PRESENT,

The **QUEEN's** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to regulate the cathedral churches of Wales," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain

"modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to regulate the cathedral churches of Wales," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making better provision for the cure of souls in the parish of *Llansaintffraid yn Mechan*, in the county of *Montgomery* and diocese of *Saint Asaph*, and the parish of *Llanyblodwell*, in the county of *Salop*, and said diocese of *Saint Asaph*, and in the parish of *Spaldwick*, in the county of *Huntingdon* and diocese of *Ely*.

"Whereas, under the authority of the said recited Acts, we have, from time to time, prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council certain schemes, in which we have recommended and proposed, that certain grants should be made in augmentation of the incomes of certain benefices and churches in certain classes, and subject to certain limitations therein mentioned, which schemes have been ratified by Orders of your Majesty in Council, and such Orders have been duly gazetted:

" And whereas, on the sixth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, we found it necessary to suspend, until further notice, our recommendations of further grants, with certain specified exceptions; and the grants hereinafter recommended fall within such exceptions :

" And whereas by reason of the vacancy of the sinecure rectory of Llansaintfraid yn Mechan, in the said county of Montgomery and diocese of Saint Asaph, and of the non-residentiary prebend of Sanctæ Crucis, in the cathedral church of Lincoln, all the lands, tithes and other hereditaments, formerly belonging to the same respectively, became and now are vested in us according to the provisions and for the purposes of the said first recited Act :

" And whereas parts of such lands, tithes and other hereditaments, including those described in the respective schedules hereto annexed, are situated within the limits of the respective parishes of Llansaintfraid yn Mechan, Llanyblodwell, and Spaldwick :

" We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that all our estate and interest in the lands and tenements, situate in the said parish of Llansaintfraid yn Mechan, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked A; and all our estate and interest in the tithe rent charge of the township of Abertanat, within the said parish of Llanyblodwell, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked B; and all our estate and interest in the lands and tenements, situate within the said parish of Spaldwick, and particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked C; shall forthwith, and without any assurance in the law other than this scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, be transferred to and become and be absolutely and for ever vested in the Reverend Robert Henry Matthews Hughes, Vicar of the said parish of Llansaintfraid yn Mechan, the Reverend Robert Williams, Perpetual Curate of the district of Rhydycroesan, in the parish of Llanyblodwell, and the Reverend John Saunders, Vicar of the said parish of Spaldwick, and their successors, respectively, Vicars of Llansaintfraid yn Mechan, Perpetual Curates of Rhydycroesan, and Vicars of Spaldwick.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other or further measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the several registries of the dioceses of Saint Asaph and Ely.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act for the more easy recovery of small debts and demands in England," it is, among other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that the said Act be put in force in such county or counties as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, shall seem fit, and to divide the whole or part of any such county (including all counties of cities and counties of

towns, cities, boroughs, towns, ports and places, liberties and franchises therein contained or thereunto adjoining) into districts; and to order that the County Court shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands, under the said Act, in each of such districts; and from time to time to alter such districts as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, shall seem fit; and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to declare by what name, and in what towns and places, the County Court shall be holden in each district:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by an Order in Council, of the ninth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, to order that the said Act be put in force in the counties and places therein specified, and the same was put in force accordingly:

And whereas it hath been represented, that it would be to the advantage of the public, if certain of the courts established by the said Order in Council were ordered to be held in more than one place within their several districts; and if certain alterations were made in some of the districts of the courts, as specified or set forth in the aforesaid Order:

And whereas by the said Act it is also enacted, that any Order in Council, made for the purposes of the said Act, shall be published in the London Gazette; and notice of the intention of Her Majesty to take into consideration the propriety of making any such Order shall be published in the London Gazette one calendar month at least before any such Order shall be made:

Notice is hereby given, that after the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the publication of this notice in the London Gazette, Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, will take into consideration the propriety of making the two following Orders for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say:

Order in Council, No. 1.

That from and after the thirty-first day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight:

"The County Court of Somersetshire, holden at Weston-super-Mare," shall be held at Axbridge, as well as at Weston-super-Mare.

