to the footpath leading from the said common to Daniel's Farm; along which said footpath the boundary line then proceeds north westerly as far as the footpath leading from Todesmere to East-combe; and then proceeds north easterly, up the middle of the latter footpath, as far as Cuckoo-lane; and then proceeds north westerly, northerly, and again north westerly, up the middle of that lane, and crossing Bismere Bridge meets the boundary of the before-mentioned parish of Stroud, as such proposed chapelry district of Bussage is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink:

"And your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that it also appears to them to be expedient, that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed in the said church of Saint Michael, at Bussage; and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the incumbent or minister of such church for the time being:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend James Henry Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol (as the Bishop of the diocese) has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said James Henry Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising

therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol.

Newport, Abergavenny, and Hereford Railway.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Commissioners of Railways, by a warrant under their seal, bearing date the 24th day of August now last, and made in pursuance of an Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to give further time for making certain railways," have ordered and declared, that the period of time limited by the Newport, Abergavenny, and Hereford Railway Act, 1846, for the completion of the railway and branch railways described in the said warrant (that is to say), firstly, a railway, commencing by a junction or junctions with the Newport and Pontypool Railway, in the parish of Llanvrechva, otherwise Llanvrechva Upper, in the county of Monmouth, and passing through or near to the town of Abergavenny, in the county of Monmouth, and terminating at or near Widemarsh turnpike, in the parish of Saint John the Baptist, in the city of Hereford, or the liberties thereof; secondly, a branch railway, wholly situate in the parish of Panteague, in the county of Monmouth, commencing from and out of the hereinbefore-mentioned main line of railway, and terminating either by a junction or junctions with the Newport and Pontypool Railway, or by an independent terminus there; thirdly, a branch railway, commencing from and out of the said hereinbefore-mentioned main line of railway, in the parish of Mamhilad, in the said county of Monmouth, and terminating in the parish of Llangeview; fourthly, a branch railway, commencing from and out of the last-mentioned branch railway, in the parish of Llanbaddock, and terminating in the same parish, in the said county of Monmouth; fifthly, a branch railway, diverging from and out of the said hereinbefore-mentioned main line of railway, at or near to Penpergwm, in the parish of Langattock juxta Usk, in the said county of Monmouth, and terminating in the parish of Ragland, in the same county; sixthly, a branch railway, diverging from and out of the said hereinbefore-mentioned main line of railway, in the parish of Abergavenny, in the county of Mon-

mouth, and terminating at or near to certain buildings, known as the Gasworks, in the same parish; and seventhly, a branch railway, diverging from and out of the said hereinbefore-mentioned main line of railway, in the parish of All Saints, in the city of Hereford, and terminating at or near the Portfields, lying at Wide-marsh-street Without, situate in the same parish, shall (except in respect of so much or such part or parts thereof as is or are authorized to be abandoned under and by virtue of the Newport, Abergavenny, and Hereford Railway (Deviations) Act, 1847) be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said period so limited by the said Newport, Abergavenny, and Hereford Railway Act, 1846; and also that the period of time limited by the said Newport, Abergavenny, and Hereford Railway Act, 1846, for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purpose of constructing the hereinbefore-mentioned railway and branch railways, and the works connected therewith, shall (except in respect of so much or such part or parts thereof as is or are authorized to be abandoned as aforesaid) be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said last-mentioned period so limited by such Act; and also that the period of time limited by the Newport, Abergavenny, and Hereford Railway (Deviations) Act, 1847, for the completion of the new or substituted lines of railway and branch railways described in the said warrant (that is to say), a main line of railway, diverging from the original main line of the said Newport, Abergavenny, and Hereford Railway, at or near a certain field, in the hamlet of Hardwick and county of Monmouth, and numbered 9, in the said hamlet, on the plans referred to in the said Newport, Abergavenny, and Hereford Railway Act, 1846, and terminating at or near a certain road or bridge, in the parish of Llantillio Pertholey, in the same county, and numbered 55, in the said parish, on the same plans; another main line of railway, diverging from the original main line of the said Newport, Abergavenny, and Hereford Railway, at or near a certain field, in the parish of Walterstone and county of Hereford, and numbered 20, in the said parish of Walterstone, on the same plans, and terminating at or near a certain other field, in the parish of Kenderchurch, in the same county, and numbered 18, in such parish, on the same plans; another main line of railway, diverging from the original main line of the said Newport, Abergavenny, and Hereford Railway, at or near a certain field, in the parish of Saint Martin, within the liberties of the city of Hereford, and numbered 19, in the said parish of Saint Martin, on the same plans, and terminating by a junction with the Shrewsbury and Hereford Railway, near the Herefordshire and Gloucestershire Canal, in the parishes of Saint John the Baptist, All Saints, or of Holmer, all in the said city; and also (in lieu of the Gasworks Branch of the said railway as authorized by the said Newport, Abergavenny, and Hereford Railway Act, 1846) a branch railway, diverging from and out of the new or

substituted line of railway hereinbefore first described, at or near a certain field, in the parish of Abergavenny and county of Monmouth, numbered 128, in the same parish, on the same plans, and terminating at and by a junction with that part of the Llanvihangel Railway, in the said parish of Abergavenny, which lies between the Union workhouse, in the same parish, and the turnpike road leading between the town of Abergavenny and the town of Crickhowell; and also a branch railway, diverging from and out of the said new or substituted line of railway hereinbefore first described, at or near a certain field, in the parish of Abergavenny aforesaid, numbered 8, in such parish, on the plans referred to as aforesaid, and terminating at and by a junction with that part of the said Llanvihangel Railway which lies between the first toll-house from Abergavenny, on the new turnpike road leading from Abergavenny towards Hereford, and the turnpike road leading from Monk-street Toll-house, in the said town of Abergavenny, towards Maindiff-bridge, in the parish of Llantillio Pertholey, in the county of Monmouth, shall be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said period so limited by such Act; and also that the period of time limited by the said Newport, Abergavenny, and Hereford Railway (Deviations) Act, 1847, for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purpose of constructing the hereinbefore-mentioned new or substituted lines of railway and branch railways, shall be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said last-mentioned period so limited by such Act; subject nevertheless to all such savings, exceptions, and provisions whatsoever as are contained in the said Act of the present session of Parliament.—Dated this 25th day of August 1848.

of Merthyr Tydfil, in the county of Glamorgan, shall be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said period so limited by such Act; and also that the period of time limited by the same Act, for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purpose of constructing the hereinbefore-mentioned extension-railway, shall be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said last-mentioned period so limited by such Act; subject nevertheless to all such savings, exceptions, and provisions whatsoever as are contained in the said Act of the present session of Parliament.—Dated this 25th day of August 1848.
