THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with cer-"tain modifications, the fourth report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Re-"venues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "for enabling ecclesiastical corporations, aggre-"gate and sole, to grant leases for long terms of "years," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirty-first day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to carry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ec-"clesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act for enabling eccle-" siastical corporations, aggregate and sole, to "grant leases for long terms of years," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for determining the portion of the improved value to be made payable to us in a certain mining lease about to be granted by the Perpetual Curate of Trinity Chapel, Leeds, in the county of York.

"Whereas by the last-recited Act it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole (excepting as therein is excepted, which exception does not include the case of a perpetual curate), from time

to time, with the consent or consents thereby required, to grant or demise by lease, for any term not exceeding sixty years, any mines, minerals, quarries or beds belonging to such corporation, together with the right of working or of opening and working the same; and that every such lease shall contain such reservations, by way of rent, royalty or share of the produce in kind, and also such powers, provisoes, restrictions and -covenants as shall be approved by us; and that such portion of the improved value accruing under such lease, as by the authority provided in the first-recited Act shall be determined, not being more than three fourth parts, nor less than one moiety of such improved value, shall forthwith, and from time to time as the same shall accrue, be paid to us, and shall be subject to the provisions relating to monies payable to us:

"And whereas, in pursuance of the powers contained in the said recited Act, it is proposed by the Reverend Thomas Nunns, as the Perpetual Curate of Trinity Chapel, Leeds aforesaid, with the consents required by the same Acts, to grant and demise by lease certain mines, with the produce thereof, in and under certain lands, being part and parcel of the glebe lands of the perpetual curacy of Trinity Chapel, Leeds aforesaid, and situate at Newton, in the parish of Wakefield, in the said county of York:

"And whereas the improved value to accrue under the lease so proposed to be granted as aforesaid will be the whole net amount of the rents, royalties or other reservations which will become payable thereunder:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that three fourth parts of the whole net amount of the reservation or reservations to be made in the said lease so to be granted, whether consisting of rent, royalty or otherwise, shall by such lease be made directly payable to us; and that we shall have all the like remedies in respect of such three fourth parts of any such reservation as aforesaid, as if the same were a separate rent reserved to us as lessors or grantors and reversioners of the premises comprised in such lease, independently of the rights and re-

medies of the said Thomas Nunns and his successors, perpetual curates as aforesaid, in respect of the remaining one fourth part thereof, without any priority or preference between us and the perpetual curate of Trinity Chapel, Leeds aforesaid, for the time being; and further, that we shall have full benefit and advantage, either jointly with or separately from the said Thomas Nunns and his successors in the said perpetual curacy, of all or any of the covenants, conditions and agreements in the said lease contained on the lessee's part, in like manner as if we had been grantors, lessors and reversioners as aforesaid, and as in such lease shall be expressed; and that, for effectuating such objects, the said lease shall and may be framed in such manner and contain all such clauses and provisions as we shall approve, and shall have full force accordingly, any rule of law, statute or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been duly given, in accordance with the provisions of the first-recited Act, and certain objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has, notwithstanding such objections, which have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with the said scheme, been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to carry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of " Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to explain and amend " two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical " Commissioners for England," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for substituting a money payment to the Canon of Dunham, in the collegiate church of Southwell, for certain property belonging to him as such Canon.

"Whereas it is by the first herein-recited Act enacted, that, subject to the provisions therein contained, all the estate and interest which the holder of any canonry not suspended by or under the provisions of the same Act, and his successors, had and would have in any lands, tithes and other hereditaments or endowments whatsoever annexed or belonging to or usually held or enjoyed with such canonry (except any right of patronage), or whereof the rents and profits had been usually taken and enjoyed by the holder of such canonry, as such holder separately

and in addition to his share of the corporate revenues of such chapter, shall, upon the vacancy of such canonry, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than the provisions of the same Act, accrue to and be absolutely vested in us and our successors, for the purposes of the same Act, and the chief of such purposes is that of making better provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required:

"And whereas it is by the said Acts enacted, that by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement may from time to time be made, with the consent in writing under the hand of any canon of any cathedral or collegiate church, for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments belonging to such canonry, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes or hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting in any case any lands, tithes or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes or other hereditaments:

"And whereas it has been agreed between us and the Reverend Thomas Cozens Percival, the present Canon of Dunham aforesaid, in the said collegiate church of Southwell, that, with a view to the sooner carrying into effect the purpose of the said Acts hereinbefore particularly mentioned, the following arrangement should be recommended by us to your Majesty in Council:

