At the Council-Chamber, *Whitehall*, the 28th day of *September* 1848,

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable
Privy Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to renew and amend an Act of the tenth year of Her present Majesty, for the more speedy removal of certain nuisances, and the prevention of contagious and epidemic diseases," after reciting, that it is expedient that when any part of the United Kingdom shall appear to be threatened with or affected by any formidable epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, measures of precaution should be taken with promptitude, according to the exigency of the case, it is enacted, that, in Great Britain, the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, or any three or more of them (the Lord President of the Council, or one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, being one), may, by Order or Orders, to be by them from time to time made, direct, that the provisions in the said Act contained for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases be put in force in Great Britain, or in such parts thereof, or in such places therein respectively, as in such Order

or Orders respectively may be expressed, and may, from time to time, as to all or any of the parts or places to which any such Order or Orders may extend, and in like manner, revoke or renew any such Order, and subject to revocation and renewal as aforesaid, every such Order shall be in force for six calendar months, or for such shorter period as in such Order shall be expressed:

And whereas the United Kingdom appears to be threatened with a formidable epidemic disease, in consequence of the progressive advance of such a disease to the western portion of the Continent of Europe, and a case has arisen for putting in force the provisions of the said Act:

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered by the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council (of whom the Right Honourable Viscount Palmerston, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is one), in pursuance and exercise of the powers so vested in them as aforesaid, that the provisions contained in the said hereinbefore-recited Act, for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases, be put in force throughout the whole of Great Britain, immediately from and after the date of this Order.

And it is further ordered, that this Order shall continue in force for six calendar months, from and after the date hereof.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next sessions, for an Act for making the parish of Richmond, in the county of Surrey, a distinct vicarage for ecclesiastical purposes, by dividing the present vicarage of Kingston-upon-Thames and Sheen otherwise Richmond, into two separate vicarages, and for providing a stipend for the vicar of Richmond for the time being, out of the rents heretofore accustomed to be paid for all pews and sittings in pews in the parish church of Richmond, and otherwise, and for confirming such accustomed rents, and giving powers for altering the said rents from time to time, and remedies for the recovery thereof; and to enable the vestrymen of the said parish of Richmond to purchase, by contract, a residence for such vicar, or a site for such residence, and to build a residence thereon, and for that purpose to enable the said vestrymen to raise money by a rate or rates, for a limited period, on all property in the said parish of Richmond liable to be rated to the poor rate in the said parish; and also to empower the said vestrymen to give a piece of ground (part of the lands vested in them for parochial purposes) as a site for such residence as aforesaid, and for extinguishing all vicarial tithes (if any) in the said parish of Richmond; and for other purposes relating to such distinct vicarage of Richmond.—2d October 1848.

MARINE BARRACK CANTEEN AT WOOLWICH.

Department of the Comptroller for Victualling and Transport Services, Somerset-Place, September 26, 1848.

NOTICE is hereby given, that, on Thursday the 19th October next, at one o'clock, the Canteen in the above Barrack will be let, from the 1st of November next, to the 1st January 1850, by order of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

No person but of unexceptionable character, or who will not undertake, *bonâ fide*, to reside in or occupy the Canteen, and conduct the business thereof in his own person, will be approved; and two sureties will be required for the regular payment of the rent, and of all sums which may become due in respect of the said Canteen, and for the due performance of the several conditions and stipulations of the indenture of lease. The Revenue or other licences to be paid by the tenant.

The person whose proposal shall be accepted and his sureties must execute an indenture of lease and covenants relating thereto, the particulars whereof may be known by applying to this Office, or to the Barrack-Master at Woolwich.

The Christian and surnames of two respectable persons, with their professions and places of abode, who will join the tenant in executing the indenture of lease as his sureties, must be inserted in the proposals. The tenant is to pay half the value of the stamps on the indenture of lease upon executing the same; and it is to be understood, that the said Commissioners will not undertake to procure the tenant a licence.

A printed form of the tender and conditions may be had at this Office, or on application to the said Barrack-Master. No tender will be received after one o'clock on the day of treaty, nor any noticed unless the party attends, or an agent for him duly authorized in writing.

Every tender must be addressed to the Secretary of the Admiralty, and bear in the left hand corner the words, "Tender for Marine Barrack Canteen," and must also be delivered at the Office of the Comptroller for Victualling and Transport Services, at Somerset-place.

By the Mutiny Act Canteens are not liable to have troops billeted on them.

As the person becoming tenant of the Canteen will be bound to the strict performance of the covenants of the indenture of lease, and to the full payment of the rent and privilege of sale to the troops, without any remission or reduction under any circumstances whatever, he is hereby cautioned to make himself fully acquainted with the conditions of letting, prior to his making a proposal.

The rent of the Canteen as a tenement or dwelling is to be proposed at the sum stated below, therefore the biddings will be upon what is offered for every ten men per month, exclusive of serjeants, occupying the barrack, the number being ascertained from the Barrack-Master's Returns, made up at twelve o'clock at noon on the first day of every month, and no changes in the occupation of the barrack which may take place in the progress of the month, either for or against the tenant, will be taken into account. No less number than ten will be charged against the tenant, nor will any odd number be calculated; thus, if the barrack should be occupied by 148 men on the first day of the month, only 140 will be calculated for that month. The bidders are also desired to introduce no fractional parts of a penny in their offers, as they will not be noticed, nor will any tenders be noticed except such as are strictly according to the form furnished.