"The County Court of Pembrokeshire, holden at Haverfordwest," shall be held at Fishguard, as well as at Haverfordwest.

"The County Court of Berkshire, holden at Reading," shall be held at Henley-on-Thames, in the county of Oxford, as well as at Reading.

"The County Court of Kent, holden at Greenwich," shall be held at Woolwich, as well as at Greenwich.

"The County Court of Kent, holden at Deal," shall be held at Sandwich, as well as at Deal.

The parishes of Great Coggleshall, Little Coggleshall, Fairstead, Faulkbourne, Great Leighs (including the hamlet of Chatley), Little Leighs, and Rivenhall, now in the district of the County Court of Essex, holden at Chelmsford, shall be in the district of the County Court of Essex, holden at Braintree.

The parishes of Alkborough, Roxby cum Risby, West Halton, Whitton, Winteringham, and Winterton, the chapelry of Gunhouse and hamlet of Coleby, now in the district of the County Court of Lincolnshire, holden at Glandferd Brigg, shall be in the district of the County Court of Lincolnshire, holden at Barton-on-Humber.

The parishes of Wedmore, Mark, Chapel Allerton, Weare, Badgworth, Biddisham, Clriston, Loxton, Compton-Bishop, Wincombe, Rowberrow, Shipham, Axbridge, Cheddar, and Nyland, now in the district of the County Court of Somersetshire, holden at Wells, shall be in the district of the County Court of Somersetshire, holden at Weston-super-Mare.

The parish of Wrington with Broadfield, now in the district of the County Court of Somersetshire, holden at Weston-super-Mare, shall be in the district of the County Court of Gloucestershire, holden at Bristol.

The parishes of East Bergholt, Higham, Holtou Saint Mary, Raydon, Shelley, Stratford Saint Mary, and Great Wenham, now in the district of the County Court of Suffolk, holden at Ipswich, and the parishes of Kettlebaston and Stoke by Nayland, now in the district of the County Court of Suffolk, holden at Sudbury, shall be in the district of the County Court of Suffolk, holden at Hadleigh.

Westminster, August 31, 1848.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for promoting the public health.

An Act for further continuing, until the first day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and to the end of the then next session of Parliament, certain temporary provisions concerning ecclesiastical jurisdiction in England.

An Act to continue to the twentieth day of July one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, and to the end of the then next session of Parliament, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches.

An Act to regulate the times of payment of rates and taxes by parliamentary electors.

An Act for further regulating the Money Order Department of the Post-office.

An Act for the further amendment of the administration of the criminal law.

An Act to confirm the incorporation of certain boroughs.

An Act for the further regulation of steam navigation, and for limiting in certain cases the number of passengers to be conveyed in steam vessels.

An Act to empower Commissioners of the Court of Bankruptcy to order the release of bankrupts from prison in certain cases.

An Act to continue to the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and to the end of the then next session of Parliament, an Act to amend the laws relating to loan societies.

An Act to amend the law for the formation of districts for the education of infant poor.

An Act to make provision for the payment of parish debts, the audit of parochial and union accounts, and the allowance of certain charges therein.

An Act to extend the provisions of an Act, passed in the first year of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for consolidating and amending the laws for facilitating the payment of debts out of real estate."

An Act to continue certain turnpike Acts for limited periods.

An Act to defray, until the first day of August one thousand eight hundred forty-nine, the charge of the pay, clothing, and contingent and other expences of the disembodied militia in Great Britain and Ireland; to grant allowances, in certain cases, to subaltern officers, adjutants, paymasters, quartermasters, surgeons, assistant surgeons, surgeons' mates, and serjeant majors of the militia; and to authorize the employment of the non-commissioned officers.

An Act to suspend, until the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, the making of lists and the ballots and enrolments of the militia of the United Kingdom.

An Act to amend the Acts for rendering effective the service of the Chelsea and Greenwich out-pensioners, and to extend them to the pensioners of the East India Company.

An Act for dispensing with the evidence of the proclamations on fines levied in the Court of Common Pleas at Westminster.

An Act to regulate certain offices in the Petty Bag in the High Court of Chancery, the practice of the Common Law side of that Court, and the Enrolment Office of the said Court.