"We, therefore, with the consent of the said Thomas Cozens Percival, testified by his having signed this scheme, humbly recommend and without any conveyance propose, that, assurance in the law other than this scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and after the day of such gazetting, all the lands, tithes and other hereditaments (except the tithes of the parish of Morton, and any right of patronage) now belonging to or forming part of the endowment of the said canonry, or to or in which he the said Thomas Cozens Percival as such Canon has or ought to have any estate, right, title or interest, separately and in addition to his share in the corporate revenues of the chapter of the said collegiate church of Southwell, shall, together with all such estate, right, title and interest therein,

be and be held to be, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed by and from the said Thomas Cozens Percival to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, subject only to any legally subsisting lease or leases thereof; and that, in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance as aforesaid, there shall be paid by us to the said Thomas Cozens Percival, on the tenth day next after the day of the gazetting of such Order of your Majesty in Council, the sum of one hundred pounds sterling, and also thereafter in each and every year, so long as he shall continue to hold the said canonry, and no longer, the annual sum of one hundred pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of January and the first day of July, and that the first such half-yearly payment shall be made on the first day of January next; provided that no renewal of any lease, nor any new lease, of any part of such lands, tithes and other hereditaments as aforesaid shall, since the twenty-seventh day of October one thousand eight hundred and seven, have been or shall be granted by the said Thomas Cozens Percival, and that, if the next avoidance of the said canonry shall happen on any other day than one of such two half-yearly days of payment, then a proportionate sum only shall be paid to the said Thomas Cozens Percival, or his representative or representatives.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas it is by the said recited Act enacted, that for the purpose of carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement may, from time to time, be made, with the consent in writing, under the corporate seal of any bishop, for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments belonging to the see of such bishop; and the said last-recited enactment is, by the said secondly-recited Act, made applicable to all the purposes thereof, one of which purposes is the permanent benefit of any see:

"And whereas the Bishop of Lichfield is, in right of his see, lord of the manor of Eccleshall, in the county of Stafford, and as such lord is seised in fee of and in various lands, tenements and hereditaments, now let in small portions and at small rents, which are collected with much difficulty and at an expence disproportionate to their amount, and it has been represented to us, that the respective occupiers of the said lands, tenements and hereditaments are willing to purchase the same upon terms conducive to the permanent benefit of the see:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent, in writing, of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Lichfield, testified under his corporate seal, hereunto annexed, that he the said bishop, and his successors bishops of Lichfield, shall be authorized, from time to time, with our consent, testified under our common seal, to sell and duly to convey to such persons, and for such prices, respectively, as shall be approved by us, all or any of the lands, tenements and hereditaments aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose, that the purchase moneys to be received on all such sales shall be paid to us, in trust, for the said Bishop of Lichfield and his successors, and shall be, from time to time, invested for the permanent benefit of the see, in such real or government securities as may be agreed upon between us and the Bishop of Lichfield for the time being.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral "churches of Wales," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirty-first day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches "of Wales," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making provision for the Minister of the metropolitan Welsh church, situated in Elyplace, in the diocese of London.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that out of the proceeds of any lands, tithes, tenements or other hereditaments in the principality of Wales, vested or to be vested in us by or under the provisions of the said Act, or of the Acts therein recited, it shall be lawful, by the authority therein mentioned, to make provision, in whole or in part, for the competent maintenance of any spiritual person or persons (being a native or natives of the principality aforesaid) who may be licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the time being to officiate in any church or chapel within London or Westminster, or the suburbs thereof. duly consecrated for the performance of divine service, according to the rites and ceremonies of the United Church of England and Ireland, in the Welsh language:

"And whereas, in pursuance of the provisions contained in the hereinbefore recited Act, the Reverend Ebenezer Edwards, being a native of the principality of Wales, has been duly licensed by the bishop of the said diocese to officiate, in

the Welsh language, in the said metropolitan! Welsh church, which said church has been duly consecrated; and it appears to us to be fit and proper, that provision should be forthwith made for the more competent maintenance of the said Ebenezer Edwards, and for succeeding ministers, licensed in the same manner:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each the said Ebenezer and every year, to Edwards, so long as he shall remain so duly licensed, and shall so officiate in the said church, and also to every such one succeeding minister as shall, in like manner, be licensed and officiate in the same church, the annual sum of two hundred and fifty pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such half-yearly payment shall be made on the first day of November next; and that whenever a vacancy in the ministry of the same church shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the then next half-yearly payment shall be duly apportioned and paid between and to the minister making the vacancy or his representatives, and the next succeeding minister of the same church.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.