An Act to authorize the application of part of the unclaimed money in the Court for the Relief of Insolvent Debtors, in enlarging the Court-house of the said Court.

An Act to continue to the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and to the end of the then next session of Parliament, the exemption of inhabitants from liability to be rated as such in respect of stock in trade or other property to the relief of the poor.

An Act to confirm the awards of Assessionable Manors Commissioners, and for other purposes relating to the duchies of Cornwall and Lancaster.

An Act to continue to the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and to the end of the then next session of Parliament, an Act for authorizing the application of highway rates to turnpike roads.

An Act to carry into effect the arrangements of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England for making better provision for the cure of souls in the parish of Wolverhampton, in the county of Stafford, and diocese of Lichfield.

An Act to continue, for two years, and to the end of the then next session of Parliament, and to amend an Act, of the second and third years of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to extend and render more effectual, for five years, an Act, passed in the fourth year of His late Majesty George the Fourth, to amend an Act, passed in fiftieth year of His Majesty George the Third, for preventing the administering and taking unlawful oaths in Ireland."

An Act to enable archbishops and bishops and other persons, in Ireland, to compromise suits touching their rights of patronage as to ecclesiastical benefices in certain cases.

An Act to empower lessees of tithe rent charge, in Ireland, to deduct a proportion of poor rate poundage from rent; and also to empower the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in Ireland, to allow sums paid for poor rate or county cess, or poundage deducted from ecclesiastical persons on account of poor rate, among the deductions from the valuation of ecclesiastical property directed to be made under an Act, of the third and fourth years of His late Majesty, for the purpose of a certain tax thereby imposed upon such property in Ireland.

An Act to amend the Acts relating to the constabulary force in Ireland, and to amend the provisions for the payment of special constables.

An Act to repeal so much of an Act of the Parliament of Ireland, of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of King George the Third, "for the more effectual punishing such persons as shall by violence obstruct the freedom of corn markets and the corn trade, and who shall be guilty of other offences therein mentioned, and for making satisfaction to the parties injured," as relates to the making of satisfaction to the parties injured; and to substitute other provisions in lieu thereof; and to repeal the provisions of the Acts which give remedies against any hundreds or baronies, in Ireland, in respect of robbery.

An Act for the protection and improvement of the salmon trout and other inland fisheries of Ireland.

An Act for extending to Ireland an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for better securing trust funds, and for the relief of trustees."

An Act to continue, until the thirty-first day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, certain Acts for regulating turnpike roads in Ireland.

An Act to facilitate and simplify procedure in the Court of Justiciary in Scotland.

An Act to authorize the Lords of Council and Session to regulate the rates or dues of registration to be charged by the keepers of the registers of sasines, reversions, &c. in Scotland.

An Act for the establishment of the Farmers' Estate Society, Ireland.

An Act to enable the Dundee and Perth Railway Company to take a lease of the undertaking of the Dundee and Arbroath Railway Company, and to amend the Acts relating to such companies respectively.

An Act for making a railway from Paisley to Barrhead with certain branch railways therewith connected, to be called "the Paisley, Barrhead, and Hurler Railway."

An Act to make a deviation in the authorized line of the Manchester, Buxton, Matlock, and Midlands Junction Railway, together with a branch to Bakewell.

An Act to amend the Acts relating to the Exeter and Exmouth Railway Company.

An Act to enable the Great Western Railway Company to construct a loop line from the Birmingham and Oxford Junction Railway through the town of Leamington, and for other purposes.

An Act to confer additional powers on the Great Western Railway Company with reference to an agreement, of the twelfth of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, for the purchase by them of the Birmingham and Oxford Junction, and Birmingham, Wolverhampton, and Dudley Railways.

An Act to enable the Edinburgh and Glasgow Railway Company to hold shares in the Edinburgh and Bathgate Railway Company, and for other purposes.

An Act for the more effectually paving, lighting, watching, draining, cleansing, and otherwise improving the town and neighbourhood of Walsall, in the county of Stafford; for improving the markets, and for the better assessing the poor's rates, highway rates, church rates, and other local rates, within the parish of Walsall, in the said county.
